Governor Frank, Vice District Governors, Region and Zone chairs, committee members and guests.

This is my third report to cabinet for the Lions Year 2023-24 as the District Constitution and By-Laws chair.

Constitution and By-LAWS (C&BL)

I had reported at the September meeting on the changes to the C&BL effective 4 Sep 2023 and provided a copy of the amended document with my report. None of the changes required a vote at the Convention as they were made in accordance with Article IX Section 2. With acceptance of that draft version Iat the September meeting I now provided the latest version dated 16 September 2023. I noticed this week that the C&BL available on the A3 E-Clubhouse site has not been changed and still shows the version from 2021. I would ask that this latest version be uploaded to the website to replace the previous version.

I had mentioned the change for Club C&BL with the addition of the "Discounted Member" category. This change became effective 1 Jan 2024 and only affects the calculation of Club Delegates for Convention with "Discounted members" not included in those calculations.

DISCOUNTED MEMBER: A member of this club who pays discounted dues as a result of their family membership status, student status or participation in any other discounted membership program offered by the association who desires to retain membership in this club and meets the qualifications for discounted dues. The membership status shall be verified by the board of directors of this club. A Discounted Member shall have all rights of an Active Member but shall not be included in the club delegate formula calculation.

Discounted members are eligible to vote as Club delegates at convention.

Policy and Procedures Manual

Work continues on review of the District Policy and Procedures manual, Committee Job Descriptions and the Convention Procedures manual. I would like to propose the following changes t the Policy manual;

<u>Policy 2.0</u> District Financial Policy para 3 which deals with the District Governor Expenses – International Convention (C&BL Article X Section 1)

Current version;

Ref B section 1 applies to District Governors International Convention expenses, the cabinet and budget committee shall determine the budgeted amount. (Currently \$1000.00)

Proposal

Ref B section 1 applies to District Governors International Convention expenses, the cabinet and budget committee shall determine the budgeted amount. (Currently \$1000.00)

This is intended to assist District Governor Elect (DGE) with his/her spouse's attendance to the convention at which he/she will be installed as District Governor.

This expense may also be claimed by the sitting District Governor (DG) to attend the convention held at the end of his/her year as DG. He/she shall indicate their intentions to attend this convention prior to or at the budget meeting so that the appropriate amount is included in the annual budget.

Reason

There has been some discrepancy over the past few years of who is actually entitled to compensation under the By-Law article. This proposal clarifies who exactly can claim this expense. It should be noted that the DGE's expenses are covered by LCI and his/her spouse is entitled to \$500 USD if the district has 1250 or more members. The DG has no LCI expense coverage for attendance at the International convention.

Include an incorrect reference to the MDA Constitution and By-Laws .

- 12. All reimbursement of expenses shall be as per the MD "A" Policy and Procedures Manual, Rules of Audit

Policy 4.0 New Club Regalia

Reference to the "Queen" should be changed to read "King" with respect to obtaining portraits.

Policy 5.0 Wearing of White Jackets and Formal Cabinet Dress.

Renumber paras to 1 and 2 to conform with remaining policies.

Add additional comment to para 1. Sub para 5 to read; "Charter Anniversaries in multiples of 5 years where formal attire is requested by the Club."

Policy 6.0

Remove reference to Section 1 from reference.

Policy 10.0

Sub Para A add additional constraint. New para will read' "District Officers are required and expected to attend the following..."

Policy 11.0

With the new "Discounted membership category established and it's restriction on Club delegate calculation replace the existing text as follows.

Club Delegate Formula calculation

Elections and Credential committee shall determine the number of delegates for each club using the following;

a. The MyLCI Club Health assessment effective 1 Mar for current year,

- b. The MyLCI Club Health assessment effective 1 Mar for current year,
- c. The MyLCI Club Health assessment for 1 Mar of the previous year
- d. Report of Discounted members (Family, student, LEO) from MyLCI

The number of delegates shall be based on the lower of "Current member count (a)" and "Member count from previous year (b)" minus Discounted members(c). Using the formula one (1) delegate for every ten (10) eligible club members or majority fraction thereof with five (5) being the majority fraction.

Example;

- 1. Club XXYY member count 1 Mar of current year = 55, Member count 1 Mar previous Lions year = 50, 2 Discounted Family members club delegate number will be based on 48 giving the club 5 delegates.
- 2. Club VVVV member count 1 Mar of current = 20, Member count 1 Mar previous Lions year = 25, -2 Discounted Family Members club delegate number will be based on 18 giving club 2 delegates.

Special Voting Provision

Amend the last sentence to include the words "also" and "number established" Ne sentence will read;

"Lions exercising this provision are not eligible to vote also as a Club delegate nor do they count against the Club Delegate number established above."

Exhibits D, E, F, and G

Add under qualifications the following requirement; "Has not completed a full term as District Governor"

I have attached a proposed amended version of the Policy manual including the above noted changes in RED text. I would request that responsible departments review their sections of the Policy manual and submit required/suggested changes to myself.

I would like to remind Cabinet that I am available to answer C&BL questions at any time. Clubs may also send me requests for information or interpretation to assist them with their own club Constitutions

Vision/Hearing Report February 24, 2024

GREAT NEWS!!! I have finally received permission from the Hastings Prince Edward County School Board to have our Lions Clubs in their area enter the schools for Vision/Hearing Screening. Now that I have this affirmation from one Health Unit, I have sent letters to all other School Boards in our District asking that they also allow us into their schools. Fingers crossed, we seem to be slowly taking a few steps forward.

We have two clubs who have been able to complete vision/hearing screening in their schools with the permission of the principals.

Chemung Lake & District Lions Club have screened 158 students in two schools with a 72% pass rate





Waiting lists for dogs were growing to the point where people were giving up their dreams of ever getting the assistance of one of the dog guides. The Board decided to begin the process of purchasing land and planning for a new home.

Now the exciting part...... In March with this sod turning, the actual construction of the new building will begin. Lions have been a huge part of getting to this point. From across the country, Lions Clubs and individual Lions have already donated over \$3,000,000! Clubs have been able to ensure that they will have their name on a Donor Wall or a specific room or area of the new building.

It is not too late for your Lions Club to be included. A \$5000 donation from your Club will put your name of the Donor Wall. A bigger donation will enable you to have your Club name on something within the building or perhaps a garden or pathway or bench outside.
