Huge Shout out to the members of the Bogata Lions Club for hosting a <u>Fabulous Cabinet</u> <u>Meeting!!!</u>



Reminder: IRS Form 990-N

File your club's IRS 990-N!!! I can't stress enough how very important this is. It is a quick, simple form that you file electronically at IRS.Gov. It only takes a few minutes to file. Your club can file this simple form if your annual gross receipts are \$50,000 or less. If you qualify to file the 990-N, you answer two questions, yes **or no.** To fill in the rest of the form takes minutes, not hours. If your club does not file this form with the IRS for three years, your club's non-profit status will be revoked. If it is revoked, there is a 17 page form that your club will complete and submit to the IRS along with a \$600 fee. This will get the IRS to consider your club for non-profit status re-instatement. This is a tedious process and a waste of Lions Club funds that can easily be avoided. I am not an expert, but it is my understanding that if the club's non-profit status is not reinstated, your club will be required to pay taxes (and possibly penalities) on all of your fundraisers since your last filing.

Below is information from IRS.Gov that gives information on Form 990-N.

Small tax-exempt organizations generally are eligible to file Form 990-N to satisfy their annual reporting requirement, if their annual gross receipts are normally \$50,000 or less.

- Gross receipts are the total amounts the organization received from all sources during its annual accounting period, without subtracting any costs or expenses.
- Gross receipts are considered to be normally \$50,000 or less if the organization:
 - Has been in existence for 1 year or less and received, or donors have pledged to give, \$75,000 or less during its first taxable year;
 - o Has been in existence between 1 and 3 years and averaged \$60,000 or less in gross receipts during each of its first two tax years; and
 - Is at least 3 years old and averaged \$50,000 or less in gross receipts for the immediately preceding 3 tax years (including the year for which calculations are being made).

Filing Due Date

Form 990-N is due every year by the 15th day of the 5th month after the close of your tax year. You cannot file the e-Postcard until after your tax year ends. Since the Lions year ends on June 30; Nov. 15th is the deadline for most Lions Clubs. If your tax year is the calendar year, May 15th is your deadline. If your fiscal [tax] year is something else, do the math!

File, File, File!!!! It will make your life much easier.

Warning: If an internet-based company offers to submit your 990-N information for a fee and, claim they only take 5 minutes to fill out the online application," your club can do it for free on the IRS website. Besides, if you want to pay them, why would you care how long it takes them to do it...on time, of course? [Ed. Note]

Ready for Back-to-School?

To all the Lions of District 2-X2:

Schools are gearing up for the start of the new year. This is the best time to contact your school district's School **Health Coordinator** to set up an appointment to visit about the services that Lions offer. The school district Health Coordinator can get valuable information to the school nurses, 504 Coordinators, Special Education Directors, diagnosticians, teachers, parents, and staff. The school nurses are a valuable link to disseminate information. School nurses are the "front line" for the very students who have the greatest need for Lions services. They can talk with students and their parents. Visiting the school nurses would be a great Lions **recruiting opportunity**. As Lions, they would have the opportunity (with certification) to use the SPOT vision screener. Access to a SPOT would REALLY help them out during "vision screening season"!

This time of year, schools are preparing their in-service programs for staff. Private schools and day care centers are, too. What a great opportunity to present a program or give information about Texas Lions Camp, vision screening, eyeglass collection, eye exams and eyeglass assistance, diabetes awareness, etc.! Also, the school district Health Coordinator is responsible for the School Health Advisory Council (SHAC). Each district is required to have a SHAC, open to the public. Its purpose is to promote school health. The SHAC is made up of parents, community members, students, and school staff working together to improve the health of all students and families through coordinated school health programs. SHAC meetings are a great place to present programs about Lions services!!

<u>Please</u> have your club contact the local school district's Health Coordinator as soon as possible. Not sure who that is? Look up the school district's website, find (usually under departments) SCHOOL HEALTH SERVICES, and the contact information should be there.

I am ready, willing, and able to come to your club meeting to talk about Texas Lions Camp. Please contact me at: 903-926-1960. Also, if you need brochures and flyers to give to the schools or ANYONE, please let me know, so we can get them to you.

