

A Message From the 1st Vice District Governor




Fellow Lions, Lioness/Lions and Leos:



New Lions Portal Information

Not much information has been released yet, but we are being told all reporting will be done from one landing page. No more jumping back-and-forth between MyLCI and MyLion. LCI is stressing the importance of making sure the member information in MyLCI is up-to-date and accurate prior to the roll-over to the new portal, which is expected sometime between July 1 and September 30, 2023.

It is highly recommended that Club Secretaries run the *Membership Information Update Report* for your club from MyLCI. This report will give you a page for each member that contains the information on file for them in the MyLCI database. Members can review their page, make necessary updates, and return the paper to you so you can make the necessary updates in MyLCI. Please encourage members to include an email address, which will be needed to access the new Lions Portal. Email is also the primary way members receive information from LCI and District 14-C.

We Serve!

From the desk of PDG Dennis Cope, Global Service Team (GST) Coordinator

As we come to the end of another Lion year, I am excited to see how close we come to achieving District Governor Keith's goals. We have already surpassed his service reporting goal of 80% of clubs reporting, but as I've stated previously, my goal is 100%. I am confident we will achieve that goal! What I'm really eager to see are the totals that result from that reporting and how it compares to previous years. It's always impressive to see the sum of the collective efforts of our Lions Clubs.

Past Council Chair Terry Hartzell from the Lions Club of Mechanicsburg recently shared a though-provoking "obituary" with me. It is a *fictitious* obituary for a Lions club. I have highlighted a few key parts of the obituary to emphasize some of the issues that lead to the club's demise:



"After 76 years of service to our community, our club was forced to close. As our community changed, we were slow to adapt and we saw fewer people requesting to join our club. Because we wanted only quality members, we did not actively recruit new Lions. We focused upon retention, so we continued doing what our existing members wanted to do. When we declined in membership, we felt that if we just kept serving, all would be well. We felt that our Service spoke for itself and we did not want to appear prideful, so we did not aggressively promote our club in our community. We continued with the same projects and found that fewer people were interested in participating in them. As we aged, we were not able to continue with some of our traditional projects so we focused more on writing checks and less on hands-on service. Covid came and we could not meet in person so we lost contact with some of our members. After Covid, we continued to meet for lunch and enjoyed each other's fellowship, but outsiders were not attracted to our small group of close friends. Starting a branch did not appeal to us as we wanted to stay in our comfort zone. As our numbers dwindled, we repeated our officers, and when my wife and I tired of being the President and Secretary/Treasurer, and no one else stepped up, we decided to stop meeting and close the club."

Does this obituary remind you of your club? If it does, it's not too late to make changes. Your club is not yet dead, and it can be rejuvenated. Just ask the folks at Pinchot Park Lions Club, which started this Lion year with 5 member and now has 15 members! You can rejuvenate your club, and the District 14-C leadership stands ready to help. Next month, my article will contain some ideas to bring life back to your club. Until then, here are 5 more service project ideas for your club to consider.

Shift request will be mailed to all club secretaries and are assigned on a first come first serve basis so get them back to me as soon as you can. You can save on postage by replying by email to buddyrot@comcast.net. Every participant will get a 30-minute lunch break at the discretion of the gate captain and rain gear may be necessary.

Shifts:

Shifts are from 11 am to 4 pm and from 4 pm until closing Friday, Saturday and Sunday and 12 noon until 4 pm and 4 pm until closing Monday – Thursday.

What we do:

Scan entry, parking and show tickets using a wired or wireless scanner- Hand out brochures when possible- Put reentry wrist bands on customers when available and requested- Give directions to customers (brochures)- Conduct yourself as a courteous, helpful person at all times.

What we don't do:

Handle money- Remove wrist bands- Act in a loud boisterous manner- Tell any fair employee how to do their job.

Who can participate:


