
FIRST DISTRICT VICE GOVERNOR 14-C THOMAS L. JONES - STEWARTSTOWN LIONS CLUB

What an honor it was to share the beautiful Peace
Posters and introduce the outstanding students
who created them at our District 14-C Cabinet
meeting on Saturday, February 22, 2020!
This year's theme for our Peace Poster Contest
was "Journey of Peace." There were 165 entrants
(our largest number, ever) from our district with
four Lions Clubs participating by sponsoring
a group of students. The children did an
extraordinary job in using their creativity, their
talent, and their insightfulness in demonstrating
the theme in their posters. With the 2019/2020

year, the Lions International Peace Poster Contest has reached its 32nd birthday! It continues to grow in popularity so much that over 600,000 children in 75 countries participate in it, annually. Children of the ages 11, 12, and 13 are given this invaluable opportunity to share their vision of world peace through the creation of a poster.

In District 14-C, this year, we had 4 clubs that promoted the journey of peace by sponsoring and encouraging students to participate in the Peace Poster Contest. I want to exclaim a huge THANK-YOU and congratulate those clubs that put forth the effort to sponsor and encourage students to participate in the contest. The clubs that did participate in the sponsorship this year were: the Arendtsville Lions Club (including their Apple City Leo Club), the Dallastown Lions Club, the Jacobus Lions Club, and the Windsor Lions Club.

Let's meet our winners:

Our district's honorable mention winner is Natalie Keeren. Natalie is a 6th grade student at Bendersville Elementary School. The Arendtsville Lions Club sponsored Natalie. The Apple City Leo Club organized the Peace Poster Contest at Bendersville Elementary School. Fifty students participated from the school. In school, Natalie's favorite subject is Social Studies because she enjoys notetaking. In school, she participates in photography and helps to take care of the plants. Out of school, Natalie enjoys completing art projects. She aspires to study art and animation in college to prepare herself for a career in freelance animation. It was a very exciting year for District 14-C with the Peace Poster Contest! There were quite a few "first evers" for our district! And, what is better than first evers! Here they are:

- 1. We increased our number of students participating in the contest by 33 students and had our greatest # of participants ever!
- 2. We had a club for the very first time in their club's history sponsor a group of students. (Thank-you, Dallastown Lions Club.)
- 3. We had a club sponsor 2 contests, a contest in 2 different elementary schools. (Thank-you, Arendtsville Lions Club.)
- 4. We had a Leo Club organize a contest in a school. (Thank-you Apple City Leo Club sponsored by Arendtsville Lions Club.)

- 5. We had a zone chair invite me to come speak with their Zone about the Peace Poster Contest. (Thank-you Zone 4-A.)
- 6. We had a club come very close to sponsoring a group of students and, hopefully, that will come to pass this year. (Thank-you New Oxford Lions Club.)
- 7. And for the last amazing first ever: the honorable mention winner in last year's contest at the club level went on to complete a new poster for this year's contest and won first place at the club level and third place in the district level competition. (Thank-you Sophia Papayannis.) Talk about perseverance and the pursuit to achieve!

I hope all of these successes will encourage more clubs to get involved in the contest for this year. The theme for 2020/2021 is "Peace Through Service." This is not only a beautiful theme, but, it is the definition of Lionism. I cannot wait to see what the students create with this amazing theme!

ION POWER

Can you imagine a stranger approaching you, offering to fix your eyeglasses? Can you imagine that leading to life-changing surgery? Mr. Harry Spencer, a founding member of the Westgate Sunrise Lions Club and Master Optician, always carries an eye glass repair kit in his car with him. It enables him to do periodic good deeds and help total strangers like Cathie.

Cathie is the cashier at CVS where Harry would periodically pick up his medication. Harry would always notice her. Being a Master Optician, he would also notice her well-worn glasses which were often in need of repair. Harry would always do a quick repair or adjustment. One day, he realized the glasses were beyond repair. He kindly asked Cathie if she would mind if he submitted her name for a vision certificate. He explained the certificate would enable her to obtain an exam and new glasses at no cost to her. Cathie gratefully accepted and explained to Harry it had been ten years since she had an eye exam or new glasses. She admitted she struggled with seeing on a daily basis and had given up driving at night. Cathie did not have insurance and, as a single Mom, taking care of herself was not her first priority. The money simply was not there to purchase new glasses.

Hearing Cathie was open to being helped, Harry reached out to his friend Dr. Karena Strain of Clear Focus Eye Care of York. Dr. Strain, who is a member of the Weigelstown Lions Club, knew how the VSP Vision Certificates worked having used the program to help people in the community to obtain exams and glasses at no cost.

Dr. Strain's examination revealed she needed more than new glasses—she desperately needed cataract surgery. Without surgery, new glasses would make very little impact in her life. Knowing Cathie could not afford the surgery on her own, Dr. Strain explained the problem to Zone Chair, Lori Trimmer. Lori recalled a training she had attended with PDG Dennis on the use and availability of grants. While Lori takes great notes, she can't always find them, so she contacted Dennis who pointed her to the "Northeast Pennsylvania Lions Service Foundation" grant.

Lori completed the application and with the help of Dr. Strain, Dr. Jerome Benz (the Eye Surgeon), and Vickie (the Surgery Department Supervisor at Eyes of York) and their Staff, surgery costs were calculated and submitted to the "Northeast Pennsylvania Lions Service Foundation." In less than two weeks, Lori received the good news the grant was approved and a check for over \$4,000.00 was on its way to cover all of Cathie's surgery expenses. The York New Salem and Shiloh Lions accepted the check and distributed the funds to the appropriate individuals.

Dr. Benz's initial evaluation showed Cathie had a very strong prescription and her best corrected vision was 20/150 in each eye which is almost to the level of legal blindness. Cathie had cataract surgery near the end of December and is in the process of healing. At her last visit with Dr. Benz, Cathie was able to read 20/20 in the right eye and 20/25 in the left eye with only a minimal prescription. She will soon stop by the office of Dr. Strain to get those much-needed glasses. Cathie says the operation has changed her life, and she is "having a love affair with color now". She is deeply appreciative of the opportunity and says she cannot begin to express her gratitude.

Her life has changed for the better because one Lion cared and was prepared to do good and a pride of Lions cared and were prepared to help. Lions do make a difference.

At this year's Zone Social, we will be holding a charity auction to benefit Four Diamonds at Penn State Children's Hospital. In 2018, the Pennsylvania Lions initiated "Care for the Kids" to benefit Four Diamonds, with a goal of raising \$100,000 annually. This is our Pennsylvania Lions project to address Childhood Cancer, which is one of Lions Clubs International's five global service initiatives. It is also our District Governor's primary cause for this year.



Attendees will have an opportunity to bid on items donated by the clubs, individual Lions, and local businesses. Each club is asked to provide 3 items for the auction ranging in value from \$20 to \$50. Bidders will be making "blind" bids on most items and will not know what they might be getting if they have the winning bid. Therefore, donated items should be wrapped, or in a gift bag, perhaps in a way that gives a hint as to what is inside and definitely in a way that will make people want to bid on it.
