The second presentation which grabbed my attention was presented by outgoing MD-14 GST Coordinator PDG Tom Gregg. The title of his talk was "Service – More Opportunities." The part that interested me the most was when he took a dive into the history of "digital service reporting." Did you know that prior to "MYLION" when reporting was done by paper, MD-14 had a 75% rate of reporting. With the release of MYLION that dropped to 18%. Why you ask? Well, it seems that a 3<sup>rd</sup> party firm was contracted for the software and they didn't understand how Lions do their reporting and unfortunately the program was designed into a multiple page format which turned out to be very user "unfriendly" and tedious to use. Since that time, many Lions that actually do reporting have had a say in the rewriting of the service reporting software in MYLION and My LCI, which is currently yielding an approx. 46% rate. It still may not be perfect but there's progress to make it easier to use.

I have to repeat something that DGE Dan said in his article. It is VERY important that we all report our service activities. Many organizations that partner with Lions Clubs International want to see the "what" we do and how many people are affected. The more we can show is reflected in the amount of money these organizations are willing to donate to our cause. I want to become more proficient in helping every Club in District 14-C to become better at reporting. We can all learn together and become the best reporting District in MD-14.

It's an exciting time to be a Lion in District 14-C. I'd like to take this opportunity to THANK District Governor Tom for his Leadership and inspiration during the past difficult year. ## **Stewartstown Awards Scholarships**

South Eastern Dollars for Scholars is an important organization run by a group of local citizens in order to encourage life-long learning by raising and distributing scholarships to students who reside in the South Eastern School District. Resident students who attend either Kennard-Dale High School or the York County School of Technology and plan to continue their education beyond high school, attending a two or four year college or a technical/trade school, may apply for scholarships. Scholarships are made possible by hundreds of community members serving at annual fundraising events and by the many generous contributions by individuals, businesses and other organizations. All scholarships awarded this year totaled \$79,700. Since 1999 South Eastern Dollars for Scholars has awarded over \$1 million in scholarships to Kennard Dale seniors.



## **Lions International Peace Poster**

Very wise words from Winnie-the-Poor that we can all take to heart when we need a little boost in



our lives.

Also, very wise words used to create the grand prize winning Lions International Peace Essay Contest for 2020/2021 for visually impaired young people. The essay was composed by thirteen year old Joshua Wood from Australia and sponsored by the Brisbane Camphill Carindale Lions Club. Joshua will receive \$5,000 for his accomplishment! The theme for this year was "Peace

Through Service." His essay is entitled, "Peace and Service Go Hand in Hand." In his essay, Joshua shared the priceless lessons he learned from his Grandfather about the importance of service to others and "how this service not only promotes peace, but also, provides an inner peace that so many people are striving for."

## Peace and Service Go Hand in Hand

I remember walking hand in hand with my Grandfather when I was a little boy. He was a very wise man, his grey hair highlighting his wisdom. His hands felt dry and rough, particularly to a child who uses his fingers to read.

It was many years later when I stood at his funeral that I realized the significance of those dry, rough hands. They were the hands that held mine and guided me when I was young. They were the hands of a young man, who went to War, sacrificing his own safety, to preserve freedom in our country. They were the hands of a man who held his dying mate in battle. They were the hands of a man who mowed the lawns of local elderly people. They were the hands of the man that had been awarded medals, yet didn't wear them as he felt he did not need recognition for his service. They were the hands of a man who truly understood what service meant.

My Grandfather planted a seed in my mind many years ago about the importance of service and its huge contribution to not only peace in our communities but providing inner peace as well. I often think about the conflicts, wars and fighting in the world and the sadness in many people's lives. I also often think about how selfless my Grandfather was by helping others without wanting anything in return. My Grandfather would say to me, "you don't have sight, but you have insight and that is much more important."

We can find inspiration from so many who have gone before us. Mother Theresa who served the poor in India. William Booth, Founder of the Salvation Army, who dedicated his life to helping the poor. The most inspiring for me personally, is Helen Keller who herself was blind and deaf, yet lived a life of service. Despite her disabilities she helped veterans blinded in World War 1, founded charities, advocated for the blind and poor and led the American Foundation for the Blind for over forty years. All these incredible people served others, and by doing so brought peace to the poor, wounded and hungry. A quote by Albert Schweitzer resonates with me, "the only really happy people are those who have learned how to serve."

I have made a promise to my Grandfather. That I will spread the word about serving others and how it not only promotes peace for others hut also provides an inner peace that so many people are striving for. I can serve others despite my disability. I do not want to be self-focused but focused on others. I hope to inspire others to achieve peace through service. In the words of Mother Theresa, "The fruit of service is peace." I want to plant seeds of peace in my life and encourage others to do so also. Peace and service go hand in hand just like my Grandfather and I walking along many years ago.

The theme for the 2021/2022 Lions International Peace Essay Contest is "We Are All Connected." Lions Clubs around the world are encouraged to sponsor student in the Lions International Peace Essay Contest. Students who are visually impaired and who are of the ages 11-13 as of November 15 are eligible to participate. For the essay contest rules and application forms, please contact me.

The theme for the 2021/2022 Lions International Peace Poster Contest is "We Are All Connected." I can't wait to see how the students in our district demonstrate this meaningful theme in their creations. I hope your club will help to give them this opportunity. #### VISION BOWL STRIKES AWARENESS

Harrisburg, Pa- Did you know that bowling is a sport that many blind or visually impaired individuals really enjoy? Did you know that the number of persons affected by the four major eye diseases is predicted to continue to steadily increase? You may not have thought about these questions before, but at the annual **Vision Resources of Central Pennsylvania (VROCP)**, *Vision Bowl*, low vision awareness event, you will have the opportunity to learn more about the major diseases that lead to vision loss. You will also understand what has made **VROCP** a vital non-profit organization, assisting individuals experiencing low-vision or blindness, for 100 years.

*Vision Bowl* will share some information with each bowler participating in this unique fundraising event, but most importantly, this bowling competition places bowlers in the shoes of a visually impaired individual. Following a friendly, fun, first warm-up game, along with some food, refreshments and a little humorous taunting between teams, the evening turns serious, *but with a wink and a smile*. The real challenge of the competition is during the second game when bowlers will be competing for bragging rights and trophies, as they are required to bowl wearing one-of-four special lightweight eyeglasses that emulate what a person with Glaucoma, Diabetic Retinopathy, Age Related Macular Degeneration, and Cataracts see.

*Vision Bowl* will take place on Monday, July 12, at ABC East lanes, 1001 Eisenhower Blvd., Harrisburg at 6:00 p.m. The competitors must bowl in teams of four and the \$200 contribution entry fee, per team, includes shoes, a souvenir t-shirt, and foods to snack on.
