For Lions Clubs the contest will be based on LCI Report "ACT0013_W" this is the 2015-2016 Service Activity — Club Summary. A copy of this report will be sent to any club secretary upon request. I have been appointed by the Governor Elect to be the administrator of the contest this year. Nothing extra is required of Lions club secretaries you only need to submit your LCI activities report as usual. There will be no district report to file on the district web site.

Because Lioness Club Sectaries do not submit an LCI report you will file a report to me by email or regular mail and I will compile the information for the Governor. The information in this report is important whether you wish to participate in the contest or not. Do not submit a report on the district web site.

ACTIVITIES – Activities are an event such as: Fund raisers, service activities or club meetings.

LIONESS HOURS – Lioness participating in activity times how long the activity lasted = lioness hours.

Example – Ten Lionesses attend a fund raiser for 3 hours = 30 hours.

ZONE, DISTRICT, STATE OR INTERNATIONAL EVENT – How many club members attended?

HEARING AIDS AND EYEGLASSES – Report when collected or when submitted but not both.

FUNDS DONATED – Money or value of items purchased and donated from the clubs "project account".
