

READ AND RISE



During the 2013 LCI Convention in Hamburg, Scholastic Books announced their partnership with LCI. The Reading Action Programme was also extended by the LCI Board of Directors for 10 years. As a Zone and Region Chair, I had promoted the RAP programme with the Lions. Many Lions clubs already had a Literacy project up and running but hadn't tagged it with the Literacy label. I also did some research about literacy and was not happy with the results I found.

The Read and Rise Literacy Project is a result of the partnership announced in Hamburg between Lions Clubs International and Scholastic Books.

DESIGNED FOR CANADIAN LIONS... THIS IS A NEW TOOL FOR YOUR LIONS TOOLBOX THAT CAN BE USED AS PART OF YOUR CLUB'S READING ACTION PROGRAMME IN YOUR COMMUNITY.

In November 2013, LCI had a webinar targeted at an American audience and designed for the American school system. It focused on primary children and promoted reading and literacy. Through the webinar I was put in contact with Christina Winfield at Scholastic Books Canada and together we have created a programme designed for Canadian Lions and Canadian school children.

The programme targets Pre-school, Junior & Senior Kindergarten, and Grades 1,2,3 students because the research shows that children who do not have a good grounding in reading by grade 3 may never catch up.
