

# HO HO HO ... Canada Grows A Lot of Christmas Trees

Did you know our country had 1,872 Christmas tree farms in 2016?

According to the 2016 Census of Agriculture, the farms were concentrated in British Columbia, Ontario, Quebec, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick. If you can't spend Christmas in Canada, you might as well take a little piece of the country with you. In 2017, Canada exported over two million Christmas trees to over 20 countries, including Barbados, France, Jamaica and Thailand.
