FIVE WAYS TO AVOID THE ER

It is peak flu season. And there are a bunch of other cold weather health hazards during the winter months. Following are suggestions as to how you can boost your chances of staying out of the ER during the winter months.

- * Avoid falls on slippery surfaces: keep driveways and walkways clear of snow and ice; wear flat shoes with good traction; take slow, careful steps when walking.
- * Use caution with heaters: check that all smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors are working properly. Always keep a safe perimeter around space heaters; turn off space heaters before leaving the room or going to sleep.
- * Stay Safe in Cold temperatures: bundle up in layers to avoid hypothermia and frost bite; keep your head covered and wear mittens instead of gloves; change out of wet clothes promptly.
- * Shovel Carefully: Lift with your legs and not your back; stretch before you begin and take frequent brakes; don't shovel without your doctor's okay if you have heart issues.
- * Steer clear of the flu: get a flu shot; wash your hands frequently; avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth

the conversation for playback helping those who miss parts of a conversation. This allows for going back to areas of the conversation where meaning the was lost thus capturing the full meaning of the phone call.

DISTRICT NEWS -ROAR LIKE A LION -AFTERNOON OF SERVICE

Five Leo Clubs and 14 Lions Clubs joined forces with the Carroll County Public Library system to provide an afternoon of service called "Roar Like a Lion" for 1130 students and adults in Carroll County. Clubs and libraries participating included: South Carroll Lioness Lions Club, Freedom District Lions Club, the Century High School Leo Club, Liberty High School Leo Club at Eldersburg Library: Deer Park Lions Club and Roaring Run Lions Club at Finksburg Library: Taylorsville-Winfield Lions Club, South Carroll High School Leo Club and Mt. Airy Middle School Leo Club at Mt. Airy Library: Taneytown Lions Club, Harney Lions Club, Terra Rubra Lions Club, New Windsor Lions Club, and Francis Scott Key High School Leo Club at the Taneytown Library: Westminster Lions Club, Greater Carroll Lions Club and Silver Run-Union Mills Lions Club at Westminster Library: and Lineboro-Manchester lions Club and Hampstead Lions Club at the North Carroll Library.

There were over 130 participants at the Eldersburg Library who completed 886 projects including: 21 Linus blankets; 300 kindness rocks; 20 hospital busy boxes; 29 fleece scarves for the homeless; 64 bags of items for patients undergoing chemotherapy; 80 socks of Love for the homeless; 55 appreciation bags for the library staff, police departments and fire departments; 317 birthday, get well, and Valentine's Day cards for the sick, for Veteran's and for patients at Walter Reed Medical Center; 406 pairs of eyeglasses were sorted and cleaned; 203 food donations were collected and the library's toy supplies were cleaned.

Schools represented at the Eldersburg Library include: Oakland Road Middle School, Sykesville Middle School, Century High School, Liberty High School, Freedom Elementary School, Mt. Airy Elementary and Wesley Freedom Pre-School.




Mason


