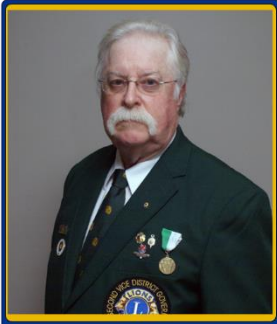

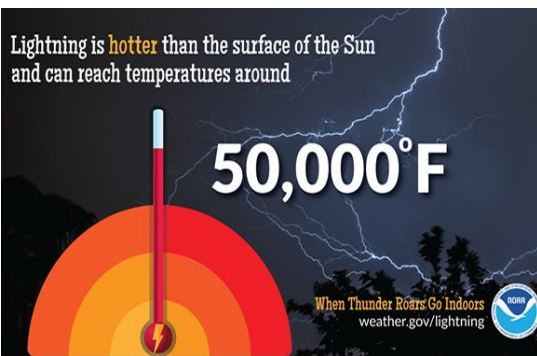
Prepare Your Pets for Disaster

The old adage in Real Estate is location, location, location. With Leader Dogs its treats, treats, treats. You can never give too many high-quality treats when working with your puppy. At this point, Killian's instruction from me is almost complete and we are now working on reinforcing good behavior. We are running out of new places and experiences but every now and then, something new comes up that gives us a challenge and a training opportunity. The week of the May 16th was one of those times. First, my truck's check engine light came on and it went into the shop first thing Monday morning. Since I didn't have my truck, I drove my "toy", a 66 Mustang Convertible. Now I have never had a Future Leader Dog in my Mustang, so this was a first for me also. Killian, not too sure of the vehicle, at first did not want to get in. The F-250 he climbs up to the passenger side floor to ride, but the Mustang he can walk in, so I can understand the confusion. With a little coaxing and a lot of treats, he did get in and settled down. We took it very slow leaving the driveway and my development. By the time we got onto the main street, he was feeling comfortable and enjoying the ride.

Our second new training opportunity came on Friday, May 20th at the Multiple District 14 Pa State Council of Lions Club Annual Convention. I had heard that Beth Slade, the Lions Engagement Coordinator for Leader Dogs, was going to be there and I contacted her to see if she would like FLD Killian and me to join her at the Convention.

Beth and Lion Amanda Remic, MD-14 Coordinator for Leader Dogs were working the Leader Dog table and were very excited to meet Killian. Lion Beth with some assistance from Lion Amanda did a wonderful presentation about Leader Dogs at the lunch break. The Lions mission of “We Serve” is perfectly complemented by Leader Dog’s mission of empowering people who are visually impaired with independence to travel. Lion Beth’s video of a Leader Dog Client with her Leader Dog was interesting and touching to watch. The Client described how a Leader Dog has changed her life and gave her, her mobility and independence back. As Killian and I were in front of the audience watching the video with Lion Beth and Lion Amanda, people started to laugh. I looked at Beth who pointed to Killian. Future Leader Dog Killian had his head cocked, ears up and intently watching the video of the Client and Leader Dog working and traveling about their neighborhood. His expression was proudly of, “I will be doing that someday.” Yes, my handsome fellow, God willing that will be you someday.

Leader Dogs is offering a Non-event fund raiser. It is called “Dollars for Dogs” and the kits can be ordered on line. Your club can contact a local business and ask if they would like to be a part of a Lions and Leader Dog Community Project. Explain what Leader Dog does for the visually impaired in your community. Give them a “kit” of a fund-raising packet with a bundle of “dog tags”, cover letter, register signs and a remit slip with an envelope. The business sells the “dog tags” with the dollar amount listed on the tag. If the business raises \$500.00, they and your club can symbolically sponsor a

future Leader Dog puppy! No matter your goal, the business and your club will receive recognition for your donation. Share the fund raiser on your club’s social media and website and give updates. Lion Vicki Alfieri volunteers her time as a Puppy Raiser for Susquehanna Service Dogs. As a Puppy Raiser, she and her husband welcome a 9-week-old puppy into their home and socialize and train them for 15 - 18 months. The assistance dogs give people the confidence to live more independently and do things they didn't think were possible. Susquehanna Service dogs can open doors for a person in a wheelchair, assist a person with limited mobility to get dressed every day, alert a person with a hearing disability to a ringing phone, interrupt anxiety for a veteran with PTSD, or provide deep pressure to calm a child with Autism, among countless other supportive tasks. These dogs change lives.

