As a side note, the ceramic lion "Eyevan" was made by Lion Bev Drabek in the early 1980's. It was raffled off at a 5SW Fall Rally in Winner, SD with Virgie Gillette from Belle Fourche as the winner. Years later she brought it to a Charter Night to be auctioned off to raise money for a new Lions club. PDG Lion Jay Hendricksen bought it, and he was responsible for the cage being built around it. PDG Lion Jay then brought it to the State Convention to be auctioned off with the proceeds going to the South Dakota Lions Foundation. It later became "bouncing ball" where the club hosting the next year's state convention was expected to be the high bidder for the lion. News from the SD Lions Foundation...

Since the closing of our physical office in Rapid City we have had a storage unit there to keep eyeglasses until they can be transported to Sioux Falls. I know area Lions (Belle Fourche, Hot Springs, etc.) have all periodically taken glasses there for storage. Below is information regarding the unit and pictures for everyone's reference.

SD Lions Foundation Eyeglass Unit

Unit #281 at RCS Storage, which is on Fountain Plaza Drive to the east of Deadwood Avenue in Rapid City. There is a set of five buildings to the southwest across the street from the RCS main office. The unit is #281, and it is on the east end of the third building (close to the entrance). There is gated access to the area that uses a PIN code (#8765). It is five characters - you have to press the "#". There is a pressure sensor to open the gate when you leave, so you need to go in with a vehicle or you could get locked in. Put glasses in the unit when you collect them.


Directions from the interstate:

- (1) Exit onto Deadwood Avenue.
- (2) Go south to Commerce Road Stoplight.
- (3) Turn east onto Commerce Road.
- (4) Turn north onto Fountain Plaza Drive
- (5) Units are on left. Input Code on keypad (#8765) and drive through gate.
- (6) Unit #281 is on northeast end of middle building Padlock combination is 01917.
- (7) Pressure sensor opens gate again when leaving

Dakota Lions Sight & Health Headquarters Facility in Sioux Falls, SD

Since 1990, Dakota Lions Sight & Health (DLSH) has been dedicated to meeting our Mission of *Helping to Enable the Restoration of the Gifts of Sight & Health*. We are headquartered in Sioux Falls, SD and have remote offices in Rapid City, SD and Bismarck and Fargo, ND. We serve the people and communities of South Dakota, North Dakota, Northern Nebraska, and Western Minnesota through eye and tissue donation and transplantation.

DLSH partners with over 162 health care organizations in our service area to facilitate eye and tissue donations. Throughout our region nearly 70% of all licensed drivers are registered as organ, eye and tissue donors. On average, DLSH receives nearly 5,500 potential donor referrals per year. Of that number, roughly 25% are medically suitable candidates for donation upon initial screening.

Last year, we recovered tissue from 886 donors who were able to provide nearly 1100 corneas for sight restoration and over 15,000 gifts of bone, tendon, cardiovascular, and skin transplants to recipients worldwide. DLSH offers a variety of industry—leading advanced cornea processing services to meet the surgeon and patient needs. Recovered corneas are typically transplanted within 3-5 days of recovery. DLSH makes every effort to place donated corneas in our service area first and if they cannot be placed locally, we work with our partners nationwide and globally to help fill the needs of people wherever they may be.

We strongly believe that we could not accomplish our mission without the support of the donor families who give the ultimate lifesaving and enhancing gifts. DLSH is dedicated to providing compassionate support to our donor families through our family care program. Support is provided through calls, in-person meetings, letters and support resources. Each year, DLSH honors our donors and their families through regional tribute events. This event brings together the donor families, tissue recipients, as well as donation partners to honor and thank those who have given the precious gifts of sight and health.

This amazing work we do would not have been possible without the foresight of Lions who believed the Dakotas should have an eye bank. As early as 1963, the Lions of South Dakota began a grassroots effort that would help to establish the organization we have become today. While we are proud of our roots, we still need your voices and support as active and engaged members of the DLSH Board of Directors. As clubs throughout the region have struggled to maintain numbers, we too have felt the impact. At our October Board of Directors meeting, a Governance Committee made up of members from each of the 4 districts was established. One goal of the Committee is to implement strategies designed to attract, inform, and develop active and engaged board members. We look forward to sharing this work with you.
