MESSAGE FROM THE 2nd VICE DISTRICT GOVERNOR

Fellow Lions, Lioness, and Leos,

It's good to have the worst of the winter behind us (I hope!) and see signs of Spring appearing all around us. This month, I want to focus briefly on the work of our District Global Membership Team, better known as the GMT. This group of dedicated Lions, under the leadership of Zone Chair C.R. Lloyd, has been meeting monthly to work on a comprehensive membership strategy that will provide a structure under which the District and Zones can support clubs to achieve thee broad goals: *retain* current members; *recruit* new members; *orient* both current and new members to increase knowledge regarding the Lions as an organization; and *promote* the activities of Lions to improve visibility and awareness of clubs in their communities.

Under this structure, the District, the Zones, and the clubs have a role to play in achieving these four goals. At each level (District, Zone and Club), leaders need to brainstorm ideas, select specific actions, and develop plans to achieve these four goals. This is a process known as "Action Planning." The GMT is currently focused on an action plan that involves training "Club Membership Teams" in regard to the four membership goals and the action planning process. Our hope is that each Club Membership Team will develop its own membership strategy centered around retention, recruitment, orientation and promotion.

To that end, the GMT is asking every club to **identify a Membership Chairperson for the 2016-17 Lions year** prior to the District Convention and **make sure that person attends the Convention, which will be held on April 23, 2016.** At the convention, the GMT will provide the Membership Chairs with an overview of the District's membership strategy and the Action Planning process. Then, during the summer, the GMT will conduct a half-day training seminar for club membership teams to introduce the teams to the District's goals and action plan, and to help each club begin the process of developing its own membership strategy.

The GMT looks forward to working with your club's membership team in an effort to put an end to declining numbers in District 14-C and begin to rebuild our membership. Please help us by making sure your club is identifying a membership chair, and work to make sure that person attends our District Convention. Yours in *SERVICE*,

Lions Club International District 14-C Cabinet Meeting

February 13, 2016

OPENING — The third cabinet meeting for the 2015-16 Lions year was called to order by District Governor John Griffie. Moment of Silence for PDG Dean Smeltzer and PDG Glenn Shellenberger.

One verse of "America" led by Lion Gail Fridenvalds was sung, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance, and invocation given by PCC Gus Fridenvalds.

District Governor John Griffie stated that the Roll Call of the Cabinet and all other attendees will be accomplished by the registration and sign in sheets. Protocol was established.

PARLIAMENTARY PROCEDURE — explained by Cabinet Secretary Bob Jacobs (due to absence of PDG Fred Trump)

MINUTES — The minutes of the November 21, 2015, Cabinet meeting were approved as presented on a motion by Zone Chair CR Lloyd, seconded by Zone Chair Clair Starner. Motion Carried.

FINANCIAL REPORT — The new Cabinet Treasurer discussed the steps needed to assume the job of treasurer after the passing of former Cabinet Treasurer Dean Smeltzer. The checking account(s) — now split between the Administration Account and the Activity Account have been moved to the People's Bank. The accounts are now being done using QuickBooks Online. The Form 990 for last year was also filed with the IRS. The financial report, as of January 31, was presented by Cabinet Treasurer Olphin. Motion to receive the Financial Report was made by 2nd Vice Governor Dennis Cope, seconded by 1st Vice Governor Kerry McKnight. Motion carried.

DISTRICT GOVERNOR REMARKS — District Governor John welcomed all Lions, Lionesses, and guests to the Cabinet meeting. DG John thanked everyone for the support he has received. Still need to concentrate on membership. Cashtown Lions is installing 5 new members. DG John is continuing with his club visitation.

1st VICE DISTRICT GOVERNOR REMARKS — 1st VG Kerry thanked all the clubs for the hospitality extended to the DG team on the club visitations. ^{15t} VG Kerry shared that he spent the past weekend at the Council meeting at Valley Forge. During the meeting there was a 2 hour GMT meeting and part of the discussion was about women in Lionism. It was stated that in PA, the percentage of women is as high as 31%, and as low as 15% - District 14-C is at the 15%. If District 14-C includes Lionesses, we would have 31%.

