Multiple District Constitution and Bylaws Proposals

1. Update the Duties of Officers to be current with LCI: Multiple District Council Chairperson. Insert: The multiple district council chairperson shall be the administrative facilitator of the Multiple District. All actions are subject to the authority, direction and supervision of the multiple district council of governors.

2. Multiple District Council Chairperson. Insert: Removal. At the request of the majority of the council of governors, a special meeting of the council may be called for

purpose of removal of the council chairperson. Regardless of the manner in which the council chairperson is selected or elected, the council chairperson may be removed from the council for cause by an affirmative vote of 2/3 of the entire number of the council of governors.

<u>3. Renumber bylaws section 2-13 to read section 3-14.</u>

4. Bylaws Article VI Section 1. Delete sentence 2, insert new sentence two. When the reserves of the undesignated funds reach a level of 60% of the previous years' expenses, the Council of Governors shall make a recommendation of a dues increase to the membership of the Multiple District, to restore within three years the undesignated funds to 70% of the 3rd year's expenses, which

shall be voted on at the next Multiple District Convention.

5. Constitution & Bylaws. In all articles of the Constitution and Bylaws, delete: All forms of wording of Multiple District Council Secretary/Treasurer. Insert: Multiple District Council Secretary and/or Multiple District Council Treasurer to comply with the content of the text.

6. Article VI-Multiple District Finances, Section 5-page 27. Delete: All wording after the words: in accordance with the. Insert: after the words in accordance with the—rates determined by the Council of Governors at the First Council meeting of the Fiscal Year and not to exceed the Rules of Audit of LCI currently in effect for District Governors.

<u>7.</u> Bylaws, Article VI, Section 1: Increase the per capita dues by \$2 per year in each of the next 3 years.
