All Lions clubs, districts, and multiple districts with annual gross receipts less than US\$50,000 who are not otherwise required to file Forms 990 or 990-EZ must file the e-Postcard (also known as 990-N). [by Nov. 15th]

If your Lions club, district or multiple district has a foundation, which is a separate legal entity, the appropriate form will need to be filed as well. **[see info sheet attached]**

District: e-district.org/sites/2x2 State: texaslions.org International: lionsclubs.org Lions Camp: lionscamp.com *Lions: Please remember that all Lions clubs, districts and multiple districts* that have annual gross receipts of less than US\$50,000 and do not have to file Forms 990 or 990-EZ must file the <u>e-Postcard</u> (also known as 990-N). **If your Lions club, district or multiple district has a foundation, which is a separate legal entity, the appropriate form will need to be filed as well.**

All filers must register at IRS.gov prior to filing their next Form 990-N. This is a one-time registration if the designated Lion files annually. If the designee changes from a prior year, the new designee must register with the IRS.

Please refer to the following chart regarding annual filing requirements:

2019-2020 Tax Year*	Form to File
Gross receipts normally \$50,000 or less	990-N
Gross receipts greater than \$50,000 and less than \$200,000,	990-EZ or 990
and total assets less than \$500,000

The e-Postcard is due by the 15th day of the fifth month after the close of your tax year. Lions clubs operate on a fiscal year, July 1-June 30, and the e-Postcard is due by <u>November 15</u> each year. Please note that *an organization cannot request an extension for filing the Form 990-N*.

If you do not file, you risk losing your tax-exempt status. Any Lions club that fails to meet its annual reporting requirement for three consecutive years will automatically lose its tax exempt status. A club may <u>apply</u> for reinstatement of its tax exemption even if it originally fell under a group exemption.

Every club and/or district (single, sub- and multiple) must have an employer identification number (EIN), even if it will not have employees. The EIN is a unique number that identifies the organization to the Internal Revenue Service. To apply for an EIN, you should obtain a Form SS-4 and its instructions from the IRS. You may also apply for an <u>EIN online</u>, by telephone (1-800-829-4933) or by fax (fax number at the location accepting applications from your state). It is important that clubs and districts use the correct EIN for their annual filing.

Your great response to our Texas Lions Camp themed mask has netted over \$1000 for the Camp so far. I have had several orders for whole clubs. All profits will go into the Polar Bear Challenge, which is being designated to go into our building fund for our new bunkhouses. So keep the orders coming.

The words on the mask "Serving God's Special Children" on a Texas flag background is our Chairman Kent Basinger's theme for the year.

Please take note that the printers are having trouble getting masks from their suppliers, who in turn tell us, that the manufacturers are unable to supply them. There appears to be two reasons for this shortage. First of all, most of the manufacturer's time, effort & materials are going into making sure our medical providers have all the PPE's they need. Secondly there are millions of these specialty masks being ordered for almost every organization and business in the country.

As a result please allow 4-5 weeks or more for delivery. The good news is that so far, I have been able to get the orders out in about 3 weeks from the date I receive them. As of Sept. 8, all orders received by me prior to August 24th are in the mail.

These new bunkhouses are critical, especially after the destruction we received this spring on camp by the high winds. If we are to continue "Serving God's Special Children", we must get this done.

So keep those orders coming! Thank you.

Lions & Leos & Bears....BRRRRR!







In February Texas Lions launched the biggest project at TLC since the inception of the camp – CAMPaign Vision 2020 & Beyond, a campaign to replace our bunkhouses, care-taker (summer staff) quarters, and basic infrastructure. This is sorely needed if our camp is going to be relative for another 70 years..... AND to kick things off, the Texas Lions Camp was selected by the Mo Ranch in Hunt, TX to be the beneficiary of the 28th Polar Bear Challenge on January 1, 2021 at 1PM. We hope you will use this honor given to our camp to help kick off CAMPaign Vision 2020 & Beyond with a BIG Splash! All the money raised will go to this capital building campaign.

We likely won't get chosen for this honor again for many years, but it gives us a perfect opportunity to get all our Texas Lions & friends thinking about our new "vision" for TLC's future....but to make matters more critical, the spring storms of 2020, destroyed bunkhouse 2, and severely damaged bunkhouse 1, plus summer staff quarters & some other buildings. It has become imperative to start our rebuilding sooner than later, if we want to continue to serve 1500 special kids each summer. Because of the pandemic, however, our Campaign has been virtually shut down so far, making the Polar Bear Challenge a timely opportunity to kick off the campaign.

