A Message From the District Governor



At all 41 cubs that I visited so far this year, I talked about our District goals for the year. I am still trying to meet some of those goals with your help. Among the membership goals, we wanted to add 100 new members across the District and limit the number of dropped members, excluding deaths, which sadly always occur. Through April, we have added 73 new members and had 79 drops which include deaths. That makes us just -6 for the year. Let's keep adding new members who will provide more hands and new ideas for "doing the work". We are doing great!

In regard to membership, we still have a couple "of cards to play" that will help us to the goal. First, PDG Dennis Bell reported at the District Cabinet Meeting/Convention that the developing new club in New Cumberland has 23 prospective members who have paid their dues for the year and that a meeting is being planned to elect officers and prepare for a charter event. This will mean an infusion of members. In

addition, PDG Shirley Starner has organized a Branch Club in Sprenkle Village. Two members will transfer from the parent club which is Weiglestown. The other five or more members will be new members. The organizational meeting for this branch club will be held May 2nd. And finally, we have begun working with the Pinchot Park Lions Club and my goal there is to help them add ten new members by the end of June. If all goes well and we can limit the number of drops, we could end the year on the plus side of the ledger. That would be worth some kind of District-wide celebration.

In regard to LCIF, our goal was that 85% of the clubs would make donations (although my personal goal was 100%) and that we would increase our donations over the previous year by 20%. We have been doing great here as well. PDG Kerry McKnight tells me that we are leading all districts in Pennsylvania at the level of our donations and getting close to our goals for the year. If you are still thinking about personal or club donations, please do it now, so we can take this last year of LCIF's Campaign 100 out with a bang!

Now let's look at several things we have coming up over the next month or so. First, we have District 14C Lions Diabetes Awareness/Stride Walk events in three locations on Saturday, May 14th. The events will be held at the Valley Meadow Park in Carlisle, the Upper Adams Intermediate School in Arendstville and the York County Rail Trail in New Freedom in conjunction with their Backyard Olympics. The events are designed to raise awareness about the incidence, risks and care for diabetes. Donations will be accepted for diabetic causes. Let's let people know we are doing these events. Hang Lion Theresa's posters in fire halls, municipal buildings, doctor's offices, grocery stores and wherever. Let the local media know. Get it out on social media. Let's let everyone know that Lions are concerned about the health impacts of diabetes, and want to help produce better outcomes for everyone.

Then from May 19th-22nd, the annual MD-14 (State) Lions Convention will be held in King of Prussia at the Valley Forge Casino Resort. Immediate Past International President, Dr. Jung-Yul Choi, will be the keynote speaker at the International Banquet on Saturday evening. Hospitality night will be held on Friday night from 9-11 with a "Doo Wop Sock Hop." It is not too late to register. If the cost is of concern to you, just register for Saturday at the heart of the convention. Come be part of the "rally of the troops."

And finally, on June 18th is a combined event at the Newville Lions Fairground. It will be the Newville Lions 75th Anniversary celebration, and it will also be the Banner Exchange between the outgoing Governor, yours truly, and the incoming District Governor, Keith Shoff. In conjunction with the Banner Exchange, we will be providing awards and recognitions to quite a few Lions who have served the District, Zones and Clubs so selflessly and effectively this year. Many of you have received invitations from Lion Nancy Hockenberry, Secretary of the Newville Lions Club. If you have not received an invitation and would like to attend, please let me know asap. For a picnic style luncheon that includes fried chicken, scalloped potatoes, baked beans and coleslaw, the cost is just \$15.00. You must rsvp by June 1st.

We continue to have a lot of things going on in our District this spring. Let's finish the year strongly. I wish the best for you and your family. Have a great month.

99th Annual PA Lions State Convention

May 19-22, 2022 - Hosted by District 14-A

Valley Forge Casino Resort. King of Prussia, PA

We Came, We Saw, We Got on Board!!

The 2022 District 14-C Convention is now history, and it was a great success. The theme of the convention was *All Hands On Deck*, mirroring District Governor Dan Brant's theme for this year. The Lions of District 14-C were challenged to get on board with new service initiatives, recruiting members and letting our communities know what we do. 77 Lions attended the convention and 26 Lions stayed for dinner following the convention, where they heard our International Guest, Past International Director Dr. Edward V. Cordes, speak about KidSight USA Foundation and the importance of early childhood vision screenings.



PID Cordes was also the Keynote Speaker during the convention, bringing us greetings on behalf of International President Douglas Alexander. During his remarks, he spoke about the challenges our clubs face as they emerge from the COVID-19 pandemic; and he reflected on our traditional commitments to help those with vision and hearing impairments. He also encouraged us to embrace new challenges and identify emerging needs in our communities. He spoke about the need for Lions to raise our visibility in the communities we serve in order to attract new members. In addition, Dr. Cordes asked us to take stock of our current practices to be sure they are not a hinderance to attracting new members.

