Diabetes Awareness

I'm Linda Vollmer, 5SW and Multi District Diabetes Chair. Five years ago at the Piedmont Valley Lions Club Breakfast fundraiser, I was told my blood sugar needed to be checked by a doctor. So I called my doctor for a fasting blood glucose test and consequently I was started on medicine. That is why I am very interested in diabetes and volunteered to be the Diabetes Chair. Each month I will have a column titled "Dear Linda" and will answer questions on Diabetes.

Dear Linda:

Is it important to be check for Diabetes?

It is very, very important. High blood sugar is where the body either does not make enough insulin



or the body does not use the insulin correctly. The consequences are very serious. It can lead to heart problems, kidney dialysis, amputation of limbs vision problems and death. All it takes is a little pin prick. The short time could end up saving your life. Rethink and get tested.

Dear Linda:

<u>I was recently diagnosed with diabetes. What</u> <u>should I do?</u>

The first thing I would do is take a diabetes class. Ask your doctor or check at your hospital for dates and times of classes. Next I would go on line to Lions Clubs International at <u>www.lionclubs.org</u> and click on the diabetes site. They have lots of very good information. Also you can go to <u>www.diabetes.org</u> and that site will bring up loads of information. I also watch what I eat and exercise. Good Luck. Diabetes is very controllable.

I am a Lion and we are trying to increase the awareness of diabetes. We want people to be diagnosed early and be treated, so they will not get diabetes related complications.
