Leader Dog Announces Kennel Campaign

eader Dogs for the Blind has announced a capital fund raising drive as part of its 75th anniversary. The growth of the organization since 1939 along with the deteriorating conditions of the kennel portion of the complex have made it necessary to redesign and expand the operation in a major way.

The total amount of the expansion needs is \$14.5 million, some of which has already been raised. Leader Dog is asking Lions of the U.S. and Canada to raise \$3 million of that total.

The campaign formally began on July 1 and will end next June 30. During this one year effort Lions Clubs and individuals will be asked to make one-time donations or pledges. Donations may be made in lump sum or spread over a 3-5 year period. The fund raising drive is organized in much the same manner as the successful 2005-08 Campaign Sight First II. Bruce Schwartz has accepted the roll of Regional Coordinator for North and South Dakota. Donna Wetz of Newell is District Coordinator for District 5SW.

All Lions clubs in North and South Dakota will be approached about contributing to this important cause. The 2014-15 district governors along with the various coordinators will be contacting clubs and individuals throughout the year to provide information and suggest donation levels.

Our goal for North and South Dakota is "Beat Everybody's Pants Off." There are 25 regions around North America and our Region 19 has as its goal to be the best per capita producer of them all.
