Lions, Lionesses, and leos,



FIRST DISTRICT CABINET MEETING SCHEDULED

Our District Cabinet will meet on Saturday, August 17, at the Dover Fire Hall, 30 East Canal St. in Dover, from 9:30 until about noon. All presidents and secretaries are strongly encouraged to attend or send a representative, and all Lions, Lioness, Leos, and guests are welcome.

You might want to show up early, as we will have coffee and various treats available at 9:00.

Necessary business is conducted, but most of all you have the opportunity to connect your club with other clubs in serving in our district and around the world. You will be able to share with your club what Lions are doing and how in District 14-C our diversity is our strength. And you will have the opportunity to meet and talk with the leaders of our district Lions projects.

2018-2019 END-OF-YEAR VISION SCREENING PROJECT REPORT

Thanks to the outstanding efforts of our clubs and members, District 14-C once again increased the number of individuals receiving vision screenings by Lions. The total number of vision screenings reported to the committee for this year was 1,627, with 1,375 of those individuals being age 6 months to 6 years old. That's an increase of over 400 individuals from last year!

Of those screened, approximately 15% were referred to an eye-care professional for a complete examination. That means Lions identified 248 individuals who should see an eye-care provider and who potentially needed treatment. Of those 248, 206 were 6 years old or younger. What a gift!

20 clubs performed one or more screenings this year. Those clubs, along with the number of screening events they conducted, are as follows: Apple City Leos (1), Arendtsville (4), Dallastown (6), Dillsburg (2), Dover (1), East Berlin (2), Gettysburg (1), Mason Dixon (1), Mechanicsburg (6), Mt. Holly Springs (5), New Oxford (3), Newville (3), Plainfield (3), Shiloh (1), Shrewsbury Area Centennial (3), Spring Grove (2), Stewartstown (1), Weiglestown (2), Windsor (1), and York Springs (1).

For the 2019-2020 Lions year, the Vision Screening Committee has set two goals. First we hope to see at least 2,000 individuals screened between now and June 30, 2020. Second, we hope one club in each zone that has not yet participate in the vision screening project will conduct a screening. In addition to these goals, the committee hopes all of the clubs that participated last year will conduct screenings at the same locations as last year and also work to identify at least one additional opportunity to conduct screenings.

The vision screening process is easy, and the equipment is not difficult to use. It only takes a handful of members and a little bit of effort. If you club is interested in learning more, please contact PDG Dennis Cope (dennis.cope@icloud.com, 717-677-6283)

FREE VISION EXAMS AND GLASSES THROUGH VSP

Only a few days remain to use this year's supply of VSP certificates, which expire on August 15th. These certificates were made available to us from our Lions Club International Foundation (LCIF) in cooperation with Vision Services Providers (VSP). The certificates can be used to cover the cost of a basic vision exam and glasses through a participating provider for either children and adults.

The District was awarded 80 certificates. Each Zone Chair was given 10 certificate to distribute to the clubs in his or her zone as needed. We are hoping to use all 80 certificates before they expire. An application for 80 more certificates will be submitted, but there is no guarantee we will get them.



If your club receives a request for assistance, please contact your zone chair or PDG Dennis Cope, Vision Screening Committee Chair, to secure a VSP Gift Certificate. You will receive the certificate along with instructions and locations of participating providers.

LIONS CLUB INTERNATIONAL PEACE POSTER CONTEST

Attention District 14-C: In the near future, we will be hearing the sound of school bells ringing, signifying that the start of school is just around the corner!

What a perfect time for your club to seek out a school or another youth organization such as the Scouts, a Youth Center, a 4-H group, a church youth group, etc. to offer the opportunity to them of creating posters for the Lions Club International Peace Poster Contest. Now is the time, Lions of District 14-C, to order your kits for the Peace Poster Contest for 2019-2020. The theme is “Journey of Peace.” It could be the inception of a wonderful relationship being established between your Lions Club and the school or other organized group of children that your club is sponsoring.



So, with this in mind, ask for a “volunteer” from your club to chair the Peace Poster Contest. It really only takes one club member. I am happy to help in any way I can. I would love to come and speak with your club and even go along to the school, etc. to share information about the Peace Poster Contest with the teacher and/or advisor. We had 6 clubs from our district participate in the contest last year. How awesome is that! Now, let’s see if we can grow that number to 8 or 10 clubs!

