Custer Lions Club Donate to WEAVE



Spearfish Lions Help to Publish Book Entitled "Grandpa's White Cane"

Visual impairment education has become a dynamic focus for Spearfish community member Jim Hoxie. Over the summer of 2020, the book *Grandpa's White Cane* was published with help from a dontaion by Spearfish Lions Club. The book was authored by Jim Hoxie and Joanna Jones and illustrated by Alex Portal. It is now available on Amazon as a paperbook edition as well as the kindle reader edition. The Spearfish Lions Club supported the project with a \$4,000 donation. This donation helped fund illustrations, graphic and format design as well as print setup for the book. One hundred classroom and library copies of the book were also made available.

White Cane Awareness Day is Oct. 15th each year. This book helps to understand the white cane and how essential it is to give blind and visually impaired people the ability to live an independent lifestyle. Since the book was published,750 copies have been printed. It has been sent to over 50 different institutions for visually impaired including Ft. Meade, VA and 20 additional VA sites across the nation. Jim and Linda Hoxie have given copies of the book to all 60 eye doctors at the Mayo Clinic. 














Bits & Pieces
