

District A9 Governor's Message

The Lions International theme for the 2023-2024 year, as announced by International President Dr. Patti Hill, is "Changing the World". This theme underscores the organization's commitment to making a positive impact on a global scale. The urgency of the situation is evident, as the world's needs are growing while the number of available volunteers is declining. Over the past five years, Lions membership has decreased, and this trend is not sustainable. In response to these challenges, International President Hill and the International Board of Directors have devised a program with specific goals to counteract the declining membership. The primary objective is to increase the global Lions membership to 1.5 million individuals. This goal emphasizes the importance of bringing in new members to the organization. It's a collective responsibility that each club and Lion must take seriously. Membership plans for the 2023-2024 Lions year have been communicated to all, and the call is for every Club and Lions to embrace their role in bringing new members into the organization. Recognizing that there's also a natural attrition of members each year, this factor should be considered while crafting the membership growth strategy plan.

To achieve this goal, each Zone is expected to achieve a 15% growth in membership. Zone Chairs and Cabinet are fully prepared to support and guide each club in exceeding their membership goals. This collaborative effort is rooted in the concept of change with purpose, enabling the continuation of impactful service with renewed passion.

Financial support is also a key component of this initiative. Each club is urged to donate a minimum of \$40 per Lion to LCIF Canada, which will contribute to the organization's service activities and humanitarian efforts. The emphasis on service is reflected in the expectation that 100% of clubs will report their service activities each month.

District A9 is highlighted as a model of achievement, having been the only District in Multiple District A (MDA) to reach the goal of reporting 100% of service activities. Additionally, District A9 exhibited the highest percentage of membership growth across all of Canada, earning recognition for its exceptional efforts.

Lions International is evolving to better support its clubs and members. A new role, the Global Extension Team (GET), has been introduced to focus on establishing new clubs, club extensions, and Leo clubs. The GET, led by Lion Vern Job, will collaborate with existing clubs and Zone chairs to facilitate the formation of new entities such as Branch Clubs, Leo Clubs and possible new Lions Clubs. The team will also assess underperforming clubs to what additional resources can be provided to support the Clubs to allow them to meet the performing levels required to have Clubs that will be able to serve their communities today and far in the future.

The challenges ahead are considerable, but the optimism and dedication of Lions in District A9 are clear. The shared passion for service is the driving force that will propel the organization toward accomplishing our ambitious goals. With Lions International's guidance and support, clubs and members are empowered to make a more profound impact than ever before.



The following is the official protocol of the International Association of Lions Clubs. Only the principal speaker is required to acknowledge all dignitaries present.

Order or Precedence

Lions shall be recognized in the following order

Explanation of notes used above

When more than one is present, they shall be recognized according to the Roman alphabetic order of the first letter of their family name. If the first letter is the same, go by the second, and so on. If the last names are identical, then the same process should be followed using the first given name, then the middle name. In the unlikely event the names are identical then the person with the longest association membership shall be given precedence.

When more than one present, the one who served most recently is given precedence, etc.

When more than one is present, precedence should be the same as for the international presidents (see b above). In the event more then one past international director who served in the same term is present then the criteria used for (a) should be used.

General Comments – When a Lion holds more than one title; he or she shall be recognized for the highest one. In areas that have positions to those listed above, they should be recognized in accordance with local customs, provided that elective officers always have precedence over appointed ones. It is recommended that Melvin Jones Fellows be recognized as a group. In introducing speakers their status as Melvin Jones Fellows should be mentioned.

Non-Lion Dignitaries

Non-Lion Dignitaries should be given precedence in accordance with local protocol and or custom, keeping in mind that if the non-Lion is the principal speaker, then he or she should be seated directly to the right of the chairperson.

Head Table Seating

The presiding officer or meeting chair person must always be seated at the most central seat at the table when there is no podium present, shown as seat number one in the following diagram (figure 1). The principal speaker would occupy seat number 2, then other Lion dignitaries in accordance with general order of precedence. If possible there should be the same number of seats to the right and left of the chairperson or presiding officer. (Audience)

As shown in figure 2, seating at a head table is essentially the same, except the meeting chairperson or presiding officer is always seated to the left of the podium facing the audience and the principal speaker at the right. (Audience)

When spouses are present, they should be seated to the member's left on the left side of the table and on the member's right on the right side of the table.

Master of Ceremonies and Meeting Secretaries

At some events, the master of ceremonies (emcee) will be someone other than the chairman or preceding officer. In such cases, the emcee should be seated in accordance with local customs. If; however, his or her place in the general order of precedence dictates a specific seat (e.g., a past president at a district function), then that should be the rule. On rare occasions, there will be a meeting secretary: again, local customs should rule.

Multi-Head Tables

If there is more than one head table, the table at the highest level shall be considered the primary one. Care should be taken not to seat Lions of the same rank at different tables.

Head Table Introductions

Introductions of the head table should begin with the meeting chairman or presiding officer, then continue from the person with the lowest rank on the order of precedence to the person with the highest. When spouse are present at the head table, they should be introduced with the member (e.g. Past International Director John Doe and his wife Jane).

National Anthems

When an official representative of the International Board of Directors (whether or not currently serving on the board) from another country is present at an event where national anthems are normally played, they should be extended the privilege of having their national anthem played.

