CLUB SECRETARIES AND CLUB ADMINISTRATORS

Service Reporting in MyLion

Club Secretaries and Administrators are reminded to complete their service activity reports in MyLion. Creating an event by using "Plan Future Activity" prior to the event allows other people to see your event who might want to attend or volunteer. However, it requires that you go back into MyLion after the event, enter follow-up information, and submit the report. Waiting until after an event and using "Report Past Activity" is easier and less time consuming than creating an activity prior to the event and then having to go back and finalize the report. Use the following steps when reporting an activity after it has occurred:

- 1 From the "Member Portal" page, click on "MyLion" icon.
- 2 At the top of the page, click on "Report Past Activity."
- This should bring up a page showing both "Unreported Activities" and "Reported Activites." Before you go on to report a new activity, finalize any unreported activities you see from July 1, 2020 until now. Activities dated prior to July 1, 2020, cannot be reported.
- 4 To report the new activity, look for the orange "Report" button at the top right corner of the page and click on it.
- 5 Name the activity and complete the form. Enter a picture if you have one. Who knows, it might appear in the LION magazine!
- Click on "Save" at the bottom of the page, make sure all of you information is correct, and then click on "Submit." Your activity will not be reported until you click "Submit." VISION EXAM AND GLASSES GIFT CERTIFICATES

Each zone chairperson currently has VSP Gift Certificates, which provide a vision exam and, if needed, glasses for low income individuals who meet eligibility requirements. If your club receives a request for assistance with glasses and/or a vision exam, please contact your zone chairperson and ask for a certificate. This will help your club save funds that can then be used for other needs. The current batch of certificates expire on August 27, 2021.

Lions International Peace Poster Winners Announced

I am very much honored to share with you the winners of the Lions International Peace Poster Contest for 2020/2021.

The theme for the Peace Poster Contest this year was, "Peace Through Service." And, what a journey it has been for all of us this past year with the many challenges that were presented to us. It has, also, been an exceptional year of challenges and adaptations for our schools. Because of this, we did have fewer children able to participate in the contest. However, those that did, completed an amazing job in demonstrating their artistic ability, interpretation of the theme, and their originality. This year, we had 111 children create beautiful posters.

I do want to say a **big thank-you** and commend the clubs that were able to sponsor students in the contest this year. The clubs that did participate were: the **Arendtsville Lions Club**, the **Newville Lions Club** and the **Upper Adams Lions Club**. The **Apple City Leo Club** (sponsored by the Arendtsville Lions Club), also, participated in the process and contributed to the prize money that was awarded for the top 15 winners. I am so proud of all three clubs for taking that extra step to sponsor a group of students and their teachers that allowed their students to participate! In addition, I know that there were some clubs who were trying to sponsor children, but, were unable to do so because of restrictions for this year. Thank-you to those clubs for putting forth the effort. Please do not be discouraged!

I am hoping that this coming year will be a much more successful year in encouraging clubs to offer this wonderful opportunity to children by sponsoring them in the Peace Poster Contest. The theme for the 2021/2022 contest is "We Are All Connected." This is, certainly, one of the many lessons we have learned over this year. Our likenesses far out way our differences! I can only imagine how the youth in our district will put this theme to paper in creating their beautiful posters. Zone Chairs, please encourage the clubs in your zone to get involved in this incredible program for our youth!

I have already purchased a number of Peace Poster Kits. So, let me know how many you need and I will see that you get them. The cost of each kit remains at \$11.95.

Also, the Lions International Essay contest was created to offer an opportunity for visually impaired young people to express their vision of world peace. Information about the essay contest is available on the LCI website.

And, now let's celebrate this year's winners! As mentioned, the theme for 2020/2021 was "Peace Through Service." The children did an extraordinary job in using their creativity, their talent, and their introspectiveness in demonstrating this theme in their posters. DG Tom and I were put to work in choosing the winners and their placements. But, that is a problem we love to have! I am always so impressed at what the students create at such a young age. All of our winning students were just 11 years old when they created their posters!



Our district's honorable mention winner is **Mya Welsh** sponsored by the **Newville Lions Club**. Mya is in the 6th grade at Big Springs Middle School. Her favorite subject is English and Language Arts because she enjoys reading and writing. In school, Mya plays in the school band and sings in the chorus. She enjoys running and spending time with her family. Mya would like to study early childhood education in college and, someday, be a teacher because she enjoys helping people learn new things. Mya's quote about world peace which she wrote on the back of her poster was, **"Without peace, we would be alone, forever."**

Our district's third place winner is Leslie Raya sponsored by the Arendtsville Lions Club. Leslie is a 6th grader at the Upper Adams Intermediate School. Leslie, also, lists as her favorite subject, English and Language Arts, because she gets to write her own stories. She enjoys participating in art challenges and the STEM program which includes science, technology, engineering, and mathematics. 

The records of the Department of State's Bureau of Corporations and Charitable Organizations (Bureau) indicate that your association has not made or amended any filing with the Bureau from January 1, 2012 to December 31, 2020. Pursuant to 54 Pa.C.S. §503, the association is required to file a Decennial Report of Continued Existence between January 1, 2021 and December 31, 2021. If the association fails to file a Decennial Report on or before December 31, 2021, it will no longer have exclusive use of its name. This means that, while the non-filing association continues to exist, its name becomes available for use by any other business registering in Pennsylvania.
