



International 2021 Convention... now "virtual" June 25th—29th

2020-2021 will go down in history as one of the most unusual years in recent memory. We've had a year of cancelled this and virtual that, masks, sanitizer and social distancing. Out of all of this frustration and confusion, some incredible opportunities have emerged.

The 2021 Lions Clubs International Convention in Montreal has been cancelled, and will be done virtually. At first I was apprehensive, perhaps even skeptical, but then got to thinkin'...

For the first time in our history, all A3 clubs will have an opportunity to be represented at an International convention. Yes, every club can send a voting delegate to elect OUR own Patti Hill to the position of International Second Vice President; and to elect Lion Allen Snider to the position of International Director... giving us two seats on the International Board. AND... most importantly, we can witness Lion Mark Kelso taking his oath to become our next District Governor.

We have forty-nine clubs and five clubs are large enough to send two delegates. Therefore, with PID Terry Graham's vote along with the vote of the sitting District Governor, we will have fifty-six votes. And those fifty-six votes will make a difference!

For most of us, the International Convention of Lions Clubs is not in our budget and that is what makes this year unique... registrations are affordable. The fee will be US\$50,00 until March 31st, then US\$75.00 beginning April 1st.

SVDG Linda Zwier... Message to District

Despite the Lockdowns and the Stay-at-Home-Orders, the past three months have flown by.

The Napanee Lioness Club expressed a desire to Bridge into a Lions Club. Governor Don asked me to facilitate this and, along with PDG Bill, be a Guiding Lion. It was very exciting and a brand new learning curve for me. It took a couple of months but on January 13, 2021, the Lions Club of Napanee Lioness was chartered.

There are currently 14 members. Our first scheduled meeting was postponed due to inclement weather and an alternate date has been set. It is a challenge with current provincial/municipal guidelines in place, for in-person meetings. It is possible, though, as long as attendees are all from a Green Zone, we stay under 20 people, wear masks, use sanitizer, maintain physical distancing (stay 1 moose apart or 8 black squirrels lengthwise), no food or drinks. I am very much looking forward to working with this club, along with the rest of the Leadership Team.

Governor Don has also asked me to present the Amherstview Lions Club with a Club Excellence Award for the 2019/2020 Lions' year. We are waiting for warmer weather and, hopefully, a loosening of the health protocols so we can do this presentation properly.

There are several clubs in our District who seem to be on track for the Club Excellence Award this year. A club needs to have a membership growth of at least one, since June 30th, 2020. The club must also have contributed to LCIF (Lions of Canada for LCIF) and have completed 3 service projects. The Leadership Team will be assisting clubs in determining their eligibility. Remember: the application form cannot be submitted to Governor Don until after July 1st, 2021.

I would like to thank the Sharbot Lake Lions Club for endorsing me in my bid for Ist VDG. This Lions' year certainly has not been what I hoped, in terms of visitations and supporting clubs' events. It has, though, provided ample opportunities for virtual learning – opportunities that may not have arisen in a so called "normal" world. For that I am grateful - to have had the chance to enhance my own education.

Our District A3 Lions continue to amaze me with the service they provide under difficult circumstances. You are the best!


FUNDRAISER FOR LIONS CLUBS INTERNATIONAL FOUNDATION