2nd VICE DISTRICT GOVERNOR REMARKS — 2nd VG Dennis said the he feels that there is something special happening in District 14-C — the Vision Screening Committee is working hard to make their project a reality — GMT continues to develop ways to retain, recruit, promote and orient members — we have a Governor and 2 Vice Governors in place for the first time in history and several individuals have expressed interest in stepping into the District Governor rotation — many of the zones are looking for ways to coordinate service projects to increase visibility of Lions. *All* this indicates that there is growing enthusiasm among our members and momentum in our organization that will translate to membership growth. Our District Convention is scheduled for April. Hopefully we can have every club represented at the convention. 2" VG Dennis thanked the clubs of the district for the opportunity to serve the district.

Lions Club International District 14-C Cabinet Meeting (cont'd)

PEACE POSTER AWARDS — Lion Patti Hullmann gave a brief history of the Peace Poster contest. The theme for 2016-17 is "A Celebration of Peace". More information can be found on the LCI website along with instructions on how to order the Peace Poster contest kits. There is also a Lions International Essay contest to offer the opportunity for visually impaired young people to express their vision of peace through their creative writing. Information about the essay contest can also be found on the LCI website.

Lion Patti announced the 3 winners of the District:

- 3^{rd} Place Elizabeth Wilkinson, sixth grader at Big Springs Middle School, sponsored by the Newville Lions Club
- 2nd Place Shawna Goodyear, eighth grader at Mechanicsburg Middle School, sponsored by the Camp Hill Lions Club
- 1st Place Jacob Mead, sixth grader at Arendtsville Elementary School, sponsored by the Arendtsville Lions Club. Jacob also received an Honorable Mention in our Multiple District 14.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

CENTENNIAL — PCC Gus Fridenvalds talked about the LCI Centennial. LCI started the centennial in 2014 and it runs through 2018. District 14-C is behind in its participation of the centennial. The slogan for the centennial is "CELEBRATE 100 YEARS OF LIFE CHANGING SERVICE". The clubs talk about fund raising, we need to start talking about service projects. Clubs are encouraged to have a Legacy Project. 19 of our clubs reported no service in 2015. Lions across the world have reported 68 million acts of service.

CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS — PCC Gus Fridenvalds gave the report of the Constitution and By-Laws Committee (PDG Fred Trump, PDG AI Hayes, PCC Gus Fridenvalds, PDG Dean Smeltzer). Procedure 213 — District 14-C Points Contest Chairperson is being changed so that it details what is actually being done for the Points Contest — since the beginning of time. There are no changes to what is required by the Lions secretaries. (See attached for the changes to the procedures). Motion to adopt the changes as presented by 1^{5t} VG Kerry McKnight, seconded by ZC Dan Brandt. Motion carried.

DISTRICT PROJECT — **PRESCHOOL VISION SCREENING** — PDG Shirley Starner stated that the committee met in January and selected the "SPOT" camera which is manufactured by the Welch-Allyn Company. The committee is working with Joanne Nicholas, a representative of the School Health Corporation, who will train the committee on the use of the equipment. Funding is being explored through LCIF for matching funds and through other sources. The committee will accept donations from Lions Clubs or individuals toward the District Project. The committee is bringing the following proposal for action:

The Eye Screening Committee recommends beginning the "EYE SCREENING PROJECT" with the purchase of one (1) "SPOT" camera and all necessary equipment from the SCHOOL HEALTH COMPANY and with the appropriate training for all members of the committee, who will subsequently train Lions Club members, by June 1,,2016. The children screened will be from 6 months to 6 years of age. Cost is estimated to be approximately \$10,000. The first site will be determined by the committee.

Motion to accept the proposal of the Eye Screening Committee as presented was made by ZC Clair Starner, seconded by 2nd VG Dennis Cope. Motion carried.

STATE COUNCIL MEETING, OCTOBER 28-30, 2016 — PDG Shirley Starner announced that District 14-C has been selected as the host for the PA Lions State Council meeting to be held in Grantville, PA, at the Holiday Inn, just off 1-81, Exit 80. The clubs of District 14-C need to make plans to spend that weekend in Grantville and show other Lions from across the state of Pennsylvania and show support for our Governor-to-Be Kerry and his partner in service Debbie. Friday night District 14-C will host the Hospitality Night. PDG George Hilsinger and Lion Gloria Anne will chair the Basket Raffle. Each club in the district is asked to donate a filled basket (valued at \$50) to be raffled off on Saturday afternoon. The monies raised help to defray some of the costs for the weekend which are paid by the host District. <u>6</u>

LCIF — PDG Gordon Sinclair, filling in for PDG Noah Krout. No report. Raffle for basket at the conclusion of the Cabinet meeting.

