Minutes of last Regular Meeting: June 25th, 2014. Motion: to accept: Moved by Lion: Ken Willis, 2nd by Lion Helen Simpson. Carried. Lion Gord W. Inquired about the note in the minutes regarding the member's agreement to obtain a card to be available to sign at the Sept 24th meeting. Noting no mention of who would obtain he agreed to do so with the support of the members in attendance.

Treasurer's Report: Lion Linda provided balances of the Activities, Administration, Roy Watts, Doug Walton, Gord Jilks, Bar petty cash, and current cash on hand. **Motion: Moved by Lion C, 2nd by Bill J to accept as presented Carried.**

Business from last Regular Meeting: Nothing to report.

New Business:

Fall Bus Trip: Lion Roy confirmed that the trip was set for Wed Oct 1. 6-8 are seats available. Asked those interested to call him.

BBQ Oct 4th: Lion Gord advised that No Frills has offered to provide the product and donate the funds to the Community hall Improvement Fund. **Motion: Moved by Lion Terry, 2nd by Lion George that proceeds from the BB Oct 4th be donated to the Community Hall Improvement Project. Carried.**

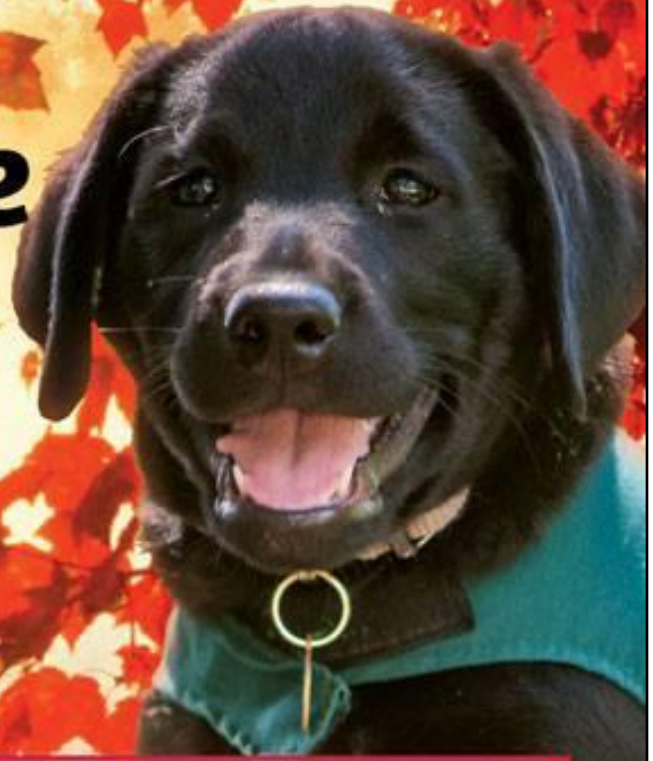
