ed for a couple of years so it was not possible to work on cars, but I was still often trading cars to get ahead. First new car I bought was a 69 Dart Swinger 340 4 speed @ age 19. That car gave me a lot off problems and I didn't like the payments much. I traded it for a paid for VW. A co worker of mine blew up the motor in his and did not have the funds to fix it. We made a deal and was now the owner of a 66 GTO with no motor (no problem) .That was traded for a 69 Chev Impala conv. Great

car .Had it fixed up a bit and drove it for a time until a truck hit it head on while on holidays. We went thru a couple of great cars until I got my 73 Riviera. During those early years after we had our own home I was on the look out for a deal to flip. Not a lot of money but usually made a profit. When we moved to Trenton I got my first true collector car 1957 Chev 2 dr ht .I stripped it down and had it painted re covered the interior and re chromed the bumpers. Then I got a second , a 65 Malibu conv. Needed cosmetic work , paint etc. Decided to try painting it myself. It worked out OK . I decided to re paint my 57 back to original colour .That turned out OK. Friends liked my work and gave me more practice. To keep the neighbours happy a did a few more. I eventually stared doing some cars for a local dealer. The money I made from this helped me finance the purchase of more and better cars to do for myself and also to get funds to build a new house. My best car was probably my 69 GTO conv. I sold it to help purchase my lot in Stirling. I now have 3 collector type cars The latest I just finished is a 72 Riviera similar to the 73 I first bought in 1975. It has taken me about 5 years



and \$\$ to take this right down and redo. I am now able to take these cars around the area car shows and have the time to work on them at my own pace. Still always looking for a deal.

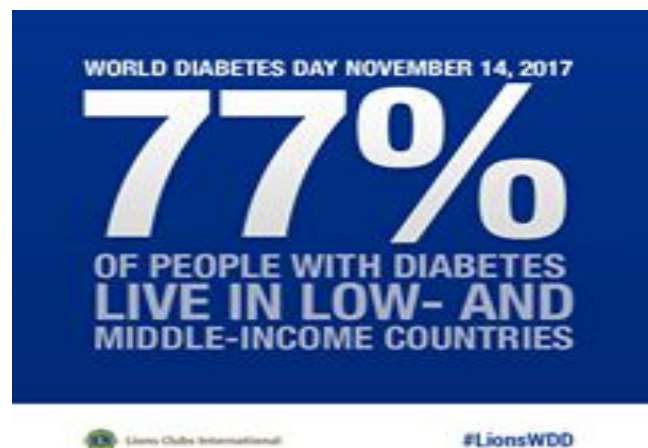

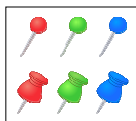

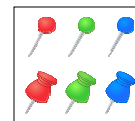
