Along with you, I am looking forward to the first colors and activity of spring. I wish the best for you and your family. May we as Lions know and reach out to those in need in our communities!

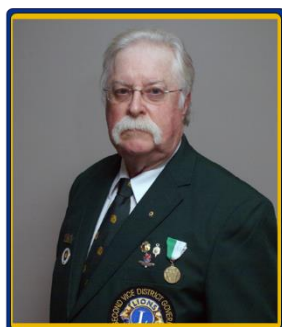

The DRP affords clubs the opportunity to work with community leadership, private businesses, and others to prepare for and respond to the unforeseen disasters and events. It's Not Luck! – The "[It's Not Luck](#)" campaign contains safety and preparedness messages you can share on your social media channels. You can either copy these messages directly or customize them to reach your audience.

To be used throughout March, in association with St. Patrick's Day, the campaign asserts that no one should rely on luck when it comes to being prepared for disasters and emergencies. Don't leave disaster prep to chance.

The First Steps to being Prepared:

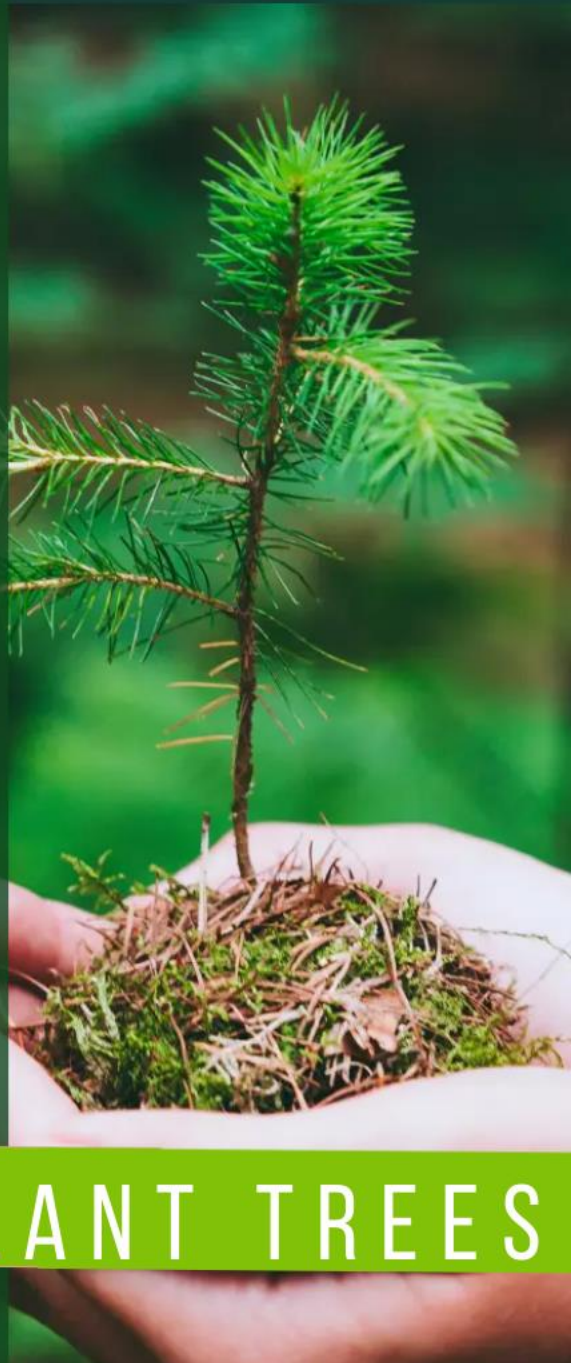

Paws for Thought

Killian is now 70.6 pounds, but still thinks he can snuggle in your lap. I will sit on the floor with him in the evenings while watching TV and massage his back and ears. Then after a while he will roll over for his belly rubs. Belly rubs are the best! I swear that he actually smiles. The reason I sit on the floor to give special attention to Killian is because as a Puppy Raiser we must train the puppies to stay off the furniture, because the new owner of a fully trained Leader Dog may not want the dog on their furniture. If they do allow dogs on the furniture, such as the couch or the bed, then they can encourage the dog to come up onto the furniture. It is much easier to train a dog to come up onto the furniture if it's been trained to stay off, than it is to train a dog to stay off the furniture once it has been allowed to be on it. One of the Puppy Raisers from Leader Dog shared how she discourages her puppies from getting on the couch by buying several clothes baskets from the Dollar Store, turning them upside down and sit them on the couch. If she wants to sit down, she removes one. I think this is a great method that teaches the puppy his place is on the floor, not the furniture.