The Flag Code

When flags of two or more nations are displayed they should be flown from separate staffs of the same height and the flags should be of approximately equal size. International usage forbids the display of the flag of one nation above that of another nation in time of peace.

When the flag is displayed otherwise than by being flown from a staff, it should be displayed flat, whether indoors or out, or so suspended that its folds fall free as though the flag were staffed.

When used on a speaker's platform, the flag, if displayed flat, should be displayed above and behind the speaker.

When three flags are flown together, the Canadian flag should occupy the central position, with the next ranking flag to the left and third ranking to the right, as seen by the spectators in front of the flags.

When displayed from a staff in a church or public auditorium, the flag of Canada should hold the position of superior prominence, in advance of the audience, and in the position of honour at the clergyman's' or speakers' right as he faces the audience. Any other flag so displayed should be placed on the left of the clergyman or speaker or to the right of the audience.

When used in connection with the unveiling of a statue or monument, the flag should form a distinctive feature during the ceremony, but the flag itself should never be used as the covering for the statue.

Invitation/Reception for District Officers/Guests

Club officers often ask for direction on how to properly receive and entertain District Governors, Zone Chair or other distinguished non-Lion guests visiting their club in an official capacity.

Here are a few suggestions for guidance:

- 1. The speaker or guest should be contacted well in advance of the event. The guest should be informed of the **date, time, place and the special occasion** to which he/she is being **invited to speak**. Discuss with guest the approximate length of the address. Be sure to provide adequate information regarding the type of dress (formal, informal or casual) and whether spouse is invited. When the guest accepts the invitation please confirm immediately. At least one week prior to the event, contact the guest or speaker to confirm the details.
- 2. The **visiting dignitary** should be the **only speaker** at the club's meeting. The agenda should provide sufficient time for the delivery of his/her address.
- 3. **Except** for the Tail Twister's hour (**the guest shall not be fined**), only the usual message of welcome and the introduction should precede the guest's address.
- 4. A Lion should be appointed well ahead of time to introduce the speaker. The biography of the guest or other pertinent information should be obtained prior to his/her visit so that he/she can be properly introduced. The introduction (about one minute) should include a brief biography of the speaker and the subject of his/her talk.
- 5. A Lion should be appointed well ahead of time to express thanks to the guest on behalf of the club. A simple sincere thank you is usually enough. Some interesting points from the content of the presentation should be

included. **Be brief**. It is the custom of the district to present the guest speaker with a gift or a cheque to a Lion's project of his/her choice.

- 6. The guest should not have to pay for his/her luncheon or dinner.
- 7. If the guest is an officer of the District, he/she is required to meet with the club directors and make a report on the operation of the club.
- 8. A few days after the guest's visit, express your club's appreciation by means of a letter.
- 9. There is an Official Protocol procedure for International guests available from the Past International Director or the District Governor.
- 10. When your speaker is an International Guest, it is customary for their National Anthem to be played before their introduction. CDs are available from Lions International or through your District Governor.

Communication Procedures on the Death of a Lion

When a Lion member dies, the **Club President** or other responsible member should obtain the following information from the family of the deceased.

- 1) Name, location and phone number of the Funeral Home.
- 2) If a Lions ceremony is to be held, time and date.
- 3) Order of dress vest, business suit, official Lion's dress, etc.
- 4) Time, place and date of funeral.

5) Special family requests.

The Club President or designate should offer the Lions Memorial Service to the family. Suggest to the family that this is non-denominational and brief. It can be held either before or after the visitations so that it doesn't interfere. This is a chance for our Lions family who served with the deceased an opportunity to honour them. This service may be conducted by the District Governor, District Officers or Club Members. It is suggested that Club Members close to the family be involved.

The Club President or club designate contacts the District Governor. If not available, contact the next available District officer (1st Vice District Governor, 2nd Vice District Governor) who will contact the Cabinet Secretary to send an email to all District Officers and clubs in our District.







The Lions organization was founded in 1917, and its membership was exclusively male, like most service club organizations of its time. As Lions

grew, women – particularly Lion spouses – embraced the Lions mission of service and began forming auxiliary clubs. Because of their success, **Lions Clubs International developed the Lioness Program and emblem in 1975**, officially recognizing and supporting the auxiliary program. The Lioness Program continued to grow until 1987 when the International Board of Directors amended the Lions Club Constitution to admit both men and women. Lions Clubs International continued supporting the Lioness Program until 1991, at which time it was determined that Lioness could be better served by the association as Lions. Lioness can start their own Lions club and use "Lioness" in their club name.

District A-9 gathered up the local Lioness Club (I believe 14 clubs) and formed District A-9 Lioness in 1985. A-9 as well as other districts continued to support the Lioness Program. As of June 30, 2021 Lioness clubs will no longer be recognized around the world. Note: A-9 had 4 Lioness clubs in this final year. Many Lioness are joining their local Lions Club, some Lioness Clubs are forming their own Lions Clubs and some are joining a newly organized club called the Swans and sadly some Lioness have just quit. The Lioness have always been great volunteers, serving together with Lions and community to make our communities and the world a better place to live. They had their own fundraisers and donated to the same charities as the Lions. We, as Lions and residents of A-9 cannot thank the A-9 Lioness enough for all their dedication and service.
