MESSAGE FROM THE DISTRICT GOVERNOR

But as I write this, nobody knows. As Dr. Fauci reminds us, the virus will determine that, and the virus isn't talking to anybody.

I still have a vision of starting specialty clubs for some of the ethnic communities in our district, even though that won't happen in my term. Wouldn't it be nice if we could start two or three new specialty clubs in DGE Tom's time? And wouldn't it be wonderful if we could double down on retaining members, so that every club can show at least a plus-one in membership at the end of his year?

Over the course of this year I have grown to appreciate even more the quality of people in our clubs. Yes, our clubs are very different from one another, in 14-C and around the world. And as our International President Dr. Choi reminds us, our diversity is our strength.

So while you are staying at home and washing your hands regularly, look for the needs of your neighbors. A small thing to you can be a big thing to the person you serve, and as 1.5 million Lions do little things around the world, they become a big thing.

Lions Marty and Phil along with the Zone Chairs have a wealth of experience and dedication. Together we have done great things. Together we will do even greater ones going forward.


TOM JONES, STEWARTSTOWN LIONS, ELECTED DISTRICT GOVERNOR

First Vice District Governor Tom Jones, Stewartstown Lions Club, is now District Governor-Elect for District 14 -C. Running unopposed, he scored a landslide victory in the District's officer elections, which were conducted via electronic ballot on Saturday, April 18, 2020. 78 Lions from 30 different clubs cast ballots in the election.

Electronic voting was necessary due to the cancellation of the District Convention. Though there were a few glitches, the election process went relatively smoothly. Those who were not able to vote electronically were given the opportunity to cast a paper ballot.

The election also included voting for First Vice District Governor and Second Vice District Governor. Second Vice District Governor Dan Brant, Newville Lions Club, and Lion Ortrun Gates, Plainfield Lions Club, ran uncontested for these positions and are now our First and Second Vice District Governors-Elect, respectively.

Congratulations Tom, Dan and Ortrun. We look forward to a productive 2020-2021 Lions year under your leadership.



ELECTION NEWS

All clubs need to complete elections for Lions Year 2020-2021 and update their officers on the MyLCI website by May 15th. Some guidance from LCI Legal on conduct of club elections follows:

All Lions clubs are permitted to conduct meetings via alternative meeting format. Therefore, they can conduct elections via phone, email, or any other method that will permit the Lions club to move forward.

Practically speaking, as each Lions club is an independent legal entity, it can conduct elections (or choose not to conduct elections) at the discretion of the club. Provided the decision is supported by the membership and no complaint is filed, the actions of the club will be accepted in good faith.


MECHANICSBURG LIONS CLUB "WE SERVE" GOLF TOURNAMENT

Congratulations to Joseph Critchlow, 13, from Liverpool, UK for his achievement in being the grand prize winner for this year's Lions International Peace Essay Contest for visually impaired youth. Joseph was sponsored by the Liverpool Lions Club in the UK. Joseph will receive \$5000 for his accomplishment. The theme for this year's essay contest was, "Journey of Peace." As you read his essay, you will learn about his search for finding the keys to his journey of peace. And, his realization, that we all have the keys to work together to make our world a safer and better world.

I looked at a world in conflict. Who could help me answer a question? How can we solve the world's problems? There seems no way as we fight each other in our neighborhoods, cities and countries for so many reasons. How can we journey to save our forest and oceans, if we don't have peace first?

I looked at my city, Liverpool, and wondered who could answer my peace question? I went to a City Gateway, Lime Street Train Station, and in my mind asked the statue of the great entertainer, Sir Ken Dodd, "How can we find peace?" I felt he said, "Share laughter, laugh together, happiness is a key."

I looked up at the Liver bird statues, a symbol of our City at a Gateway to the Oceans. I asked, "How can we find peace?" I felt they said to me, "We can see across the world and time, we can see the Statue of Liberty. Many people look at what is different, not the same, find what is the same and come together there. This is a key."

I went to the statue of John Lennon and asked, "How do we find peace?" I felt he said, "Give peace a chance. This is a key." I wondered, if just one person stopped and did just that, would others do the same? Could I be that "mustard seed" from which things grew? Could my voice be heard?

My journey to find an answer was complete. I looked at all my keys. Although I am visually impaired, I can lead the way, my voice can be heard, I can bring others together. I may not see you well, the color of your face or the clothes you wear, but, I can help the world find peace by example.

As Gandhi said, "There is no pathway to peace, peace is the pathway." Let me help lead you along that path by following my voice. Let us come together in things like music and sports as better ways to see we are just the same. It is from here we can work together in making a safer, better world. We all have the keys.

The theme for the 2020/2021 Lions International Peace Contest is "Peace Through Service." Lions Clubs around the world are encouraged to sponsor student in the Lions International Peace Essay Contest. Students who are visually impaired and who are of the ages 11-13 as of November 15 are eligible to participate. For the essay contest rules and applications form, please contact me.

The theme for the 2020/2021 Lions International Peace Poster Contest is "Peace Through Service." Hopefully, in the fall, we will have some beautiful and poignant posters being created. Please let me know if your club is in need of a Peace Poster Kit. I have a supply of them and will make sure you get one when our current travel restrictions have been lifted and we can celebrate the victory over COVID-19.

LCIF's Response to COVID-19

We as Lions are familiar with Lions Clubs International Foundation's (LCIF) Campaign 100 project. This 3 year program's goal is to raise \$300 million as a "Rainy Day Fund" in order to help keep Lions serving through whatever emergency life throws at the world in the future.

However, no one at LCIF anticipated the Coronavirus Pandemic worldwide emergency to strike during the middle of Campaign 100. Our campaign leadership is in the process of evaluating the impact that COVID-19 is having on Campaign 100.

LCIF has leapt to the forefront in aiding areas in the USA & the world affected by the COVID-19 crisis. In a short time LCIF has awarded **\$3 million towards 200 grants for Lions Clubs serving their communities** during this troubled time. These grants are used for Lions to work with local medical and emergency management services that are addressing the outbreak. This could be for sourcing medical supplies, quarantine-related expenses, etc. for those infected.

A great example I read about is Lions District 23 in Connecticut. They applied for a \$10,000 LCIF grant to supply gloves, face shields, disinfectant, and face masks to Volunteer Firefighters, State Troopers, Hospitals, and convalescent homes across their 4 county District. The Lions said they could never have accomplished such a relevant service project without LCIF's help.

Your foundation appreciates the Club, District & individual donations made to "Campaign 100". LCIF is encouraging donations to continue in order to give a helping hand to as many people as possible. In a bold move, our Lions leaders have begun partnering with Rotary, Kiwanis, and Optimist Clubs in serving together to ease the suffering during the Pandemic.


