BE A LEADER CLUB

The KENNEL REDESIGN PROJECT being conducted by Leader Dogs for the Blind is moving along pretty well. Leader Dog needs to raise \$14.5 million to make major upgrades and renovations to the kennel facility and they have asked the Lions of North America to help by raising \$3 million toward that goal. As of December 1, about one-third has been pledged by North American Lions.

North and South Dakota has been designated as Sector 20 for this effort with **Bruce Schwartz** as coordinator. **Donna Wetz** holds that position in 5SW. Please contact your coordinators to arrange for a presentation to your club about the Kennel Redesign Project and how your club can get involved.

A gift of \$5000 or more may be paid over a five-year period. Gifts under \$5000 may be satisfied over three years. Gifts (or pledges) may be paid in a lump sum or any pre-arranged manner. The folks at Leader Dog say that "We will work with you on pay-

ment options that work best for you. We will not turn down money."

One of the primary incentives or gifting levels is the Leader Club. To become a **Leader Club** requires a minimum pledge of \$7500 which may be paid over five years. Clubs that are unable to work toward Leader Club status are encouraged to contribute an amount that "fits their pocketbook." Pledges in sector 20 have ranged from \$50 to \$10,000.

As of Dec. 15, six section 20 clubs have become **Leader Clubs**. They include: **South Forks** Lions Club of Grand Forks with \$8460, **Bismarck** Lions Club with \$10,000, **Elgin** Lions Club with \$7500, **Palace City** Lions Club of Mitchell with \$7500, **Magic City** Lions Club of Minot with \$7500, and **Capital City** Lions Club of Bismarck with \$10,000.

The primary **Leader Club** goal for sector 20 is to have 15 **Leader Clubs**. A large number of clubs have indicated that they are planning to pledge to the Kennel Redesign Project effort at Leader dog. There will be information and materials available at the State Convention in Rapid City.
