B ike riding became the latest fundraiser for the 5SW district as they hosted the Rushmore Ride on June 28 at the Lions Building in Rapid City.

PDG Ken Gifford and PDG Doug Scheller organized the event which was resurrected from a similar event held several years ago.

Metro Lions sponsored the event for seven years and donated funds to the Diabetes Association. The Rapid Valley Lions, now defunct, held the event for two years and gave funds to Ski For Light.

This year's event provided funds for the SD Lions Foundation. \$8850 was given from local businesses and several Lions Clubs. Water was provided by Eagle Distributing while lunch and T-shirts were paid for from event funding.

43 Lions from several clubs in the Black Hills area worked the event which featured a bike ride from the Lions Building at the Central States Fairgrounds to Storybook Island and back. A luncheon was served at the conclusion of the event.

Scheels Sports donated a \$25.00 gift certificate to one of the participants.

"I appreciated all the sponsors and volunteers at this event. Without them we couldn't have done it," **PDG Gifford** said. "Next year we will promote a 100 mile century ride for the event."
