This is an exciting time to be a Lion in District 14-C. We have kicked off our vision screening initiative with the purchase of a screening device, and we conducted our first screenings in June.



MEMBERSHIP WORKSHOPS - GROWING YOUR CLUB'S MEMBERSHIP

It's no secret that many of our clubs are struggling to maintain and grow their memberships. During the past year, District 14-C had a net membership loss of over 50 members. This has been an ongoing problem over the past several years. It's time for us to reverse this trend!

Four Broad Goals

The district's Global Membership Team (GMT), under the leadership of Zone Chair C.R. Lloyd, spent much of the 2015-16 Lions year developing a strategy to grow the district's membership. A key part of that strategy is to engage and assist each club in developing a comprehensive membership growth plan base on four broad goals established by the district. Those goals are:

1. *Retain current members*
2. *Recruit new members*
3. *Provide proper orientation to all members regarding the Lions organization*
4. *Promote the Lions organization to increase visibility and awareness of the organization.*

The way our GMT will engage and assist our clubs is by conducting a membership growth workshop several times in various locations throughout the district during the coming year. **The GMT strongly encourages every club to send a membership team consisting of 3-5 members to one of these workshops.** Each workshop will last approximately 4 hours and will include lunch.

Action Planning

At the workshop, the GMT will present the district's membership growth strategy and goals. Following this, the participants will be introduced to a process known as "Action Planning." Participants will have an opportunity to practice this process while brainstorming and developing ideas for actions related to each of the district's 4 broad goals. Resources available from LCI and from the PA Lions will be presented, and teams will leave the workshop with the start of a comprehensive plan to grow their clubs' membership.

is scheduled for a Saturday morning starting at 9:00 a.m. and ending at 1:00 p.m. As mentioned before, each workshop will include lunch. **There is not cost to the club for this workshop other than transportation to and from the location.**


