All the seminars were well attended and received good evaluations.

## **PANEL Presentations:**

PDG George Reisinger presented ideas for Clubs to consider regarding: District Directory going digital, services activities, point contest, and thoughts on whether to continue a District Convention in the future due to poor attendance.

PDG Dennis Bell announced that the 2016 State Convention will be held in Erie, PA. He stated the mass must decide about a District Convention. Lion Gloria Hilsinger mentioned it is a wonderful experience and a time for the District to come together for bonding and fellowship.

Also suggested was: report in the newsletter the number of attendees and what business was conducted at the Cabinet Meeting. PG Bell introduced Jim Hoover, President of the Fairview Lions Clubs. Lion President Jim shared his thoughts on how the club is now utilizing Social Media to recruit new members, by setting up Facebook accounts, to post activities. He further urged clubs to keep Website up to date.

PDG Shirley Starner shared her thoughts on "There Is a Need". A need for men and women in the District to consider and step forth and become a District Governor and what it means to take on the role. The future of District 14-C, rest in the hands of each and every Lion in the District.

The Necrology Service was held for all attendees. Lion Reverend Walter Reed and Past Council Chair Reverend Gus Fridenvalds presided over the Service. Forty three Lions and five Lionesses were honored at the Service.

The fourth cabinet meeting was called to order at 1:30PM by District Governor Lois Jean Mundorff. One verse of "America" was sung followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. Parliamentary procedures were read by PDG Fred Trump. A motion was made by ZC Dennis Cronin, seconded by ZC Clair Starner to approve the Cabinet Meeting minutes for February 14, 2015. MOTION CARRIED.

District Governor Lois welcomed everyone to the convention and introduced special guests, Past International Director Alan "Ted" Reiver and his Partner in Service Lion Ann.

PID Ted spoke about membership and how each Lion needs to ask their neighbors to become a member of the organization. Everyone needs to follow the wishes of International President Joe Preston and "ASK ONE" and "Strengthen the Pride" of being a Lion along with 1.4 million members worldwide. Lion Ann spoke on their travels during the two years as International Director.

PID Ted then presented IP Joe Preston Certificate of Achievements to:

Kerry McKnight New Freedom Lions Club; Eugene Kilgore, Mason Dixon Lions Club; Dennis Meckley, Weigelstown Lions Club; John Griffie Jr., New Oxford Lions Club.

PID Ted presented the "Golden Lion and Silver Lioness Awards" to Lions with more than 50 years of service and Lioness' with more than 25 years of service. Each recipient was presented a Certificate and a pin. Recipients were: Lioness Jane Mosely (25) Dover Lioness Club; (50) Lions William Vanidestine-Pinchot Park Lions Club, Jacque Hoffman- East Berlin Lions Club, Frank Witzeman- West Shore Lions Club, Harrison Fair-York Springs Lions Club, Robert Fickes-Dover Lions Club, William Garman-Jefferson Community Lions Club, Michael Ciavarella- Shippensburg Lions Club, Carlton Stambaugh- Spring Grove Lions Club, George Wolfe- Stewartstown Lions Club, Raymond Rosnick-Mechanicsburg Lions Club, Jan Wiley-Dillsburg Lions Club, Robert Shelley -Windsor Lions Club, Robert Weber- Camp Hill Lions Club, PDG Fred Trump-Spring Grove Lions Club and Snyder Proctor- Kreutz Creek Lions Club.

PDG Dennis Bell chaired the CAUCUS. A motion was made by ZC David Killius and seconded by Dennis Cronin to nominate John Griffie Jr. for District Governor (2015-2016). MOTION CARRIED. Lion Dan Fielder, New Freedom Lions Club nominated Lion Kerry McKnight, New Freedom Lions Club for First Vice District Governor, (2015-2016), seconded by Steve Grothey. Nominations were closed with motion by PDG Gordon Sinclair, seconded by Dan Buck. MOTION CARRIED.

PDG Bell explained the dues increase from \$1.00 to \$2.00 to be voted on by the delegates. The revenue will be used to offset expenses by the 1st VDG and 2nd VDG.

The election was held and the election committee reported that there were a total of 49 ballots cast. John Griffie, JR. was elected District Governor for 2015-2016 and Kerry Mcknight was elected 1st Vice District Governor for 2015-2016. The dues increase passed with 45 YES and 4 No votes.

District Governor Elect John spoke briefly, as did 1st Vice District Governor Kerry.

PCC/PDG Gus Fridenvalds requested permission to address the body. He stated the position the United States will face in the next two years. That is, two positions for International Director will be lost due to declining membership. He made a motion to endorse PDG Dennis Bell, seconded by Lion Carl Winfield with 100% vote of the Camp Hill Lions Club when the next opportunity becomes available to nominate a candidate. MOTION CARRIED.

50/50 raffles and the winners of the baskets were announced.

The Cabinet Meeting was closed by District Governor Lois Jean Mundorff. Motion was made by ZC Dennis Cronin, seconded by ZC "Peck" Freeland. MOTION CARRIED.

PDG Dennis Bell, President, PDGHC closed the 16th District Convention.

## ATTENTION LIONS AND LIONESS CLUB SECRETARIES

District Governor Elect John Griffie has chosen to have a district *Points Contest* for lion's year 2015-2016. For Lions Clubs the contest will be based on LCI Report "ACT0013\_W" this is the 2015-2016 Service Activity – Club Summary. A copy of this report will be sent to any club secretary upon request. I have been appointed by the Governor Elect to be the administrator of the contest this year. Nothing extra is required of Lions club secretaries you only need to submit your LCI activities report as usual. There will be no district report to file on the district web site.

---

Because Lioness Club Secretaries do not submit an LCI report you will file a report to me by email or regular mail and I will compile the information for the Governor. The information in this report is important whether you wish to participate in the contest or not. Do not submit a report on the district web site.

**ACTIVITIES** – Activities are an event such as: Fund raisers, service activities or club meetings.

**LIONESS HOURS** – Lioness participating in activity times how long the activity lasted = lioness hours.

Example – Ten Lionesses attend a fund raiser for 3 hours = 30 hours.

**ZONE, DISTRICT, STATE OR INTERNATIONAL EVENT** – How many club members attended?

**HEARING AIDS AND EYGLASSES** – Report when collected or when submitted but not both.

**FUNDS DONATED** – Money or value of items purchased and donated from the clubs "project account".

**NEW MEMBERS** – Each new member.