The convention opened with a brief Cabinet Meeting. The Cabinet meeting was followed by the annual necrology service, which was led by District Chaplain Lion Rodger Snyder. Lion Rodger recited the words to a hymn that focused on service. A slide show containing the names and pictures of deceased Lions accompanied the reading of the names and sounding of the bell. Next up was the Keynote Speech by PID Cordes, and this was followed by the presentation of several awards, including the PA Counsellors' Distinguished Service Awards, Leo of the Year Award, and International President's Certificates of Appreciation.

Nominees for 2022-2023 District Governor, First Vice District Governor and Second Vice District Governor were presented to the convention along with nominating speeches. Voting followed, and Lion Keith Shoff (Brogue Community Lions Club) was elected as District Governor, Martin Zimmerman (Stewartstown Lions Club) was elected First Vice District Governor, and Galen Burkholder (Shippensburg Lions Club) was elected Second Vice District Governor.



Following the voting, convention attendees were able to choose one of three seminars. Raising Your Club's Visibility focused on using traditional media and social media to help clubs build awareness in the community of the existence of their Lions club and the good work they do. Vice District Governor Keith Shoff, Zone Chair Doug Nace, both from Brogue Community Lions Club, and Lion Don Dippner from Red Lion Lions Club led this seminar and provided a wealth of materials and resources for club leaders to utilize.

Lion Raymond Highlands, District 14-C Disaster Relief Coordinator, assisted by Lion Laura Arnolt, both from the Carlisle Lions Club, presented an overview on Lions Club International Foundation (LCIF) Disaster Relief Program. In his presentation he covered the background and information on what a disaster is and summary on how the disaster response and recovery system works. He presented an overview of the LCIF Disaster Relief program and explained how Lions clubs could benefit their clubs and communities.

The third seminar focused on Action Planning and gave an overview of a strategic planning process that involves using a vision statement and a mission statement generate SMART Goals: Stragegic, Measurable, Actionable, Realistic, and Time-sensitive. A series of action steps is then created that will contribute to accomplishing the goal. Each action step includes a person responsible for its implementation and a deadline for completing the action. This seminar was led by PDG Dennis Cope, Arendtsville Lions Club.

The convention ended with closing remarks by each of the incoming district officers and approval of a date for the 2023 District 14-C Convention, which will be Saturday, April 15, 2023.

Lion Jane Little, Upper Adams Lions Club, and Lion William Scheaffer, Susquehanna Lions Club, each received a Pennsylvania Counsellors distinguished Service Medal from District Governor Dan Brant. Both Lions were nominated by their club and recommended for the award by the Past District Governor Advisory Committee.

Aww, Spring is in the air. What says Spring more than children and puppies outside playing in the warm sunshine. Since I have been writing this article I have written a lot about training and prepping

for a puppy. But raising a puppy for Leader Dogs is not all about the work you put into a puppy. There are lots of fun times and funny stories that you can share. I know a lot of Puppy Raisers set a schedule for daily training. But I view raising a Future Leader Dog a little differently. Grocery Stores are great for distraction training, especially having the puppy being exposed to little children. As if the sights and smells in a Grocery Store aren't enough of a distraction, having youngsters walking by or up to a Future Leader Dog can be a challenge and educational. They always want to pet the puppy and it is a great time to work on sit/stays or down/stays as I talk to the kids and their parents about how to approach a service dog. My speech goes something like this, "Thank you for asking to pet (or show interest in) Future Leader Dog for the Blind Killian. He is about 9 months old and is learning to be a guide dog for a blind person. He is a working dog and whenever you see a working dog with their owner, you should never approach the dog without asking first. These dogs are trained not to



seek attention as they are focusing on the needs of their owner." That often leads into more conversation about working and training service dogs. As the saying goes, "Kids say the darnest things" and I've heard a few of them.

My 3-year-old Granddaughter Michaela and Killian are the best of friends. She calls him, "My Killian." The other day, she was helping "Nanny" weed the flower bed by the fence. We were in the flower bed while Killian was in the yard on the other side. Michaela had on her little gloves and trowel digging away, when I looked over to see she was actually digging under the fence with Killian's nose poking out. I asked her what she was doing, and she told me she wanted to see Killian. I'm sure Killian was lending a "paw" to help in this escape plan on the other side. On another day, I was hanging out the laundry with Michaela and Killian playing in the yard. I looked over and Killian was "pooping" all of the sudden, Michaela dropped her pants and squatted down. I yelled, "Michaela! What are you doing?" She said in that 3-year-old voice, "I poop with Killian." I nearly busted a gut trying not to laugh as I got her into the house. There is never a dull moment with those two!