So how does the Polar Bear Plunge Challenge work? Simple: you donate and/or raise money from family, friends, Lions, Lions Clubs and patrons in the name of someone, whom you would really LOVE to see – hopefully ME (PCC Tom Blase) take a freezing plunge down a long slide into the extremely frigid Guadalupe River next January 1st. Generally, you might pick one of the Polar Bear Plunge "Court", of which I am a member, to support; but maybe there is a District Governor, Club President or some other poor Lion you might coerce into taking the plunge. If you will go to www.lionscamp.com, click on Media, and then Blog, you will find all of the members of the court on page 2 or 3 of the blogs. You will also find other important information about the Challenge on other blogs nearby.

All checks should be made out to Texas Lions Camp. Generally the checks should be mailed to the Texas Lions Camp (P.O. Box 290247, Kerrville TX 79029), however some District Governors have some special competitions and challenges going, so they prefer you send them through the District. Make sure your checks indicate which Court member you are supporting to make the BIG splash, and your District number.

You can also donate on line at <u>www.lionscamp.com</u>. Click on the big red box DONATE NOW, and follow the prompts down the page. When you get to "Donation Categories", select Polar Bear Plunge Challenge, and a little further down, when it asks if you are a Polar Bear Challenge donor, open it for the names of the Court members to credit the donation.

Anyone is welcome to come and watch on January 1st or better yet, anyone can take the plunge by raising their own funds (or paying \$25). Those brave souls, who wish to do this, can register to make the slide on the camp website. This form should be available soon on our website. Abwenzi A Yesu Friends of Jesus Foundation Mission Update

Greetings Carolyn and Texas Lions Club Members!

We are grateful for your prayers and the provision of new reading glasses made available by TLERC! Please join us in praising God for his protection, answers to so many prayers (they really are too numerous to count), and in making a way to travel and serve alongside the Pentecostal denomination in Tanzania this year, and also in returning to Mzuzu, Malawi and serving with the Central Church of Africa Presbyterian (CCAP) and a couple of Baptist churches.

This year, Abwenzi A Yesu Friends of Jesus Foundation provided approximately 120 new reading glasses to men and women who had developed presbyopia, could read, but could not afford to purchase or have access to reading glasses. Returning overseas on a short medical evangelical mission

for two weeks to Tanzania and Malawi was quite an adventure, logistically challenging and unlike previous mission trips in the past. "Trust in the Lord, and lean not on your own understanding...." (Prov. 3:5-6).

Traveling to Tanzania takes 2 full days by airplane. This year with a face mask, full-face shield and required social distancing. Dar Es Salaam, where I landed, is located on the Indian Ocean, and means "the city of the bees Rev. Sospeter Laurean Barubike and Rev. Joseph Samuel had been ministering and preaching together. Both Reverends were recipients of new reading glasses. Rev. Sospeter was willing to have his picture taken with his new glasses).

The next stop after returning to the mainland and traveling from Dar Es Salaam, was Mzuzu Malawi. This was no easy journey either! The Malawi borders had just been downgraded from a level-4 complete travel ban, to a level-3 travel advisory, with required negative PCR testing within 10 days of arrival, a letter of invitation from a local friend of mine, and current Malawi clinical officer's license, I was granted an exception in entering Malawi this year, with some wonderful moments, because God in his grace opened the door, with new opportunities, but not before some "light and momentary trials at the border" because of the recent downgrade, and limited border openings, a three hour delay with some tense moments occurred before I was





granted an exception and allowed entry. Praise God for his love, his mercy and grace, and the opportunity to see his hand at work in my situation and on behalf of men, women and children who we served together this year for his glory and Kingdom. The picture above, was taken in Karunga, Malawi (around 40 miles from Songwe border crossing in Northern Malawi).

Face masks, gloves and hand sanitizer were provided for all volunteers.

Everyone was required to wear a mask once they had registered as a patient, and also practice social distancing if possible

To my friends at TLERC I want to thank you again for the work you are doing in many places around the world in providing sight to the poor by providing eye clinics and gently recycled glasses, and or reading glasses. Please contact Abwenzi A Yesu Friends of Jesus Foundation if you would like to join us in a partnership mission some day in the not so distant future. (*The last picture is of myself taken at the Ngorongoro Animal Wildlife Conservatory overlooking the Ngorongoro Crater in Tanzania, SE Africa*).
