### Lions Opportunities for Youth

Dear Lions of MD5:

I am Lion Tim Thueson, the new LOFY Chair, from the North Star Lions Club in Bismarck. I have been a Lion for 37 years and was a District Governor in North Dakota in 2000-2001.

The attached information concerns the Peace Poster Contest which must be in the hands of the District Governor by November 5. Also any individual who wants to apply for the MD5 International Youth Exchange scholarship must submit it to PDG Judy Beaudry by August 31, 2016.

## Peace Poster Contest

"A Celebration of Peace" is the theme for the 2016-17 Peace Poster Contest. Students, ages 11, 12 or 13 are eligible to participate.

Artwork must be no smaller than 13 X 20 inches and no larger than 20 X 24 inches. All artwork must be an original creation. Entries will not be returned. The international winner will receive a trip to the Lions Day at the United Nations in New York City and win \$2500. Merit winners will receive a cash prize of \$500.

Lions Clubs may purchase a contest kit from

the Club Supplies Sales Dept. of LCI no later than October 1. Clubs must have the winning poster to the District Governor by Nov. 5, 2016. Questions about this contest may be directed to Lion Tim Thueson, 701-250-9705.

## International Youth Exchange Scholarship

The Scholarship for \$1500 is available to any youth in MD5 from ages 16-20. If anyone is interested he or she should contact the District Governor for an application. This needs to be completed and postmarked by August 31, 2016.

- \*Hot Springs Lions Club members maintained the city pods by planting, watering and weeding; supported the Lions Mint program; set up chairs for the Miss SD Pageant, sold tickets and monitored the doors for the pageant.
- \* Newell Lions Club held a pancake supper benefit to raise money for people in need with over \$2300 raised; conducted a new officer training school.
- \*In Memoriam: Dana Caswell-Lead-Deadwood Lions Club.

- \*Ipswich Lions Club sponsored a local blood drive; served concessions at the annual Ipswich Trail Days Car Show on June 1; visited the Mobridge Lions Club to help them reorganize their club.
- \*Buffalo Lions Club held a blood drive on June 2; conducted a community wide bingo game; installed Lions Club front porch gutters; picked up trash on the road leading to the city dump.
- \*Downtown Lions Club assisted with ID checks at Summer Nights concert, assisted with registration at classic car show.



- \*Hills City Lions Club donated \$100 to Leader Dog; held a pancake breakfast to help rebuild the high school track and bleachers; assisted at a Keystone auction; donated to the Boy Scouts and gave \$250 to the Northern Plains Eye Bank.
- \*Onida Wheatland Lions Club donated \$1000 to the swimming pool improvement fund in Onida.
- \*Rushmore Lions Club donated \$3024 to the Black Hills Works.
- \*MD5 Constitution and Bylaws proposals which passed included a measure to increase the per capita dues of \$2 for each of next 3 years.
