he capital campaign to renovate the existing Leader Dog Kennel is in full swing. The Lions have reached \$1.6 million of the \$3 million goal in the first year.

"This is such a huge commitment from the Lions and it is coming in gifts of all sizes. Lions started Leader Dog and their support is still as important today as it was in 1939," Lion Mike Dengate, Lions capital campaign manager said.

The Canine Development Center is aptly named because it isn't just the kennel but houses puppy development, a vet center, breeding program and the staff and volunteers.

At any time, the facility will house up to 310 dogs and cover almost 80,000 square feet.

Directory Information