The important information for you to know includes the following:

- The Peace Poster Contest is open to children ages 11-13 as of November 15.
- Each poster is judged on originality, artistic merit, and expression of the theme.
- Posters advance through several judging levels: local, district, multiple district, and international.
- At the international level, judges from the art, peace, youth, education and media communities select one grand prize winner and 23 merit award winners.
- One international grand prize winner will receive \$5,000 and a trip to a special award ceremony at the International Convention. Each of the 23 merit award winners will receive a cash award of \$500 and a certificate of achievement.

Order a kit online at www.lionsclubs.org. Click on SHOP, type in and click on Peace Poster Contest Kit, and order your kit or call Club Supplies at (630)571-5466 or 1-800-710-7822. (The staff is very helpful.) The cost of the kit is \$11.95 plus shipping. Lions Clubs around the world are, also, encouraged to sponsor students in the Lions International Essay Contest. The essay contest was created to offer the opportunity to visually impaired young people to express their ideas of world peace. The theme of the 2019-2020 International Essay Contest is “Journey of Peace.” Students who are visually impaired and who are ages 11-13 as of November 15 are eligible to participate. The essay contest rules and application form are included in the Peace Poster Kit and can, also, be found by searching Lions Club International Peace Essay Contest.

Kindness Matters

Kindness is a simple but powerful thing. It can be as small as a smile or a wave, or as big as sponsoring a child. Even if you don't realize that you are doing it, that can still make someone's day. Kindness matters more than you think.

My name is Mikayla and I have been legally blind since the age of two. I had a rare cancer called bilateral retinoblastoma, which is a cancer that affects both of the eyes. Because of that cancer I had to lose my left eye and lost most of my vision in my right eye. It was this tragedy that taught me the lifeline of kindness. How to be thankful for what I have instead of wanting more. During my cancer journey, my parents had to quit their jobs and be at the hospital with me all the time. I'm so thankful to all the people that held our hands through it all, by donating toys, blankets and money so that our family could stay on our feet.

It is because of that experience I am on a mission to change the world with kindness. By helping others through their dark times like they helped me through my cancer. In the past, I have written a letter to the Prime Minister of Australia in hopes I would change his decision of not allowing the refugees in to his country. Taking their sanitation, food and water away from the refugee camps so that they would leave his country is intolerable. Hopefully my letter was the smallest bit of a difference, people like that need to change. Also, I organized a fundraiser at my school, to buy teddy bears for the orphan and abandoned children in Haiti. Because I believe every child deserves something to hold on to and love. I know that the world needs more of that kindness, to live in peace and friendship, without war or abuse. For everyone to believe they are truly safe and happy. Sometimes life can be tough and you might feel like the whole world is against you, believe me as a stubborn legally blind girl it has happened more than once. If you just keep being kind to one another, it can make yours and everyone's world brighter. If the whole world was filled with smiles and laughter, everything would be great. One day everyone will believe in their hearts, that kindness really truly matters.



LCIF REPORT, PDG KERRY MCKNIGHT, DISTRICT 14-C COORDINATOR



I sincerely thank all Lions District 14-C members, clubs, and IPDG Lisa for the GENEROUS support that was shown to Lions Clubs International Foundation's "Campaign 100" this past 2018-2019 Lions year. Your District 14-C led our state and ranked 9th in the USA in contributions to the program. Our 14-C donations totaled \$65,700. This was nearly twice the amount of the second place District in MD-14. We were also the only District in Pennsylvania, 1 of 13 in the USA, achieving 100% club participation in support of LCIF for 2018-2019. Donations ranged from \$5 to \$4,600. Every single contribution was greatly appreciated. Your generosity improved someone's life.

The support we give as a District to fellow Lions worldwide is important to the service they need to perform. In the USA alone, Lion's served 26 million people. We increased our assistance to Childhood Cancer victims by 175% and the aid to people with Impaired Vision rose by 50%. Each and everyone of our members in District 14-C played a huge role in providing these services to the less fortunate. We have now entered the 2nd year of "Campaign 100". I am confident our individual members and clubs will continue to play their important role as a proven leaders in supporting Lions Clubs International Foundation.






