Lions Clubs were founded by Melvin Jones in 1917 in his home town in Illinois. Typical of the time period, Mr. Jones started this wonderful organization with his fellow male citizens, even though he was known as a family man. Over the years, men joined this volunteer organization to give back to their communities. As time passed, women became interested in volunteering in community organizations, and it was slowly becoming acceptable for them to do so. They were not able to join the Lions, so they started their own auxiliary organization, Lioness Clubs, in December 1975.

Lions Clubs began to be more inclusive and have been encouraging women to join with them in our fight for sight. With women come families. Our children learn how important volunteering is, not by want we say, but by what we do. Getting our kids started in volunteering should not be done in high school as a resumé enhancer, it should be started at birth as a symbol of respect for your community.

#### Introducing Us

Mike comes from a family of volunteers. Like most returning military veterans, his dad continued his service to the community by volunteering with his local fire company, serving on borough council, and contributing to other community organizations. Mike was raised seeing his parents give back, and he taught that valuable lesson to his wife Theresa from the moment we met. When our daughter Samantha was born, she started visiting the fire hall with grandpa, working at the Lions Club events with mom and dad, and being part of the Pennsylvania Lion All-State Band for several years. When she was in eighth grade, she decided that she wanted to be part of her school's Marine Corps JROTC and Dallastown's Leo Club. Both organizations are based on volunteer service to their community.

Lions, like many volunteer organizations that we deal with through our business, invited the family to become active and contribute. Lions Clubs have Leo Clubs in our high schools and in our colleges. When our children leave school and move toward adulthood, what they have learned, seen, and done throughout their young lives shapes them into the

#### Making a Difference for Sight

Fellow Lions, Lionesses and Leos,

As a new year begins for District 14-C, I'd like to introduce myself.

I am Bonnie Hensel – a mother of three adult children with varying stages of Retinitis Pigmentosa (RP - a potentially blinding inherited retinal degenerative disease), grandmother of an 8-year-old boy diagnosed with the disease when he was four, President of the Shiloh Lions, Board Member of the Foundation Fighting Blindness, and now your new Sight Conservation and Eye Research Chair.

As you can see, I have a very personal vested interest in sight conservation and research. When my children were diagnosed, we were told to get them Seeing Eye dogs and teach them braille, that there is no known cure or treatment and they will go blind. Thanks to people like the Lions, Lionesses and Leos who help support eye research, that is no longer the case. Treatments, if not cures, are on the horizon.

As you can also see, my main focus will be on the retinal degenerative disease research. This does not mean, however, that it will be only for RP. Macular Degeneration is a more widely known retinal degenerative disease, affecting many of our older generation. Most of us know someone who has Macular Degeneration. Shiloh Lions sponsors a special event every spring that supports the Foundation Fighting Blindness Research for these retinal diseases.

I will be glad to speak at your clubs about the research and share any information I have. I look forward to working with you for this cause. Together we can make a difference.

#### **Eye Screening Project**

The District Eye Screening Project has completed several successful pilot events during the months of June and July.

To date over two hundred children have been screened at various locations throughout the District. The referral rate has come in higher than the expected national suggested level, which was five (5) percent for the twenty-five (25) million to be screened. Our current level is at about ten (10) percent.

#### Coordinators

The committee is now ready to assist any Lions Clubs who wish to venture out and plan a screening in their respective community. Coordinators have been designated for each county in the District. Lion Gail Fridenvalds and 1st VDG Dennis Cope will oversee Adams County; Lion Gloria Anne Hilsinger and Lions Jill and "Peck" Freeland will coordinate Cumberland County, and PDG Shirley Starner and Lions Rebecca Krout and Wanda Reisinger will assist clubs in York County.

Clubs are asked to contact any of the above mentioned individuals to schedule an orientation several days in advance of the planned screening date. This purpose of the orientation is to go over suggested guidelines formed by the committee, to handle the equipment and learn how to set up the area where the screening will take place.


