MD5 Fargo Convention Rules 2015

- The official convention program shall be the order of business.
- 2. Robert's Rules of Order shall govern all parliamentary procedures.
- Lions in good standing must be registered to vote on all convention matters. Clubs with indebtedness of over \$50 to LCI or their district will be considered not in good standing.
- The use of profane language at any business session, social function, or banquet is prohibited.
- 5. Refunds of convention fees shall be requested from Lion Gary Hanssen, MD5 Fargo Convention, 836 Lakeridge Place, West Fargo, ND 58078 until June 30, 2015. After this date requests should be made to MD5 Sec/Treas PCC Mike Brand, 1904 Burlington Drive, Unit 1 West Fargo, ND 58078. No refunds can be requested 60 days after the end of the convention.
- All resolutions shall be submitted to DG Murray Linner, chairperson of Rules and Resolutions Committee by 9AM Saturday, May 30 in care of the Lions Registration Desk at the Hilton Garden Inn.
- Credentials to vote at the MD5 Fargo can be delivered upon arrival at the convention, in care of the Fargo Registration Desk, Hilton Garden Inn no later than 11:45 Saturday May 30.
- Entries for: Most Lions Miles Traveled submitted by registrants, MD5 Lion Club of the Year Contest, Club Website Contest, District Club Scrapbook, and District Club Newsletter are to be submitted, from each District Governor, to PDG Tom Armstrong, Chair, Convention Committee by 9AM, Friday May 29 in care of the Lions Registration Desk at the Hilton Garden

- Any details regarding changing the Constitution and By Laws shall be submitted to DG Murray Linner, c/o 1904 Burlington Drive, Unit #1 West Fargo, ND 58078 by April 30.
- 10. All reports of committee meetings held at the convention must be submitted to the Sec/Treas, PCC Mike Brand in care of the Lions Registration Desk by 9AM May 31. Reports should be typewritten in a format approved by the council.
- 11. Privilege to speak regarding convention sites or any matter pertaining to MD5 business must be requested of CC Ken Wetz.
- 12. In our business sessions, a delegate will be recognized by the CC. Delegates must stand, use a mic if available, and state his/her name and club. No Lion shall be allowed to speak for more than 3 minutes each time on any subject .
- 13. All voting at business sessions shall be conducted by card vote by qualified delegates present. A roll call or secret ballot vote may be directed by the CC if considered warranted, or may be requested by a motion passed by the majority. The credentials committee shall conduct all written ballot voting. After the votes have been counted, said ballots shall be turned over to the Sec. Voting shall be based on 1 vote for each 10 members of a club or fraction thereof.
- 14. Solicitation or sale of club items with the exception of the host club is prohibited.
- 15. All convention sessions and events shall be smoke free. Smoking areas shall be defined by city ordinance.
- Invitations to host the 2021 MD5 Convention shall be mailed to S/T Michael Brand 1904 Burlington Drive, Unit #1 West Fargo, ND 58078 or submitted to the Registration Desk at Hilton Garden Inn no later than Sat. May 30, 9AM.

Official Notice of the 2015 MD5 Convention

The official convention rules should be reviewed by your club officers and explained to your delegates. Voting is by Lions Clubs International rules. There will be one vote for each 10 members of major fraction thereof, 5 being considered a major fraction. For a club to be in good standing, all debts to LCI of \$50 or more, 90 days past due must be paid.

Your club credentials form is very important. Delegates and alternates must be selected. The form should be presented to: **Credentials Committee** at the Lions Registration Desk at "Hilton Garden Inn" upon arrival at the convention but no later than 11:45 Saturday, May 30.

The Lion contest forms should be given to your delegation to be presented to the **Convention Committee Chairman** at the

"Hilton Garden Inn." The basis for Most Miles Traveled Contest is for clubs 25 and under in members and 26 and over in members. For the Most Lions Miles Contest points are awarded on the basis of 3 for a Lion, 2 for a Lions' spouse, and 1 for each child in attendance. The points are totaled and multiplied by your round-trip mileage to Fargo. In completing these forms only count those that have pre-registered.

The properly Certified MD5 Lions attending the convention may vote on proposed changes to the MD5 Constitution and Bylaws. The Proposed changes can be found on the MD5 web site at www.md5lions.org. A copy of the Fargo convention proceedings may be obtained from the MD5 web site, 3 months after the convention.
