#### **Paws for Thought**

I received a call from Vijay, my Leader Dog Adviser in December. She wanted to know if I could pick up a puppy to raise that month. I was tempted, but I'm still not walking well enough to raise a puppy yet. I told her that I can't right now, but hope to be able to get a FLD to raise in the spring. She said she understood and hoped to see me then, but she was in need of puppy raisers because they had 70 puppies to train. 70 PUPPIES! Puppy nirvana!

#### What do I need to start my application to raise a puppy?

Leader Dogs will ask for some basic information about you, your household, your other pets (if applicable) and any previous experience you might have. One important thing to note is that if you do have other dogs in your home, you'll need to be able to show that they have current rabies, distemper and leptospirosis vaccines (all of which are commonly administered).

#### What happens after I send in my application?

Once Leader Dogs get your application, they review everything and confirm your vet records. You can usually expect to hear back from them in about 1–2 weeks, but the wait time will often be shorter if your application is filled out completely and includes your vet records when you submit it.

#### Do I get to name my puppy?

Yes! Your puppy's name is your choice. It's helpful for your puppy to keep it short and simple, but you are welcome to get creative (within reason). I know of Puppy Raisers that have a theme for names for the puppies they raise. One names all her puppies after candy, one after Star Wars characters, and of course, I name mine after beer. Molson Golden, the Golden Retriever (Molson), Yuengling Porter, a black Lab (Porter), Killian's Red, a Golden/Lab mix (Killian) and I'm hoping for a female to name Stella Artois (Stella).



#### The A B C's of LCIF

The devastating California wildfires have destroyed homes, taken lives and displaced countless families. In the face of this unimaginable loss, Lions are stepping up. To date, IP Fabricio and LCIF Chairperson Dr. Patti Hill awarded US\$130,000 in grant funding to support Lions in their relief efforts to support Lions on the ground as they provide vital aid. The official award email was just sent to the Lions of MD 4. We want to acknowledge the challenges we're facing with limited to no access to burned areas, as they remain unsafe. Rest assured, everyone at LCIF, along with our dedicated Lions on the ground in California, is working diligently to provide relief and support to affected communities.

#### Here is what we know so far:

- Lions in impacted areas are working hard to assess needs, identify opportunities to assist their communities, and mobilize grant funds. The Lions of California have quickly established a disaster relief committee and are actively coordinating efforts.
- Skilled Lions from previous wildfire responses are being mobilized to assist impacted districts.
- Equipment acquired through the LCIF Preparedness Grant, including disaster trailers, is being deployed to affected areas.
- Multiple district and district leadership teams are collaborating to evaluate the situation, determine needs, and support fundraising efforts.
- Lions are leveraging partnerships with key disaster response organizations, such as the Red Cross and other agencies, to strengthen efforts.

As you can imagine, the situation remains challenging, with ongoing hazards, curfews, and restricted areas. Responding to a disaster of this magnitude takes time, but Lions of California are actively in communication with shelters and first responders to assess needs and provide support where possible.

Many of you have asked "what about North Carolina?" Well as you are aware the News Media has moved on. BUT, I can guarantee you that Lions and LCIF are still there and will continue to be there to support the needs of the families that experienced the devastating floods. You may hear rumors that FEMA is pulling out which is **absolutely not true**. FEMA does rotate Teams in and out like their Initial Incident Response or Search and Rescue Teams, but they too will be on the ground in NC for many years to come.

Now that we are into the second half of this Lion year, District Governor Galen has asked us to focus on service initiatives related to Childhood Cancer and the Environment. Many clubs already have annual service projects related to these two causes or make donations to organizations that do work in these areas. Whether or not your club already is involved with a project that supports these causes, DG Galen hopes you will consider new opportunities this spring.

At this month's District Cabinet Meeting, formal action is expected to establish a coordinator and/or committee focused on Childhood Cancer. DG Galen has already recruited a group of interested Lions to serve on this committee. His hope is to have the clubs in each zone work together on a fundraiser in March or early April. The money raised from these fundraisers will be donated to Four-Diamonds through the *PA Lions Care - For The Kids*.

DG Galen is encouraging clubs that are looking for a relatively easy service Environment-related project to consider the *NexTrex Recyling Challenge Program*. Several clubs in District 14-C are already participating in this program. The program involves collecting soft plastic bag, such as grocery store bags, bread bags, and home delivery packaging. Clubs can work individually or with other clubs in their zone to gather and bundle this plastic, and then deliver it to a drop-off center in their area. This plastic is then recycled in to Trex outdoor furniture and decking products. If your group can collect 1,000 pounds of plastic in a 12-month period, you can receive a Trex bench for your community.
