MINUTES - The minutes of the April 25, 2015, Cabinet meeting were approved on a motion by Zone Chair Clair Starner, seconded by Zone Chair David Killius. Motion Carried.

FINANCIAL REPORT (BUDGET, BANKING, BONDING) - Presented by the District Treasurer PDG Dean Smeltzer. Treasurer PDG Dean Smeltzer reviewed the 2015-16 Budget. Zone Chair Dennis Cope made a motion, seconded by Zone Chair Doug Nace to approve the budget, as detailed. Motion Carried. A motion to accept the Financial Report was made by PDG Shirley Starner, seconded by Zone Chair David Killius. Motion Carried.

AUDIT COMMITTEE - The report of the Audit Committee was presented by PDG George Reisinger. The report was received.

DISTRICT GOVERNOR REMARKS - District Governor John welcomed all Lions, Lionesses, and guests to the Cabinet meeting. Governor John is looking forward to starting his club visits. NORTHEAST PENNSYLVANIA LIONS EYE BANK


In accordance with Pennsylvania Law, after legal notice was provided to the membership, (82) Lions registered at the Wednesday, August 19th Lions membership meeting at the Best Western Premiere, 800 East Park Drive in Harrisburg for the Northeast Pennsylvania Lions Eye Bank, Inc. A quorum was established. The Membership (Lions members of Districts H, W, G, U, K, L, T, C & D) met and voted by secret ballot. The vote was overwhelming **in favor (only 13 "no" votes)** of moving forward consistent with the Plan of Asset Transfer of the Northeast Pennsylvania Lions Eye Bank, Inc. to SightLife which had been approved by the Board of Directors.

The next steps are to have a formal contract signed between SightLife and the Eye Bank and then pursue and obtain approval from the Attorney General of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the Court of Common Pleas of Northampton County.



BEACON LODGE - AUGUST 15, 2015

BEACON LODGE HAS JUST FINISHED A VERY SUCCESSFUL CAMPING SEASON. WE HAD A TOTAL OF 464 CAMPERS, 377 ADULTS AND 87 CHILDREN.

THIS YEAR "PROJECT NEW HOPE WAS STARTED. THIS PROGRAM IS FOR THE WOUNDED VETERANS OF PENNSYLVANIA. "NO MATTER WHICH ERA A SOLDIER SERVED, ALL PA DISABLED VETERANS AND THEIR FAMILIES ARE WELCOME. WE HAD A TOTAL OF 68 VETERANS AND THEIR FAMILILES IN ATTENDANCE AT TWO 4 DAY CAMPING SESSIONS. THERE WAS NO CHARGE TO THE VETERANS AND THEIR FAMILIES.