This isn't to say that Leader Dog Puppies don't push the envelope with trying to get on the furniture. Especially when they hit their "teenage months", which is between 6 to 11 months of age. They will pretend to not understand a given command, even though they knew it at 5 months old, or will not listen to you, but if someone else gives them a command, they do it instantly. Once they hit about 11 months, a light bulb goes off and they are back to being very obedient and listen to every command. Here's an example of what I encountered with Killian recently. I came out of the bathroom after my shower one morning to find Killian on my bed, which surprised me.

I said, "Killian, get off the bed."

He ignores me.

"Killian, OFF the bed."

I get the look, and then slowly he moves to the side of the bed. Giving me "the look" he slowly slides one front paw down to the floor.

"Killian, off the bed now."

I get the look as if he was saying, "Are you sure?" And then he slowly slides the other front paw on the floor.

"Killian, on the floor."

"Are you sure? I was quite comfortable here."

"Killian off, now" And a rear paw slowly slides off the bed.

"This is your last chance. I can still crawl back up on the bed."

"Killian! Off now!" And as slow as a snail, slides his backside and last paw off the bed. He stands there with his big brown eyes and pouts. Oh, those teenage months!

Club Officer Elections

It's time to gear up for club officer elections. By this time, Club Presidents should have named their Nominating Committee, and that committee should be recruiting candidates for next year club officers. A date for your club's Nominating Meeting should be set for some time in March, and club members should be notified of that date at least 14 days prior to the meeting. The Nominating Committee should report their nominee(s) for each office, and additional nominations can be made from the floor during this meeting.

The Election Meeting should be held in April. Again, club members should be notified at least 14 days in advance of the date of this meeting. A printed ballot should be prepared for this meeting and member should cast secret ballots. No additional nominations may be made at this meeting.

Following the election, the Club Secretary should report the new officers in MyLCI under 2022-2023 Officers.

I want to applaud and thank the clubs who sponsored and encouraged children to participate in the Peace Poster Contest. This year, we had 6 clubs that participated in the sponsorship of students. They were the **Arendtsville Lions Club**, the **Dallastown Lions Club**, the **Jacksonville Lions Club**, the **Jacobus Lions Club**, the **Plainfield Lions Club**, and the **Upper Adams Lions Club**. Congratulations to all of those clubs! We have our own Olympians with the talent of artistic and creative expression in the form of a poster demonstrating peace. And, now let's celebrate this year's winners!

Our district's honorable mention winner is Lucy Rutkowski. Lucy is in 6th grade at the Upper Adams Intermediate School and was sponsored by the **Arendtsville Lions Club**. Lucy's favorite subject in school is art because she enjoys thinking outside of the box to make amazing artwork. In school, she plays the flute in the band. Preventing Scams

Popular Scams:

Phone Scams: Promise winnings or claim a family member is in trouble.

Door to Door Scams: Ask to seal driveway, or fix roof, or claim they are with the power or water company.

Email Scams: Promise winnings or prizes, usually provide a link to click on.

Prevent Scams!!!

Screen calls. Let numbers you don't recognize go to voicemail. Scammers rarely leave a message.

Ask questions about the prize or ask basic questions about the family member.

Ask to see a business card. Look to see what vehicle they are driving. Ask for company ID. Call your power to water company to see if they are legitimate.

Never open emails if you do not recognize the sender. Never click on links with-in the emails.



Some Questions to ask:



How much do I have to pay to get my prize?

Ask the "family member" basic questions about themselves that only they would know the answer to.

Do you have a business card?

May I see your company ID card?

Do not believe these scammers. If you send money via gift card or electronically, you will never see it again!!! When in doubt, call 911



Red Flags:



You are asked to send money via gift card or wire transfer.

They ask for user name/ password

They have "extra materials" to do home repairs.

There is a time limit on your response.
