Ron has been a teacher, a coach, a runner, home owners association leader, church member, collector car owner and life-time member of several veterans groups. # LIONS COMING TOGETHER



If you've looked at the agenda for the statewide convention, you've noticed an activity called "Lions Coming Together", in which visiting Lions are matched with local Lions for a tour of a nearby tourism site for the afternoon. How did this come about?

### DG Lion Ron explains:

This experiment is done in honor of Lion Ted Lawrence and his wife Gail who landed at the Rapid City Regional Airport about five years ago with no itinerary nor any expectations. They were just passing through with a three day lay-over. Ted called Lion Nathan Chicoine, then president of the Rapid City Downtown Club. Lion Nathan called Ron, wondering if he had the time and wondered if he might want to show these folks around a bit. "I will call them!"

That's all it took. Of all places, these folks were from Australia! I spent more than two full days with Ted & Gail, doing everything imaginable from breakfast at Mt. Rushmore to shopping at Walmart. They were thrilled and we became friends, remaining in contact to this day! Ted was with the Lions Club of Bassendean located near Perth on the western coast of the Continent of Australia. He had a long career as a merchant marine on the high seas. As a Lion he served in cabinet positions for District 201-W1 of Western Australia. He gave me one of his banners as we parted. I cherish the little banner as it hangs with pride and fond memories in my den.

# <u>From Lion Ted in Australia:</u>

You were very kind with your description of our 3 day visit, to your extraordinary Patriotic City. What an outstanding credit it is for Rapid City, to fund, build & display a bronze statue, of each & every American President. You did not mention that we were so ignorant of the weather & Seasons of South Dakota, that we turned up in summer clothes with nothing warm, whatsoever to wear, until you rescued us & took us to Walmart.

Your generosity of time to us, Ron, gave us a 110% total in-depth tour from your own local knowledge, far in excess of what we might have expected via a commercial tour. This will live in our hearts & memories always!

We have toured the world extensively during the 20 years prior to Covid, and often have reached out to Local Lions Clubs wherever we might be. Quite honestly, we have been overwhelmed with the warmth of friendship & hospitality continually extended to us. We have had Lions from various countries visit us, and 2 of our kids toured USA extensively, and we're equally embraced by Lions, plus "farmed out" to their families throughout USA.

This is a facet of Lions that is totally underused and undervalued, Ron. Lions could & should be able to travel the world extensively, and embrace the available hospitality of the Family of Lions. This is truly going to the "University of Life" as well as saving extraordinary sums of money, that is always imposed on tourists in General. Yes, many Lions attend widespread Conventions, but, they rarely stay, and take advantage of the available Lions Hospitality. If I were 20 years younger, Ron, the development of this as a World Wide Project would be very high on my agenda.



# **CONVENTION NOTES**

Sixty-nine Lions Clubs serving communities across South Dakota will rally in Rapid City on October 7 and 8 at the Ramkota Inn for their annual convention.

Among the highlights anticipated:

- <u>Anniversary celebrations</u>: In 2021,
   Downtown Lions Clubs in both Rapid
   City and Sioux Falls celebrated their
   100 Years of Service to South Dakota
   last year. Residents of those
   communities originally chartered these
   Clubs in 1921.
- Major service work recognized in the field of eyesight: In 1923, Helen Keller addressed the International Lions Convention asking Lions to be "Knights of the Blind". Lions from around the world heard that call. Lions have helped countless numbers of people with their vision needs. This past year alone, South Dakota Lions have collected and recycled over 60,000 pairs of eyeglasses. They have also provided over 40,000 free vision screenings for South Dakota children.
- <u>A Grant Remembrance</u>: Lions Clubs International's Global Foundation is "Lions helping Lions to Serve the

World." The very first grant of \$5,000 in 1972 was to assist with the recovery of flood victims in the Rapid City area and the South Dakota Black Hills. To this day, this flood remains one of the worst in US history, claiming 238 lives. The Mayor at the time of the Rapid City Flood was a 29-year-old Vietnam War Veteran by the name of Don Barnett. Former Mayor Barnett will be the Keynote Speaker at this year's convention. He will also have a vendor table, meet and greet the public, and will have a supply of his book, <u>Thorns</u> and Roses - Rapid City 1971 - 1973. available for purchase.
