6+THE DIFFERENCE CAMPAIGN

Lions across the world are making differences in their communities every day. Forty years ago, a group of Canadian Lions decided that together we could make a difference for people who are blind or visually impaired by establishing the Lions Foundation of Canada Dog Guides. Over the years, 5 more roles for certified dog guides and one program for facility dogs have been added.

Now 40 years after starting LFCDG in an old elementary school in Oakville, Lions across Canada are being asked <u>to make a difference</u> again. The success of each of the programs has meant that the demand for our dogs is at an all-time high. BUT there is no more room at the current facility to expand any of the programs.

The Lions Foundation of Canada Dog Guides is hoping that Lions across Canada will step up again and ensure that the funds needed will be donated or pledged to make a purpose built, state of the art facility on land owned by LFCDG a reality. The groundbreaking is set to happen later this fall and within the next 30 months or so a new building designed and built to the highest standards of accessibility will be ready to welcome more clients.



Please consider helping to make this happen. Your Club or Zone or Region, or our District can help this happen. You can pledge an amount over the next 5 years and then work on specific fundraising activities to fulfill the pledge. Already over half the funds that are needed from Lions have been donated or pledged. Personal donations from Lions are also most welcome.


