Food For Thought:

The Club President of the San Marcos Lions Club, Lion Dennis Gutierrez, submitted this article for his club's newsletter. I think it delivers a very powerful and relevant message ...

“One time a lumber yard placed a sign in their building. Under the startling headline, “81% OF YOUR CUSTOMERS WILL BE LOST TEN YEARS FROM NOW;” the following statistics were given:

- 1% will die
- 3% will move away
- 5% will give their business to a friend
- 9% will be lost to competitors
- 14% will be lost due to dissatisfaction with a product
- 65% will quit because of an attitude of indifference of an employee

Lions Clubs also lose members for all these reasons. Death is steadily calling men and women into eternity. We have suffered some significant deaths in the last couple of years in our club. In our very mobile society, the local club is constantly affected by “moving members.” Those with no real commitment to Lionism will drop out or move on to another service club, or some other activity.

Isn't it interesting that the great loss of business comes at the point of “employee indifference?” Have you ever walked into a store and felt that the salesperson or manager would rather not be bothered? Right here is where the bulk of customer casualties lie. It would seem that if there is any lesson a “businessperson” should consider elementary, it should be to make the customer want to return.

Club members are Lionism's “salespeople.” We should do well to look into the matter of how we treat our visitors to the weekly meetings. Do we just let the Tail Twister, Lion Tamer, President, or one of the Past Presidents do all the greeting? Or do we personally and warmly seek out visitors? As we filter into the weekend and week to follow, do we drive off potential “customers” by our indifference toward the Lions Club? Do we ever speak a word for Lions and the great

District 2X2 Hall of Fame procedures:

1. Nominees must be in good standing and reside in the district and must be made by a member of the nominee's home club. Any member, active or deceased, nominated must be a member in good standing in district 2-X2 for at least **5 years**.

2. Nominations of inductees for the District Hall of Fame shall be submitted to the club's Zone Chair by **December 1** of each eligible year.

3. The Zone Chair will forward the recommendations to the First VDG for approval by **January 1**.

4. The final selection by the District Governor's committee will be made 30 days prior to the District Convention.

5. Cost of the Hall of Fame award will be billed to the nominating club.

6. Any inductee into the Texas Lions Hall of Fame will automatically become a member of the District Hall of Fame.

7. Proper presentation ceremony should take place at the District Convention.

8. Solicitation in any manner for this recognition will automatically eliminate the soliciting candidate for that year.

9. A minimum of five awards should be approved each year, with one awarded to each region. If a region fails to submit a nomination, then that region's award may be used for any of the other regions with multiple nominations

THIS IS WHAT BEING CONSIDERED FOR THE TEXAS HALL OF FAME IS ABOUT: NOT MERELY A GOOD JOB FOR A FEW YEARS BUT A LIFETIME OF OUTSTANDING COMMITTEMENT TO SERVICE

Qualifications for consideration are:

The minimum standards for a nominee to qualify for the Texas Hall of Fame are:

- a. Be an Active or deceased member with at least Fifteen (15) years of Service.
- b. Having provided outstanding and dedicated service as a Lion Beyond the Call of Duty.
- c. Having provided other than service as a Lion to the community, State, and nation.
- d. Having accomplished special achievements in, or contributions to humanitarian service for those less fortunate; and
- e. Not having solicited in any manner for this recognition, which will automatically eliminate the candidate for that year

The nominee’s application/resolution must be submitted by **January 1, 2022**.

Selection will be made by the Selection Committee at the District 2-X2 Mid-Winter Conference on January 15, 2022, in Tyler. The Selection Committee is comprised of: Chair PDG Lion Brian Whitenack (*Non-voting member of the committee**), PCC Lion Carol French, Lion Jackie Bowling, PDG Lion Leon Van Alstine, PDG Lion Becky Whitenack, & PDG Lion Charlie Horn. Committee alternates: Lion Earl Smith and Lion Andy Reese.

- 3) Drink more water: Challenge yourself by using a bottle of specified amount to reach goal;

- 5) Exercise regularly good for your physical and mental abilities

Blueberry Yogurt Lemon Bars

- 1 **unsweetened graham cracker flour**
- **avocado oil** 3 tbsp
- **lemon zest** (freshly grated, divided) 2 tsp plus 1 tbsp
- **fine sea salt** 1/4 tsp
- **whole egg** 1
- **egg whites** 3
- **nonfat vanilla Greek yogurt** 2 cup
- **maple syrup** 1 tsp
- **lemon juice** (freshly squeezed) 1/4 cup
- **fresh blueberries**

1. **Preheat oven to 350 degrees.**
2. **Line an 8-inch baking dish with parchment paper, then coat it with nonstick cooking spray.**
3. **To make the crust, add graham cracker flour, avocado oil, 2 teaspoons lemon zest, and salt to the bowl of a food processor; pulse to combine. Press mixture into the bottom of the prepared pan. Bake for 10–15 minutes, or until crust is golden brown. Then remove pan from the oven and set aside to cool.**
4. **To make the filling, process the egg, egg whites, yogurt, maple syrup, lemon juice, and remaining 1 tablespoon lemon zest in a blender until smooth. Stir in the fresh blueberries. Pour the filling onto the prebaked crust.**
5. **Transfer pan to the oven and bake for 25–30 minutes, or until the center is set. Remove pan from the oven and place on a wire rack to cool completely. Cut into 16 equal-sized squares and serve chilled or at room temperature.**
