I was very anxious about how the COVID-19 pandemic would affect Lions Clubs International Foundation contributions. Here was something that was changing the world, and there never was any doubt LCIF would be doing what they do best, helping Lions serve their communities.

Worldwide LCIF has awarded 340 grants worth over \$5 million for our clubs to supply masks, face shields, gloves, even beds for hospitals during the pandemic. Many First Responders in the United States were supplied PPE items from local Lions Clubs to protect their crews and patients. In Pennsylvania alone, LCIF has awarded \$60,000 to 6 of our Districts to serve their communities during the pandemic.

In the spring I contacted many of our 14-C clubs to ask for their support, if possible, to LCIF for Disaster Relief. I was aware fundraisers were cancelled, but we needed to act quickly to help slow down the spread of the Coronavirus. We raised nearly \$5,000 earmarked for COVID-19 grants from that request.


District Governor Steve Shipman asked me at the beginning of his term to set a goal for LCIF donations for the year and I recommended \$42,000. We ended the year with **\$47,300** in 14-C contributions which surpassed our goal. This amount led all 17 Districts in Pennsylvania for the second year in a row.

I thank all our 14-C clubs and members for your thoughtfulness and caring in the support of Lions Clubs throughout the world by contributing to Lions Clubs International Foundation.

2019-2020 END-OF-YEAR VISION SCREENING PROJECT REPORT

Thanks to the outstanding efforts of our clubs and members, and despite the cancellation of many screenings this Spring, District 14-C once again increased the number of individuals receiving vision screenings by Lions. The total number of vision screenings reported to the committee for this year was 2,468 with 1,540 of those individuals being age 6 months to 6 years old. That's an increase of over 841 individuals from last year!

Of those screened, approximately 13.5% were referred to an eye-care professional for a complete examination. That means Lions identified 331 individuals who should see an eye-care provider and who potentially needed treatment. Of those 331, 207 were 6 years old or younger. What a gift!

24 clubs participated in (or were scheduled to participate in) vision screenings this year., which is 4 more than last year! Those clubs, by zone, are as follows:

Zone 1A: East Berlin, Hanover, Littlestown, New Oxford, West Manheim Township

Zone 1B: Apple City Leo, Arendtsville, Gettysburg, York Springs

Zone 2A: Mt. Holly Springs, Newville, Painfield

Zone 3B: Shiloh, Weiglestown

Zone 4A: Kreutz Creek Valley, Windsor

Setting goals for the 2020-2021 Lions year is a little tricky given the uncertainty of the on-going pandemic. The Vision Screening Committee hopes to see at least 2,000 individuals screened between now and June 30, 2021. The committee hopes all of the clubs that participated last year will work to conduct screenings at the same locations as last year.

FREE VISION EXAMS AND GLASSES THROUGH VSP


A good supply of VSP certificates remains available for use this Summer and Fall. These certificates were made available to us from our Lions Club International Foundation (LCIF) in cooperation with Vision Services Providers (VSP). The certificates can be used for either a child or an adult to cover the cost of a basic vision exam and glasses through a participating provider.

Each Zone Chair has a supply of certificates to distribute to the clubs in his or her zone as needed. *We are hoping to use all available certificates before they expire in November*. An application for more certificates will be submitted when the current supply is used or expires, but there is no guarantee we will get them.

If your club receives a request for assistance, please contact your zone chair or PDG Dennis Cope, Vision Screening Committee Chair, to secure a VSP Gift Certificate. You will receive the certificate along with instructions and locations of participating providers.



As seen in the Community Courier, the Dover Lions Club presented three \$1,000 scholarships to members of the class of 2020.


Lions Scholarship Winners Posted