SPECIAL OLYMPICS -1^{ST} VG Kerry McKnight reporting, substituting for PDG Noah Krout. Special Olympics provides sports training and athletic competition for individuals with intellectual disabilities. York County currently has 350 athletes who participate in 1 or more of 17 sports offered. The Polar Bear Plunge that had been scheduled for February 6 had to be postponed due to river conditions. The activity has been rescheduled for February 27. District 14-C Lions have been asked to assist with registration, set-up, clean *up*, etc. to the Arlington recycling center. The District has also been asked to have a participant to "take the plunge". A motion was made and seconded to have the District Governor be the participant for the District. A basket was passed to collect pledges got the DG. (\$164 in pledges collected for DG John Griffie to participate in the Special Olympics Polar Bear Plunge)

GMT REPORT — 2^{"d} VG Dennis Cope and ZC CR Lloyd reporting. The GMT committee has met 3 times since the last Cabinet meeting. Each club is asked to assign or elect a Membership chairperson for the 2016-17 Lions year and have the Membership chairperson attend the District Convention to receive training. Each Membership chair is then asked to recruit a team of 2-5 Lions to help in this effort. This team will be invited and encouraged to attend a membership training seminar between the time of the District Convention and September.

OLD BUSINESS:

MYSTERY BINGO — 2nd VG Dennis Cope reporting. Scheduled for Sunday, March 13, 2016, at the United Hook and Ladder Co. in New Oxford. Doors open at noon for food sales. Bingo starts at 2:00 PM. Limited to 250 people. Zone Chairs are working to secure donations and prizes. Let DG John, 1st VG Kerry, or 2nd VG Dennis know progress of getting prizes by March 5. All proceeds will go toward the purchase of the vision screening equipment approved earlier in the Cabinet meeting.

RESIGNATION OF ZONE CHAIR 2C — Received letter of resignation from David Killius stating time requirements of his work which prevents him from fulfilling his duties as Zone Chair. If anyone is interested in assuming Zone Chair for 2C, contact DG John.

FIRST VICE GOVERNOR NOMINATIONS —Dennis Cronin, Secretary of the Arendtsville read a letter from the Arendtsville and York Springs Lions Clubs endorsing 2^{"d} VG Dennis Cope as a candidate for the position of 1st Vice Governor for Lions year 2016-17. A motion to close nominations for the office of 1st Vice Governor was made by ZC CR Lloyd, seconded by 1st VG Kerry McKnight. Motion carried.

SECOND VICE GOVERNOR NOMINATIONS — Lion Lisa Griffie of the New Oxford Lions Club nominated Zone Chair Clyde Griffie of the West Manheim Lions Club as a candidate for the position of 2^{"'1} Vice Governor for Lions year 2016-17. A motion to close the nominations for the office of 2^{"d} Vice Governor was made by PDG Gordon Sinclair, seconded by ZC Clair Starner. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS:

DISTRICT TREASURER INSTALLATION / BANKING CHANGES — A motion to make the Peoples Bank the official financial institution for District 14-C was made by ZC Dan Brandt, seconded by PDG Shirley Starner. Motion carried.

PCC Gus Fridenvald presided over the installation of Lion Phil Olphin as Cabinet Treasurer of Lions District 14-C for the remainder of Lions year 2015-16.

District 14-C Procedure Manual

Procedure Number 213

DISTRICT 14-C POINT CONTEST CHAIRPERSON

FUNCTION: The Point Contest Chairperson creates an easily managed system under the direction of the District Governor (DG) that recognizes the achievements of clubs and members.

GENERAL: The incoming District Governor shall appoint the Point Contest Chairperson. The Point Contest is a means to promote friendly competition among all Lions Clubs and Lioness Clubs of District 14 - C. The Point Contest Chairperson's duties are as follows:

- $A.\;\;$ Use the Membership and Activities (M&A) report to tally the official points for each club.
- B. Ensure points are accurately recorded.

C. Prepare a monthly quarterly point contest report and make available to the DG. Give a report at the district cabinet meetings as requested by the District Governor. Provide to newsletter editor and website editor as requested.

D. Club membership size may be used to decide categories to divide the contest.

E. Ensure a form is available for Liens/Lioness clubs that to report their monthly/quarterly membership and activities in paper format (not online). Lioness Clubs may report to the contest chairperson by email.

F. A suitable certificate or plaque will be acquired by the contest chairperson to be presented to the winning club in each category at the first cabinet meeting of the following Lion's year. Certificate or plaque cost will be at the expense of the district.