Sweet Spot

Summer is here and so is the heat. Diabetes affects our body in so many ways, such as hydration, and activity tolerance. With high temperatures, extreme heat can be dangerous for those with all types of diabetes. With increased heat, and moderate to high activity, you sweat profusely, which leads to dehydration, which causes your glucose levels to rise. With high sport activity, the glucose levels fall quickly. Therefore, it is always a good idea to monitor your glucose levels, as you plan summer activities in the high temperatures of summer.

Tips for high heat:

- Drink plenty of water
- Avoid alcohol and drinks with caffeine
- Monitor your glucose levels before and after activities
- Wear cool loose-fitting clothes
- Wear sunscreen and hat
- Take breaks to enter to an air-conditioned building to assist with cooling your body
- Seek emergency help when necessary

Summer recipe:

<u>Coconut Daiquiri Slushie</u> (Fat 20g, Sodium 12 mg, Carbs 2g, Protein 1g)

- 1 can coconut milk or 3/4 cup solid cream part
- 1 tsp Sweet Leaf Liquid Stevia Coconut Sweet Drops
- 1/2 cup coconut water, it can be from the can already used
- 3 cups of ice
- Optional: 1 tsp of rum extract or 4 oz of white rum

Instructions:

Add all ingredients into a high-powered blender and blend until the ice is crushed and the mixture is slushie! Taste and adjust with stevia as needed.

Theme for 2021-2022

"We Are All Connected"

Don't miss your opportunity to sponsor a **34**th **Annual Lions International Peace Poster Contest. MD2 Texas Lions** urges all Lions Clubs to engage with the youth in their community to sponsor an entry for their District's **Peace Poster Contest**. The contest "**We Are All Connected**" begins with you & your Club. Each of the 16 Districts in MD2 will send their winning Poster to the Peace Poster Chairman for MD2 Contest by **Dec. 1, 2021.**

How the Contest works: Only a Lions Club can sponsor a youth for the Peace Poster Contest. The sponsoring Lions Club needs to obtain a Peace Poster Contest Kit (PPK1EN) from LCI Club supplies by Oct.1. Only one entry per District & each entry must be the original work of only one youth. The contest is open to young people ages 11, 12 & 13 on November 15, 2021. Each District selects one winning poster to be entered for the MD2 contest. There is no entrance fee at this time.

Art: Youths may use a variety of mediums, including charcoal, pastels, crayon, pencils and paint, to express the Theme "We Are All Connected". If charcoal or pastels are used, then a spray on sealant is recommended. The artwork must be no smaller than 13"x20" & no larger than 20"x24". The use of words of any kind is not allowed. Three-dimensional entries are NOT accepted. NOTHING may be glued, stapled or taped to the artwork. Do not laminate, mat or frame artwork. Get complete contest details from the Contest Rules page in the Peace Poster Kit now available at LCI Club Supplies.

Judging: Each poster is judged on originality, artistic merit and expression of the theme. Posters advance through several judging levels: Local, District, Multiple-District and International. Only one poster is selected at the District-level as its entry for Multiple District (MD2 Texas) contest. MD-2 then chooses one poster to send on to International HQ for the final judging at the International-level contest. At the International level, judges from the art, peace, education, youth, and media communities select one Grand Prize Winner and 23 Merit Award Winners. More than 600,000 children participate annually world over.

Award Prize/Recognition to the winning artist at the local Club-level & the District-level is given at their wishes.

\$ 500 cash prize for MD-2 (Texas)-level winner \$5000 by LCI for one international Grand Prize Winner and a trip (with 2 family members & a Lions Club member) to the award ceremony.

\$ 500 cash and Certificate of Achievement from LCI to 23 International Merit Award winners

Ordering Contest Kit: Lions Clubs sponsoring the contest must order a Peace Poster Contest kit (PPK1EN) from the Club Supplies Sales Dept. at clubsupplies@lionsclubs.org. Separate kit must be ordered for each poster submitted to each District. The cost of each kit is \$11.95 + shipping and handling. Please give sufficient delivery time for a well-planned contest. The kit contains official guidelines, sticker to place on the back (lower right-hand corner) of the winning-poster to be submitted by the Club to the District Governor.

Social Media Campaign

- **Step 2** Make sure your club's Facebook Page/Account is active.
- Step 3 Like the District 2X2 Facebook page (if you have not already done so) ...
- **Step 4** Watch for the "Top Ten Reasons You Should Join a Lions Club" Facebook District Post Every Week ... starting the **first week of August 2021** with Reason #10.


