Providing orientation to new Lions regarding the basic tenets of Lionism is an important responsibil-



ity of club leaders and district officials. Even many current member are woefully uninformed about the vision, mission, and purpose of our local clubs and Lions Clubs International.

Overview information is easily obtained and available to members in *The Lion* magazine. More detailed and specific

information can be gained by studying the Standard Club Constitution and By-laws. While not the most enthralling reading material, it is important for our club leaders to know and understand how clubs are to be organized and run, in order to remain true to the principles upon which our organization was founded. Also, a complete orientation program is available to clubs at the LCI website: http:// lionsclubs.org. As DG Kerry mentioned in his message, contact PDG Gus Fridenvalds for more information regarding orientation.

One of the cornerstone principals of Lions as an organization is that 100% of the funds we raise from our fundraisers goes back to the community. As stated in the *Standard Club Constitution*, Article XII, Section 1, "All funds raised from the public must be returned to public use, including money accumulated from invested public funds. The only deductions that may be made from the activity accounts are the direct operating expenses of the fundraising activity." In addition, Article XII, Section 2, of the *Standard Club Constitution and By-laws* clearly states that club administrative costs are to be covered "through contributions from members through dues, fines and other individual contributions."

This principle needs to be emphasized with prospective members, and current members need to be reminded of this principle on a regular basis. Why? Because SERVICE is at the heart of what we do as Lions, and fundraisers provide the means by which we are able to serve our communities, support our district and state projects, and help individuals around the world. Maintaining a clear distinction between funds raised and spent for project versus administrative expenses is critical. It is the responsibility of every Lion, Lioness and Leo to be sure this principle is upheld in his or her club in order to maintain the integrity of the organization.

As we celebrate our first century of service and enter our second century, let's make sure we remain true to the principles upon which our organization was founded.

Pennsylvania Counsellors Distinguished Service Award

The Pennsylvania Counsellors have established an award for presentation to deserving Lions throughout Pennsylvania - The *Pennsylvania Counsellors Distinguished Service Award*.

Each Sub-District may present **two (2)** *Pennsylvania Counsellors Distinguished Service Awards* annually. The award is limited to one (1) per club per year and only one (1) award per District may be presented to a Past District Governor. Persons who have received a prior *Pennsylvania Counsellors Distinguished Service Award*, Lions International Leadership Award, Lions International Presidents Award or the Lions International Ambassador of Good Will Award are **not** eligible for this award.

The following is the criteria to earn this award:

- A. Have served at least ten (10) years as a Lion.
- B. Have earned at least five (5) years of perfect attendance.
- C. Shall have served as either President or Secretary of their Club or displayed other exemplary service.
- D. Must be a Lion in good standing in a Lions Club in good standing in their District within Multiple District 14.

Application for the *Pennsylvania Counsellors Distinguished Service Award* shall be submitted by the Lions Club President to the President/Chair of the Past District Governors organization within the Sub-District. The President/Chair shall endorse the recommendation and forward to the District Governor. The application must be received by the Secretary of the Pennsylvania Counsellors at least two (2) weeks prior to the February State Council Meeting.

Presentations shall be made at a Sub-District function and should be made by the President/Chair of the Sub-District Past District Governors organization.


And We Keep Climbing in District 14-C!
