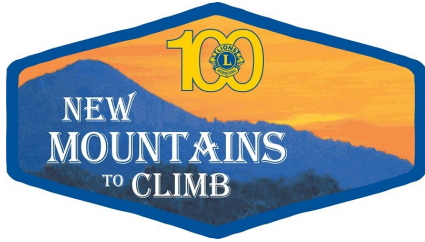

Colborne & District Lions Deliver “Buddy Benches” to Cramahe Schools

The “friendship” benches were delivered to both Colborne Public School and Northumberland Hills Public School just before the Christmas break.



Recess as a child is often the best part of the school day, but for others students, it can be a tough time. The concept behind the “Buddy Bench” is a simple project that’s growing in popularity in school yards everywhere. The **buddy bench** is a simple idea to eliminate loneliness and foster friendship on the playground.

The project is called the “buddy bench” because, other than the vibrant colours, it’s an ordinary bench placed in the schoolyard.

The idea is that kids who are looking for playmates can sit on the bench to signal they would like someone to come ask them to play by sitting on the bench. The benches commissioned by the Colborne & District Lion Club were fabricated by students at **East Northumberland Secondary School**.

The buddy bench idea has been around for some time in Europe and recently exploded in popularity in the Canada and the US.

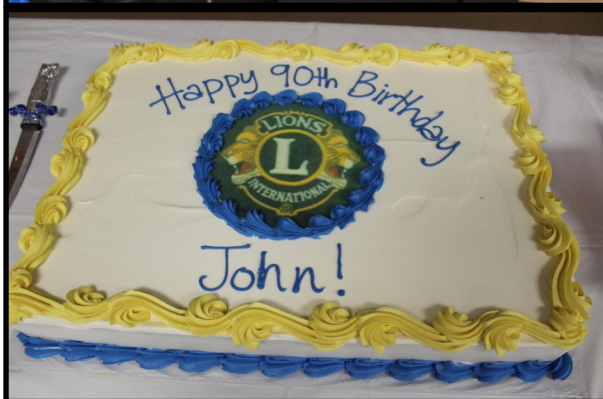

Over the last several years the Lions Quest school program has been totally rewritten and updated to address some of the issues that students were not facing when we started to provide the programs for Educators in our District. Kids are still kids but they face many challenges with regard to social media, bullying and internet decisions that were not around when the first Lions Quest workshops were given.

Students still need to learn positive decision making skills and attitudes and how to build positive relationships with peers and adults. Social and Emotional competencies are the keys to helping young people grow up to become well adjusted adults and contributing members of society.

MD'A' Council of Governors is Seeking a Secretary

Multiple District 'A' Council Secretary John Stewart will officially be concluding his five-year term as the MD'A' Secretary on June 30, 2017. The Council of Governors has authorized the Administration Committee to seek a replacement MD'A' Secretary. The term of office is from July 1, 2017 until June 30, 2022, subject to annual reviews. The position is a home based operation.

A summary of the position requirements and Secretarial duties are as follows:

Expected Key Results

- Receive and send correspondence on behalf of Council
- Attend Council and other meetings as requested by Council, the Council Chair & MD'A' Committees.
- Keep accurate minutes of all Council Meetings
- Assist the Governors' Council in conducting the business of MD'A', and perform such duties as are required by the LCI & MD'A' Constitution & By-Laws, as well as those that may be assigned by the Governors' Council from time to time.
- Assist the MD'A' Convention Advisory Committee with the planning of the MD'A' Convention
- Maintain databases and the MD'A' Directory
- Maintain a 'Motion Book' for the benefit of the Governors' Council
- Provide regular updates to the MD'A' Web Master and LION Magazine Editor
- Provide for updated hard copies of essential documents to the Governors' Council and MD'A' Committees

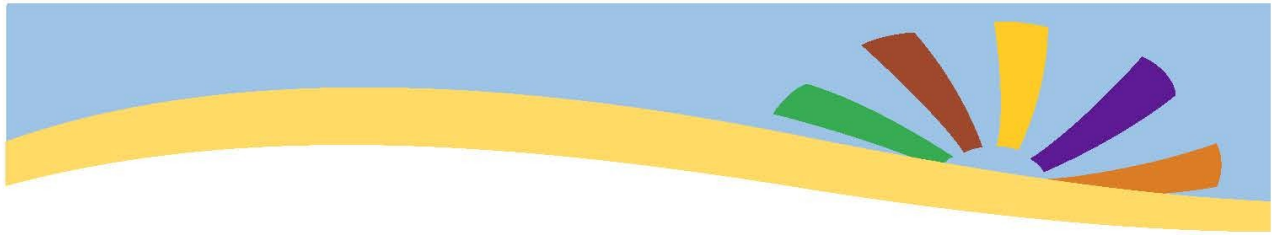
