Minutes of Last Regular Meeting - June 22, 2011. Motion: to Accept as written - Moved by Lion Gord & seconded by Lion Ed. Carried

Business from the Minutes - no carry forward business from last regular meeting

**Business from last director's meetings**: Copies of approved minutes from the July & Aug directors meetings were placed on each table for review. Consensus was that they did not need to be read. No questions. Sept minutes will be distributed after approved at Directors meeting Oct 5<sup>th</sup>.

#### **Business from Directors meetings.**

1.Clarington Leisure fair – Thursday Sept 22, 6:00 – 9:00 p.m. Garnet Rickard Complex. Our club to participate to promote Dog Walk. To have booth next to Running Maniacs requested. Lion Tom B to attend, Lion Anna & Lion Jen volunteered to help. 2. The estate of the Late Lion Gord Jilks. Lion President Jean noted that our club had been named as a beneficiary a life insurance policy and that Lion Ken would provide details in his financial report.

#### New Business -

1.Presentation of the Budget. Lion Treasurer Ken presented the budget as drafted after meeting with the finance committee including Lion Art Chair of the Youth committee. He discussed the bolded areas denoted changes and the rational in reaching the numbers. He did note that there was an increase in the request for Youth exchange from \$150 - \$275. Lion Art to review. Lion Marilyn noted that there may be a special request from Clark High School for the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary and recommended we consider runner a congratulatory add in the program. Lion Ken discussed changes to the Expense side, highlighting the \$1,000 for memorial forest maintenance to begin a cushion to build the account to maintain the property (\$2,000 this year for grass cutting) in the future. He also noted a \$5,000 donation to the horticulture society to support their project and need to raise \$75,000 as part of their \$122,000 Trillium grant. Other new donations, Samaritan's Purse \$300.00, No Child Without \$2,500.00 and Liability Insurance club & director's \$2,154.76. Bank Charges were also discussed with Lion John Bugelli recommending that we consider Manulife bank who offered interest and no fees. He said he could get us an application. Lion Ed did note that CIBC had been very good to club for many years waiving fees while other charities and institutions did pay service charges. Lion Ken thanked both for input and Lion Tom has noted as a topic for director's next meeting. On the income side Lion Ken did note the rain barrel project has raised \$2145.00 to date. Lion John did ask about the portion of the money market \$8,500 on the income side of the ledger. He noted that these funds may not be needed as the result of the funds coming tom the estate of Gord Jilks. Lion Ken noted he preferred to leave in to balance the budget. **Spaghetti Dinner.** Lion Ken noted that this is a new potential project and has budgeted \$2,000 as a profit. It was noted that that we should present idea to the club to ensure support. Lion Gus to chair – potentially March.

Motion: Moved by Lion Masood and seconded by Lion Bill that we proceed with the March fundraiser as a Spaghetti dinner. Carried. Lion Ed noted that Ken had presented a good report and questioned why we could not simply approve at this meeting noting we were having guests at our next meeting.

Notice of Motion: Moved by Lion Padre David seconded by Lion Ed that the budget be presented for approval at our next regular meeting (Wed. Sep 28<sup>th</sup>) without further question or discussion. Carried

2. Tail twister: Lion President Jean announced that Lion Norm was resigning as Tail twister.

Motion: Moved by Lion Dave Gibson, seconded by Lion George that Lion Heather be nominated to replace Lion Norn as Tail twister. After Lion Heather accepted the motion was carried

2.Motion on approval process of motions. Moved by Lion Dave Rickard seconded by Lion Heather that in future motions be accepted or declined not only by voice of yah or nay but simultaneously by show of hands. Carried.

#### Reports:

Dog Guides: Lion President Jean circulated list asking for volunteers for the walk & BBQ. 2 lists. She will provide a schedule by our next meeting. It was noted that last year our Club's walk raised \$21,500 and was 5<sup>th</sup>, which was excellent noting some of the clubs ahead of us were multiple club efforts. All are members were thanked for their volunteer support. Lion Pres. Jean announced road signs were at top of stairs. Members to take some (highlighting 1<sup>st</sup> sat in Oct. and place on their lawns and surrounding town property. Signs must be taken down after the walk. On Monday Sept 26<sup>th</sup> there will be a second set of signs to put out and Lion Tom B will co-ordinate. Thanks to all who took signs. Lion Pres. Jean advised that Lions' Ed, Murray, heather & she had pledge sheets

-Financial: Lion Ken: Lion Ken reviewed bank balances as at Sept 7 – Admin \$6,119.26/ Activity

\$ 10,639.88. He also noted that the amount received from the life insurance policy from Lion Gord Jilks was \$56,798.20. Lion Dwight had prepared options for investment which would be discussed at Oct 5<sup>th</sup> director's meeting. Lion John also advised that he was one of the executors of the estate and that there would also funds from the estate. Lion Marilyn advised new Lions that Lion Gord Jilks was often standing at the door at 5:45p.m. eager to attend our meeting. Lions and our club was his passion and his generosity was "from the heart" Lion Ken advised Chairs of Committees that if they had expenses and had cash they should pay from the cash and receipt with a report to him. This would save on services charges for writing small cheques.

-Bar Committee; Lion Tom advised 1 bar Sept 10 – Lamondin retirement. About \$120 guests. He was assisted by his daughter Sara who had smart serve. Pictures and new article were distributed. He is looking for donation – on Director's agenda
