Here is a listing of the positions that are currently vacant and a brief explanation of the responsibility:

Family and Women Membership Development Chairperson - This person works with the Global Membership Coordinator and focuses on ways to encourage membership growth by recruiting family members of current Lions club members and also more women.

Program and Facilities Chairperson - This person make helps secure locations for district meetings, at the direction of the District Governor. This person also maintains the district's property and equipment (such as flags, podium, banner, and sound system) and is responsible to have the proper items at each district meeting.

Public Relations and Lions Information Chairperson - This person supports the District Governor in enhancing the image and awareness of Lions, Lioness, LEOs and the international organization in the areas encompassed by District 14-C.

Diabetes Awareness and Action Chairperson - This person works with the Global Service Team Coordinator and focuses on district activities to promote Diabetes awareness, education, and prevention, which is one of LCI's five global service initiatives.

Environment Chairperson - This person works with the Global Service Team Coordinator and works to promote environmental awareness and protection at both the club and district level. This is one of LCI's global service initiatives

Audit Committee - Cumberland County Representative - This person is part of a three-member team that reviews the district's financial records shortly after the end of the Lions fiscal year. Typically, this is accomplished in one or two meetings. This is a three-year appointment, which requires minimal time.

14-C LCIF Report

Challenging is the term I believe best serves as the type of year we have had in regards to Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF).

Your District 14-C has been the leading contributor to LCIF in Pennsylvania for several years. I feared we would lose that title at different points of the 2020-2021 year.

There were limited club visits for me as many clubs were not meeting. I tried to make up for it by communicating through emails & phone calls with club Presidents & LCIF coordinators just to remind them that LCIF and Campaign 100 was still ongoing and needed to help our communities more than ever during the pandemic. I asked many clubs the same simple question "Is there anything in your budget for LCIF this year?" Donations ended the year down 38% versus 2019-2020 Lions year.

Our total for donations for DG Tom's term will be in the neighborhood of \$34,000. This still leads the other 16 Districts in MD14 by a wide margin. As far as donors, 14-C had twice as many individual Lions contribute to Campaign 100 as any other MD14 districts.

2021-2022 will be the final year for the Campaign 100 fundraiser. Worldwide we have currently raised \$207 million of the \$300 million goal. Through the generosity of our clubs & members, \$181,000 came from your District 14-C.

Lions Clubs International Foundation and I thank you for your support.

VISION BOWL STRIKES AWARENESS

Harrisburg, Pa- Did you know that bowling is a sport that many blind or visually impaired individuals really enjoy? Did you know that the number of persons affected by the four major eye diseases is predicted to continue to steadily increase? You may not have thought about these questions before, but at the annual **Vision Resources of Central Pennsylvania (VROCP)**, *Vision Bowl*, low vision awareness event, you will have the opportunity to learn more about the major diseases that lead to vision loss. You will also understand what has made **VROCP** a vital non-profit organization, assisting individuals experiencing low-vision or blindness, for 100 years.

Vision Bowl will share some information with each bowler participating in this unique fundraising event, but most importantly, this bowling competition places bowlers in the shoes of a visually impaired individual. Following a friendly, fun, first warm-up game, along with some food, refreshments and a little humorous taunting between teams, the evening turns serious, *but with a wink and a smile*. The real challenge of the competition is during the second game when bowlers will be competing for bragging rights and trophies, as they are required to bowl wearing one-of-four special lightweight eyeglasses that emulate what a person with Glaucoma, Diabetic Retinopathy, Age Related Macular Degeneration, and Cataracts see.

Vision Bowl will take place on Monday, July 12, at ABC East lanes, 1001 Eisenhower Blvd., Harrisburg at 6:00 p.m. The competitors must bowl in teams of four and the \$200 contribution entry fee, per team, includes shoes, a souvenir t-shirt, and foods to snack on.
