Newsletter Options

iscussion has begun about the future of this newsletter. Shortfalls in funding this year have led to consideration of possible changes. Currently the newsletter cost \$759 per issue with 11 issues at \$8349 for a four page newsletter. (A 6 page newsletter adds an additional \$162.50 per issue). A dues increase could solve the funding problem.

Potential Options:

- *Online publication costing \$1090 for 10 issues.
- *Newsletter every six weeks: 7 issues \$4500.
- *Newsletter every other month: 6 issues at \$3900.
- *Black and white printing: \$350 each month
- *Limiting publication to 9 issues: \$5850 or 10 issues: \$6500.

Publication Considerations:

- 1. Online publication will allow the newsletter to be much larger.
- 2. Will the online edition be read by Lions' membership?
- 3. Will fewer issues result in less information being distributed?
