#### The Governor's Corner

Keep the Pride - Serve

It's time to think about club officers for the next Lion's year and begin the nominating process. Club officers are a vital part of every club. They are needed to insure proper financial handling, good record keeping, and a leader to keep the club organized and focused. Many treasurers and secretaries are content to keep their position for several years. However, the president should be a position that changes yearly or bi-yearly. Why? In order to recruit new officers for the district level, the requirement is that they must have been a club president prior to seeking the district position. Maintaining the same president every year denies these members the opportunity to serve at higher levels. In some clubs nobody wants to be an officer. This places an unfair burden on those serving in those positions. There have been clubs where one person handled all three major positions because no one else was willing. This causes burnout and resentment for that one person. Often the member will decide to leave the organization because of this. The most common reason members give for not accepting a position is "not enough time". The treasurer and secretary position usually average about one hour per month not counting the club meetings. The amount of time a president spends depends on the person and the club and how often they meet. This usually doesn't involve much time spent outside of the club meetings. And the good news is that the president

#### **Caution! Data Breaches**

Last year, 2019, set a record for data breaches, with more than 3,800 publicly disclosed breaches exposing an incredible 4.1 billion compromised records...and that was just during the first six months. Alarmingly, 3.2 billion of those records were exposed by just eight breaches. The exposed data included email addresses (contained in 70% of breaches) and passwords (65%).

If those numbers seem remote, think again.

Recently, some of our clubs have had money taken from their bank account. At least one club is still trying to recover the money taken.

Not all data breaches are the result of hackers. Sometimes errors on the parts of government agencies or private companies can expose the personal information of people. That is the case of 2.3 million records that were unnecessarily exposed by the Federal Emergency Management Agency, better known as FEMA.

Security of your personal information begins at home, when it comes to banking, emails, and passwords.

How do you know if your data has been exposed in a data breach? Go to <a href="https://haveibeenpwned.com/">https://haveibeenpwned.com/</a> and type in your email address. This site will tell you if your info, like email, phone, address, and worse, passwords in which breach(es). You can also sign up for email notifications if your email address is in a future breach.

If your information was exposed, *monitor your bank accounts* for suspicious or unfamiliar activity. [you should be doing this at least monthly, already] change your password, ASAP.

*Freeze your credit* at the three national credit bureaus of Equifax, TransUnion and Experian. You can do this online and the process is free.

Use *strong passwords* and Two-factor authentication.

Never use the same password for more than one login. [really important if your data were breached: the bad guys will try to get into your other accounts that way]


