Denbigh Griffith Lions Club Donate to Lakelands Family Health Team



The Denbigh Griffith Lions Club donates about \$20,000 each year to a variety of projects and causes. One of their current major initiatives is to donate \$25,000 over 5 years (\$5000 per year) to the Lakelands Family Health Team (LFHT) in Denbigh. This Clinic serves the greater communities of Denbigh, Griffith, Matawatchan and the surrounding area.

The LFHT in Denbigh has increased access to primary health care for

residents of this remote and isolated area. Patients now have more access to a physician and nurses, as well as access to a NP, a dietitian, a mental health counsellor and an advanced foot care specialist in their home community. LFHT offers several programs (hypertension, diabetic, smoking cessation, Healthy You: Weight Management), and preventative care. Emergency care is also provided at the Denbigh site. Because the donations to the LFHT have been used to purchase equipment for the Denbigh site, patients have the opportunity to have more tests completed locally. Prevention of disease and chronic disease management make a healthier community.

FLAG PLACEMENT... PROTOCOL

Where do the flags go?

The Place of Honour is always reserved for the Canadian flag. This position is not yielded for any reason. The clips below refer to correct placement from the spectator's view... from left to right—facing the flag display.

<u>Two Flag Display</u>: Canada flag on the left; Lions Clubs International flag on the right.

<u>Three Flag Display</u>: Canada flag in the centre in Place of Honour, American flag on left, and Lions flag on the right.

If more than three: The Canadian flag would be positioned on the left. General order of display—having placed the Canadian flag in the Place of Honour, the other flags should be displayed in the following sequence —

> National Flags Provincial Flags Organizational (i.e. Lions) Flags
