

2015-2016 PROJECTS FUNDED BY THE PA LIONS HEARING RESEARCH FOUNDATION

GA -3501; "Cortical Processing of Communication Sounds in Realistic Listening Conditions"--Srivastsun Sadagopan, Ph.D.--University of Pittsburgh--\$10,000. Unfortunately, listeners with hearing loss have increasing difficulty understanding speech as background noise levels increase. A guinea pig is employed .using the ten discrete vocalizations this species makes as test signals, to ascertain unique patterns of auditory cortex neuron activity, and how this activity deteriorates in the presence of a noisy background. Thus, this has very practical and clinical implications with aging in the hearing of people.

GA -3504: "Impact of Deafness Mutations in MYO3A on the Inner Ear Hair Cell Stereocilia "-Christopher M. Yengo, Pi1.D.-The Pennsylvania State University, College of Medicine -- \$20,000. The stereocilia of the inner ear cells is the sensory part of the living cells that convert sound wave-induced mechanical stimuli into electrical signals. The maintenance of stereocilia ultrastructure throughout a lifetime is crucial for maintaining functional hearing. Disruption of the MYO3A gene causes stereocilia degeneration and delayed onset human deafness. The researchers will perform a complete analysis of the impact of deafness associated with MYO3A

GA -3506; "Glutamate Signaling by Outer Hair Cells: Cochlear Integrity and Tinnitus" -Rebecca P. Seal, Ph.D., University of Pittsburgh --\$20,000. The investigators have developed a mouse model where the outer hair cells no longer release glutamate rendering them to be dysfunctional. However, the majority of hearing is carried by the inner hair cells and thus hearing testing should be preserved. The investigators have an established model for identifying tinnitus. Through this study they will see if lack of glutamine release causes tinnitus alone or if it can be modified with their model of noise induced hearing loss and tinnitus.



DALLASTOWN LIONS PARTICIPATE IN DALLASTOWN CARNIVAL