Vicki has been a puppy raiser since 2016 and is currently raising her 5th dog, SSD Pippin. SSD Pippin is from the Broadway Litter which was also whelped by Vicki. In addition, Vicki is housing SSD Evidence (breeder) which is SSD Pippin's mom. Pippin typically accompanies Vicki wherever she goes including the Mechanicsburg Lions Club meetings.

We've all heard about the "great worker shortage" – everywhere you look, businesses have help wanted signs hanging, and you hear about sign-on bonuses being paid by those who normally don't offer them and unusually high wages being offered. As the State Project that has a large number of workers to hire every year, Beacon Lodge has been impacted by these circumstances. Nursing, Kitchen, and Program departments are all significantly understaffed, despite a lot of effort and funding applied to recruiting.

Scheduled for the 2022 summer are the following sessions: 1 Transitional, 3 Assisted Living, 1 Camp Unite, and 2 Visually Impaired sessions in the Adult Camp and 1 LEAP, 1 Ad(h)venture, 1 ConnXions, 2 Camp Unite, and 2 Project New

Hope in the Children's Village. Full staffing of the seasonal positions includes 44 workers.

We currently have 13.

Due to the staffing shortage and the Session #1 camper counts in Adult Camp and Children's Village, those sessions have been cancelled. Our campers will be given the option to join a later session. Camp now begins on June 11th.

Please let this serve as the official call for help. We are in critical need of volunteers to make Camp 2022 happen. I'm sure we've all encountered businesses that are closed when they should be open because they don't have the staff to keep their regular hours, and even businesses that have gone under because they cannot pay the high wages job seekers have come to expect. Beacon Lodge is in danger of not being able to serve the Special Needs community this season. This is an opportunity for the Lions of Pennsylvania to show that when circumstances make a project seem impossible, we will be there to find a way to serve those who need it most because where there is a need, there is a Lion.

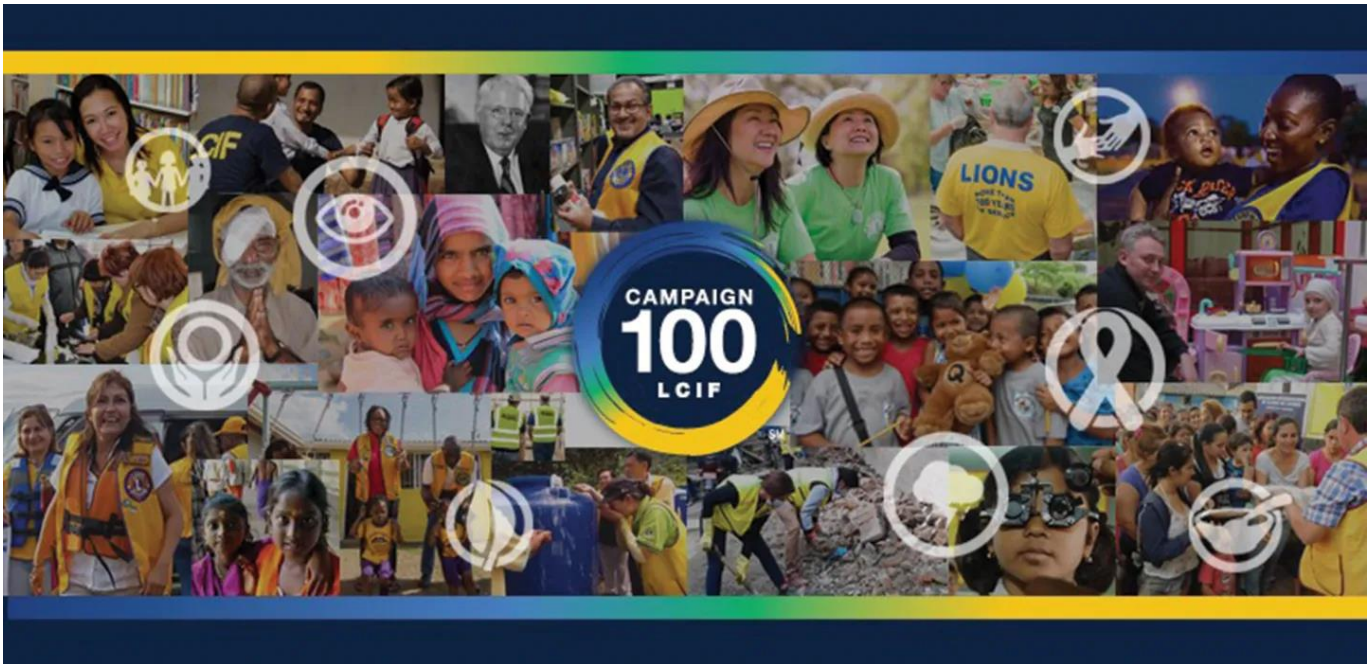
Your Camp has a need – Let's meet this challenge together.

