TORNADO DISASTER STRIKES LIONS DISTRICT 2-X2



Upshur County, Monday Night, March 21, between 10:20 and 10:47 p.m., according to the National Weather Service (NWS), a tornado cut a 40-mile path of destruction up to 700 yards wide, as it crossed Texas 300 south of Gilmer, near FM 2685 and Pomegranate Road, headed for Ore City and on into NW Marion County and SE Morris County, and finally lifted west of Linden.

The tornado in Upshur County was initially thought to be an EF-1 but after a couple days, has been designated an **EF-2** tornado, rating this one, at 135mph, just under an EF-3, with winds of at least 136 mph.

The Upshur County tornado was one of seven that night and the strongest in NE Texas. Two tornadoes in Cass County were rated EF-1.

According to the NWS report, "at on at least three occasions, manufactured homes had residents inside them when they were picked up and thrown by tornadoes." Reports indicate there were seven injuries but no fatalities.

Sweet Spot

Treatment for diabetes is different for each person depending on their type as well as their body's physical status. For type 1 patients, the option of rapid acting, immediate or long acting, and inhaled insulin are available to assist with providing the amount needed for before meals and all-day treatment. There are no prescription pills that can work for Type 1 at this time. Novolog or humalog are the insulin medications dominantly used. Patients with type 1 need to use injections or insulin pumps to provide the needed amount daily.

On the other hand, patients with Type 2, have more options to decide upon. Many are given the ability to take medications such as sulfonylurea or meglitinide but have the risk that it can cause blood glucose levels to drop too low (hypoglycemia). Metformin or the glitazones, other options, rarely cause hypoglycemia unless taken with insulin stimulators (sulfonylureas or repaglinide) or insulin injections. Due to age or other medical needs, people with Type 2 are given multiple options to assist with insulin production and management. Speaking with a physician is the best way to find the right treatment for sugar management

- 4. Stay safe, wait for all clear during the [midnight] darkness, downed trees and electrical poles and wires, live or otherwise,
- 5. We Lions are Second Responders
 Until the First wave knows where to
 respond, clears the roads and live wires,
 tends to the injured, the second wave is safe
 enough to do their work.

Orange Glazed Pork Loin Recipe

1 teaspoon salt1 garlic clove, minced2 to 3 fresh thyme sprigs or 1/4 teaspoondried thyme

1/4 teaspoon ground ginger1/4 teaspoon pepper1 boneless pork loin roast (5 pounds)

glaze:

1 cup orange juice1/4 cup packed brown sugar1 tablespoon Dijon mustard1/3 cup cold water1 tablespoon cornstarch

Nutrition Facts

4 ounces cooked pork with 1 tablespoon glaze: 199 calories, 7g fat (2g saturated fat), 71mg cholesterol, 212mg sodium, 6g carbohydrate (5g sugars, 0 fiber), 28g protein. Diabetic exchanges: 4 lean meat, 1/2 starch.

Recipe

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350°. Combine the first 5 ingredients; rub over roast. Place fat side up on a rack in a shallow roasting pan. Bake, uncovered, for 1 hour.
- 2. Meanwhile, in a saucepan over medium heat, combine orange juice, brown sugar and mustard. In a small bowl, mix water and cornstarch until smooth. Add to the orange juice mixture. Bring to a boil; cook and stir for 2 minutes. Reserve 1 cup glaze for serving; brush half of remaining glaze over roast.
- 3. Bake until a thermometer reads 145°, 20-40 minutes longer, brushing occasionally with remaining glaze. Let stand for 10 minutes before slicing. Reheat reserved glaze; serve with roast.
