This is my first report to cabinet for the current Lions year.

Grant Chair is a new position for the District A3 Lions. I have been spending my time to date reviewing the abundance of material available at the Lions International website.

Grants break down into two types. Grants from Lions International to support Membership and Leadership Development and grants available through LCIF to support service in the primary service areas.

All the grants are primarily directed the Districts or Multiple Districts.

All the elements needed to develop a project and apply for a grant are available at the website. No matter what type of grant there are Frequently Asked Questions, templates and forms and videos to help inform the process.

All grants have clear criteria as to what is eligible for a grant of a certain type and the dates when applications can be submitted.

Many of the grants are competitive, meaning that many applications are expected and the successful ones will be judged on completeness, timing and achievement of the goals Lions International has set.

Besides the application process there are often requirements for various submissions during the project.

Specified information and forms are required after the completion of the project within certain time frames. This means that thorough record keeping is required during the project.

One conclusion I am starting to formulate is that preparation of the project well before the time for application submission is required to ensure both a successful application and a successful project.

As I work through this I hope to create more of a breakdown of the grants the District should be targeting as well as a mock up for a grant as an example of what is required to prepare for the application process.