We need individuals to fill Counselor, Cook, and Nurse positions. All positions require PA ChildLine, State Police Background, and FBI Fingerprint Clearances. Those interested in volunteering as a Counselor will also need CPR/First Aid and Mandated Reporter certifications. All of these can be completed online, except for the CPR/First Aid. We are trying to set up a second training on June 11 at Beacon Lodge. You may also find options available to you locally.

14-C LCIF Coordinator

This month of June marks the conclusion of my 5 year journey as the District 14-C LCIF Coordinator. Having been encouraged to accept an additional role within the Multiple District, I feel it's time to move on and turn the 14-C LCIF position over to another highly qualified Lion.

What made LCIF challenging the past 5 years was "Campaign 100". Described as the largest and most aggressive fundraiser in LCIF's fifty-four-year history with a worldwide goal of raising \$300 million. As I am writing this article Lions are within a few million dollars of this ambitious goal.

Did 14-C Lions do their part in achieving the goal? Even though 14-C does not have the largest membership of the 17 districts in Pennsylvania, 3 out of the 4 years of "Campaign 100" 14-C finished in first place in donations of all districts. I project we will also have the highest donation amount by an extremely wide margin during 2021-2022. In fact, we will be the ONLY district in Pennsylvania to reach the "Campaign 100" goal assigned by LCIF.

This great success could only be accomplished due to the support of our clubs, district, and individual Lions in 14-C that know the importance of LCIF. This year alone 14-C received grants from LCIF totaling approximately 200% of what our combined total donations were to LCIF.

On December 10-11, 2021 deadly, ravaging, EF4 tornadoes tore through Kentucky and Tennessee. Not only did 14-C Lions travel there to help with the disaster cleanup, but area Lions that were not able to make the trip did their part. LCIF received over \$22,000 in donations from 14-C earmarked for Kentucky within thirty days of the storms. \$750,000 in grants for the area have been awarded and additional LCIF funds will be distributed in the coming months.

With the conclusion of "Campaign 100" June 30th, I am asking you and your club to consider making an end of campaign donation in June. It means so much to Lions Clubs and communities around the world.

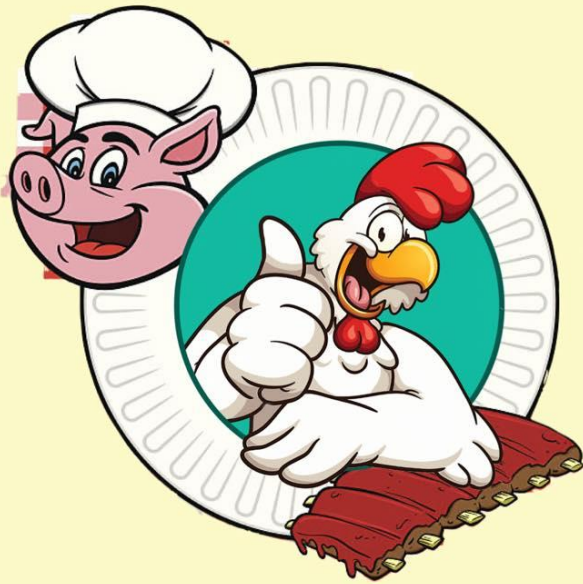

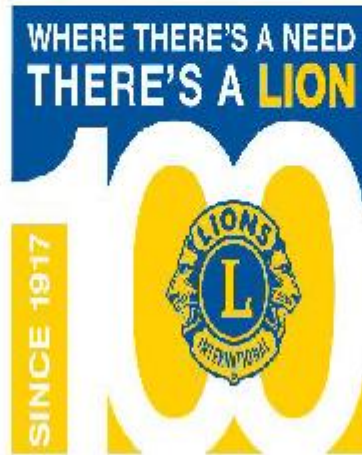
